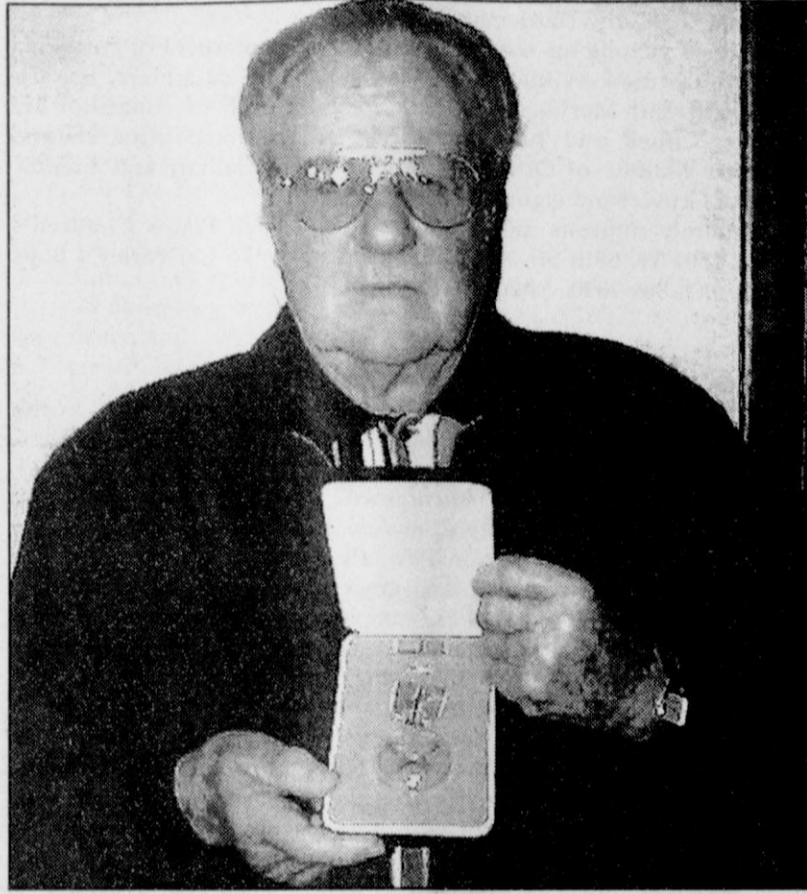

An Evening Of Dance

The Golden Spread Senior Citizens Center and The O'Loughlin Center are sponsoring the Lone Star Ballet in an "Evening of Dance" on Saturday, November 8, 1997. The event will be held at the Spearman High School Auditorium at 7:00 p.m.

Tickets for the Lone Star Ballet are \$7.50 for adults, and \$3.00 for 18 and under. Patron tickets are available at \$100. They include two patron tickets for reserved seating and the patron party that will be held from 5:00-6:30 p.m., as well as four general admission tickets. Neil Hess and some of the cast members will also attend the patron party.

The Lone Star Ballet grew out of the development of the dance corps for the outdoor musical drama "TEXAS," which has had performances every summer since 1966. This same dance corps has participated during this time with the local, annual productions of the Nutcracker.

The company was incorporated in December of 1975 in order to "produce and promote the art of dance, thereby contributing to the education, cultural development and entertainment of the people of the Panhandle region." On February 16, 1979, a working board was elected, and Neil Hess was appointed Artistic Director. Mr. Hess started the eminently

successful dance department at West Texas A&M University.

Currently, Hess is director of dance in the Department of Music and Dance at West Texas A&M University. In 1985, Hess received an award for teaching excellence at WTSU. The American College Dance Festival has cited his choreography for Highest Standards of Excellence. He also served as President of the Southwest Regional Ballet Association.

Behind the scenes in all of Hess' endeavors is his wife, Camille, who emerged from the leading dance role in "TEXAS" during its first year to now work beside him.

The show will include a variety of dance styles such as ball room, tap, ballet, classical and country and western. It will also include a sneak preview of "God Bless Amarillo (And The Cowboys Too)!" The famed country western swing band, the Light Crust Doughboys will team with the Lone Star Ballet to present a toe-tapping original evening for the whole family. Spearman will be the first to view this sneak preview.

