Driving Safety Course Offered On Internet

Anyone with a computer connection to the Internet can now take a driving safety course. TxDriving. Com has been approved by the Texas Education Agency to provide Education Agency to provide driving safety courses on line. To take the Internet course, students must have a computer and Internet connection and some standard browsing and viewing software. Completion of the course makes students eli gible for ticket dismissal under the Texas Transportation Code. The ten percent insurance dis-count also applies. Students may complete the course at their own pace and are allowed to log on and off the program with the computer keeping track of the student's progress. 



### **Homeowners**

Make sure your yard is clear of such things as ladders, hoses, dog leashes and flower pots that can trip the young ones. Battery powered jack o'lantern candles are preferable to a real flame. If you do use candles, place the pumpkin well away from where trickor-treaters will be walking or standing. Make sure paper or cloth yard decorations won't be blown into a flaming candle. Healthy food alternatives for trick-or-treaters include packages of low-fat crackers with cheese or peanut butter filling, single-serve boxes of cereal, packaged fruit rolls, mini boxes of raisins and single-serve packets of low-fat popcorn that can we microwaved later. Non-food treat include plastic rings, pencils, stickers, erasers and coins.







ACT scores are accepted by virtually all colleges in the nation, including all lvy League schools. The test fee is \$24 (\$27 in Florida). A student's ACT scores are considered by colleges for admissions and course placement, along with several other important factors including high school GPA, college prep courses taken in high school, extracurricular activities, personal background and other information.

Seniors who have already taken the ACT can take it again and try for a higher score. 



When the flag was discovered by guards, the soldier was severely beaten for his efforts. In a true act of patriotism, the prisoner, with eyes nearly closed from his beating, inspired his fellow prisoners by beginning to make another flag inside his shirt.

"Mr. Bagwell is a veteran. He is one of the reason we are able to be here today," Brown said.

After thanking Bagwell, the students concluded the ceremony with again repeating the Pledge of Allegiance.

When the welcoming crowd left to return their classrooms and daily schedules, Old Glory stood alone, fluttered brightly against the overcast sky, proclaiming to all that this is the land of the free and the home of the brave.
