## **Murder Charges** Filed in Shooting

Hansford County's first murder charge in 17 years was filed last week gainst Gabino Anquiano Gutierrez, 54, of Spearman.

Gutierrez is accused in the shooting death of Evelina Rojas Luna, 51,

Sheriff R. L. McFarlin and officer Pete Ochoa were directed to a house on Endicott Street at approximately 2 a.m. Wednesday, July 18 after being informed of a shooting by a man walking into the sheriff's

According to the informant, he had been asked by Gutierrez to report he shooting to authorities.

Upon arrival at the home, Sheriff McFarlin and Deputy Ochoa found he body of Luna in the front room of the residence which was shared y both the victim and the suspect.

Officers became skeptical after hearing several conflicting statements n Gutierrez's explanation of the incident. After finding a 22 pistol believed to be the murder weapon in a drawer in the home, Gutierrez was taken into custody.

He was charged with murder and is currently in Hansford County Jail inder \$100,000 bond.

Officials continue to investigate the crime as they await autopsy esults from Lubbock

The last murder charges filed in Hansford County were February 14 1984, when Juan Manuel Davila was charged with the shooting death of Episano Treujio.

My mother-in-law, Lottie Houser, sent me the following story. I'm not sure who wrote it, but I hope it touches you as much as it did me.

## God's Under The Bed

My brother Kevin thinks God lives under his bed. At least that's what I heard him say one night. He was praying out loud in his dark bedroom, and I stopped outside his closed door

"Are you there, God?" he said. "Where are you? Oh, I see. Under the bed."

I giggled softly and tiptoed off to my own room.

Kerri's unique perspectives are often a source of amusement. But that night something else langered long after the humon. I realized for the first time the very different world Kevin lives in. He was born 30 years ago, mentally disabled as a result of difficulties during labor.

Apart from his size (he's 6-foot-2), there are few ways in which he is an adult. He reasons and communicates with the capabilities of a 7-year-old, and he always will.

He will probably always believe that God lives under his bed, that Santa Claus is the one who fills the space under our tree every Christmas, and that airplanes stay up in the sky because amaels carry them.

I remember avendering if Kevin realizes he is different. Is he ever dissatisfied with his monotonous life? Up before down each day, off to work at a workshop for the disabled, home to walk our cocker spaniel, returning to eat his favorite macaromiand-cheese for dinner, and later to bed. The only variation in the entire scheme are laundry days, when he hineers excitedly over the washing machine like a mother with her newborn chald

He does not seem dissatisfied. He lopes out to the bus every morning at 7:05, eager for a day of simple work. He wrings his hands excitedly while the water boils on the stone before dinnet, and he stays up late twice arweek to gather our dirty laundry for his rient day's lawnery chores.

And Saturdays - oh, the bliss of Saturdays! That's the day my dad takes Revin to the airport to have a soft drink, watch the planes land, and speculate loudly on the destination of each passenger inside. "That one's goin' to Chi-car-go!" Kevin shouts as he claps his hands. His anticipation is so great he can hardly sleep on Friday nights.

I don't think Revin knows anything exists outside his world of daily rituals and weekend field trops. He doesn't know what

it means to be discontent. His life is simple. He will never know the entanglements of wealth of grower, and he does not care what brand of clothing he wears or what kind of food he eats. He recognizes no differences in people, treating each person as an equal and a friend. His needs have alwins been met, and he never worries

that one day they may not be. His hunds are diliper Rewin is never so happy as when he is working. When he williads the dishwasher or vacuums the carpet, his heart is completely in it. He does not shrink from a jeb when it is begun, and he does not leave a job until it is finished.

But when his tasks are home, Kenin knows how to relay. The is not obsessed with his work or the work of others. His

He still believes everyone tells the truth, promises must be kept, and when you are wrong, you apologize instead of argue. Free from pride and unconcerned with appearances, Neven is not afraid to any when he is hunt, anymy or sormy. He is always transparent, always sincere. And he trusts God

Not comfined by intellectual reasoning, when he comes to Christ, he comes as a child. Revin seems to know God - to realby the friends with Him in a way that is difficult for an 'educated person to grasp. God seems like his closest companion.

In my moments of boubt and frustrations with my Christianity, I enay the security Kevin has in his simple faith. It is then that I am most willing to admit that he has some divine knowledge that rises above my mortal questions. It is then I realize that perhaps he is not the one with the handing - I am. My obligations, my feat, my pride, my circumstances -they all become disabilities when I do not submit them to Christ. Who knows if Kenin comprehends things I can never

After all, he has spent his whole life in that kind of innocence, praying after dark and souking up the goodness and leve of the Lord. And one day, when the mysteries of heaven are opened, and we are all amazed at how close God really is to our hearts, I'll realize that God heard the simple grayer of a boy who believed that God lived under his bed. Kevin won't be surprised at all