World War II veteran Delbert M. Williams of Gruver received the Bronze Star Medal for Meritorious Achievement in Action this past week for his service March 24 - 25, 1945, in Wesel Germany. Williams was on special assignment at that time. His mission was to fly a glider over the Rhine River (no bridge existed at that time) to convey a jeep, its four man crew, a mounted gun, and a trailer containing another gun to the German shore. The glider, which crossed the river under heavy artillery fire, disintegrated upon impact on the shore, leaving the five men aboard in enemy territory. The men then found themselves in the position of having to fight their way to safety in the days that

followed.

Williams, who is still an active pilot employed by Sparks Brother, Inc. as an aerial applicator, was contacted by phone one week ago by a caller from Winston Salem, North Carolina requesting his serial number in regard to a bronze star award. Williams' first impression was that the call was a hoax. Ten days later, however, the bronze star medal, campaign ribbon, and lapel pin; a leather-bound certificate; and letter of congratulations arrived. Although the award was presented more than 52 years late, it did arrive just in time for Veterans Day Tuesday, November 11, to remind us all of the debt we owe the men who fought for our freedom.

Born alongside Palo Duro Creek, she spent her early years in a dugout. Her childhood was not a lonely one - she was surrounded by four brothers and sisters. She grew up connected to the real things in life: home and family, food, church, and fun. Not particularly a social person, she focused on her family. First, her brothers and sisters. Then her daughter. Later, her grandchildren. She was a great cook. Fried chicken, mashed potatoes, and creamed carrots - just the mention of them made the mouths of her grandchildren water! She not only raised the chickens, she raised the potatoes and carrots in her garden. And when she went to the garden, she wore a bonnet - so precious that one of her grandson's has it in his possession today.

She was a church woman! Every Sunday. And she made sure her flock were part of that flock. She preferred her religion "traditional," as traditional and real and nourishing to the soul as the chicken and mashed potatoes and carrots were to the body. She had her feet on the ground, connected to the earth. She found

her place in church as her connection to Heaven. She found her family as her connection to humanity. And she did it all with a kind of class that her grandchildren will never forget.

To top it all off, as a kind of icing on the cake, she was a "fun" person. A Dallas Cowboy fan, she really loved to watch them play. Her grandkids said that there were times when she would run the length of the room, replaying the pass that Roger Staubach had just thrown!

The service ended with a grandson singing, "In The Garden." As he sang, we could see her there, bonnet and all, with the Lord. Only, this time, He bid her "come," and together they walked "through the valley of the shadow of death," all the way home, to the place He had prepared.

The Scripture says, "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord... Yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors." And, so it is. And, so it was. For Eva. On Labor Day, 1997. In the Cator family plot in the Hansford County Cemetery. In the Panhandle part of Texas.

Florene Watson, World War II pilot from Borger will speak at the event. Mrs. Watson became fascinated with planes at age

eight and by age 19, had finished flight school and completed her first solo flight.

Watson received her instructor's rating and was teaching men to fly in the War Training Program in Odessa and Lubbock, Texas when WWII began. After Pearl Harbor, she and her younger brother decided to volunteer for Army service.

The Army was searching for 50 women with 500 hours of flying time to become aircraft, cargo and troop ferriers. This was double the standard for men who only needed 250 hours to qualify to be Army pilots.

Watson was one of only 25 women who qualified for the original Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron. These women averaged 1,100 hours flying time.

As a member of the WAF's (later known as the Women's Air Force Service Pilots WASP's), Watson flew every type of plane used by the Army Air Corps. In January, 1943, she was made Commanding Officer over the WASP's stationed at Love Field, Dallas.

In addition to ferrying planes, equipment and troops, Watson served as a test pilot. In 1944, she tested radar equipment before its general use in the war.

During the course of the war, 38 women in the Ferrying Division would give their lives in serving the United States.

After the war, Watson received a Master's of Business Administration from the University of Houston. She then taught in college for 30 years.

The program will conclude with a patriotic selection by the high school band.

Cazares Attends Governor's Dinner

Cody J. Cazares, Gruver High School Senior, recently attended a dinner honoring Governor George W. Bush at the Amarillo Civic Center Grande Plaza. The dinner was also attended by State Representatives John Smithee and David Swinford and State Senator Teel Bivins.

Hosting the dinner was Don Powell, Chairman of the Bush Panhandle Steering Committee. The dinner was one of Bush's many planned stops around the state as he pushes his crime prevention and education reform agenda. Although Bush has not yet formally announced his reelection bid, he announced a twenty-city tour in December to

push his agenda.

