"The new farm law offers a onetime opportunity to sign up for the new 7-year production flexibility contracts," according to Preston Wright, Hansford County Executive Director. "Once the May 20 through July 12 sign-up

has ended, only farms coming out of the Conservation Reserve Program will be eligible for enrollment."

The 1996 Farm Bill presents products with the greatest patiently wait until "later" or changes in federal farm program in decades. Most restrictions on planting options, crops, acreages, and haying or grazing have been removed.

"The decision to enroll a farm in the new PFC will have long term consequences for the value of a farm. It is imperative that producers understand the effects of this new legislation on their operations, " Mr. Wright said.

"The seminar challenged me to think about the world around me and what we, as the future


