owners at the FSA county office where heir farm records are maintained. The
2008 Farm Bill authorized USDA to maintain CRP enrollment up to 32 million acres.
In addition to producers signing up for
the first time, CRP participants with exthe first time, CRP participants with existing contracts that are scheduled to ex-
pire on Sept. 30, 2010, may elect to pe-enroll under a new $10-15$ year contract. Cropland that is highly erodible, or within a national or state Conservation
Priority Area, or is covered under an exPriority Area, or is covered under an ex-
piring CRP contract is generally eligible piring CRP contract is generally eligible
to be enrolled into CRP, provided al other eligibility requirements are met. Contracts awarded under this 39 th sign-up are sched.

CRP is a voluntary program that helps farmers, ranchers and other agricultural producers protect their environmentally sensitive land. Producers enrolling in
CRP plant long-term, resource-conserv ing covers in exchange for rental payments, cost-share and technica assistance.