Cazares first met Bush in 1996 while Cazares was pushing for crime prevention legislation with his former boss, ex-Senator Bob Dole (R-KS). While at the dinner, Cazares spoke with Bush and Bivins about the necessity of tougher juvenile crime prevention legislation. "It's necessary to show our children that we love them, and that there is discipline as well," Cazares said.

Cazares has presented a crime prevention seminar to Gruver students for the past four years. He plans to present his fifth and final Crime Prevention Program sometime next spring. Speakers for the event are pending.

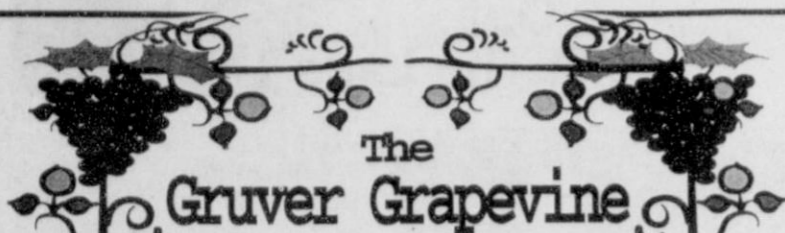

In the first quarter, Jim Potts used the wind at his back to advance Gruver towards the goal line. Gruver got the first touchdown with Jim Potts' 27-yard pass to Buster McLain. It was almost missed due to the wind, but McLain made an incredible dive to grasp the football. Wheeler came back in the second quarter and scored their own touchdown off Aaron Dunnman's three yard run. Wheeler didn't cheer for long, though, as the extra point was missed due to a partial block.

Both teams continued to struggle throughout the second quarter until Gruver stopped a fourth-down conversion attempt and moved into scoring position with only seconds left on the clock. The Greyhounds faked a field goal, but Potts' pass was incomplete, and the score remained 7-6 (Gruver on top) at the end of the first half.

Early in the third quarter, Gruver almost scored again when Brant Armes returned a punt to Wheeler's 25, but the following play resulted in an interception. Wheeler took advantage of Gruver's turnover and afterwards scored as Jeremy Davis ran into the end zone on a 5-yard run. The ensuing two-point conversion attempt failed. The Mustangs were now in the lead, 12-7.

In the middle of the third quarter, Wheeler's defense really got hold of the Greyhounds. After Wheeler's score, Gruver didn't get another first down in the third quarter and committed two turnovers on interceptions. Wheeler scored a safety in the later part of the third quarter as Jim Potts was tackled in the end zone. That made up for the Mustang's loss of extra points, and they were ahead 7 points, 14-7.

Gruver knew the fourth quarter was their last chance to catch Wheeler. Jim Potts led his team towards the goal line again, making three straight completions to the Wheeler six yard line. Three plays later, Potts dove into the end zone for six more points. The fans were unsure what Gruver would do next: a two point conversion, or the extra point? The Greyhounds dared the extra point. Brant Armes kicked the ball with all the strength he had, but the pursuing north wind retaliated and wouldn't allow the ball to cross the goal. And so the score and the game ended at 13-14, the Mustangs winning by only a point.

Wheeler and Gruver are two teams that can play football. At Gruver's pep rally, Brant Armes stated, "Tonight, let's give Gruver our best hitting, our best running, our best tackling--our best ever. Let's give them our best." Both teams did that on Friday night. It was a shame that one team had to lose because both teams deserved that victory.

Wheeler remains the undefeated team in district 1-1A. Gruver's district record is now 3-1. Wheeler finished with a total of 278 yards offensively with 261 of that on the ground. Gruver mostly gained yards through the air, even though it was windy, and they ended with 196 offensive yards (only 51 of those yards on the ground).

Brant Armes completed the game with 10 carries for 24 yards, and Kyle McNett had 6 for 19. Travis Bayless also had four carries for 16 yards. Jim Potts threw a heck of a game, totaling 145 yards passing for the offense. Brant Armes also did a stand out job kicking against the wind that night. The last missed point was just one of those things. Brant gave it all he had, and he has done that all year. Every Greyhound player has done an outstanding job this year. They all gave their best, and because of that, they may not be district champions, but they are nevertheless true champions.
