The criteria used to determine the Gala/Social Event Award winner included: dollars raised per
$\$ 1,000$ household income expense ratio and percent increase over the division's best year. There are three awards given in this category, one award for divisions of less than 100,000 population, one for divisions with greater than
100,000 population, and one for major metro divisions.
The Hansford Division's "Queen of Hearts Gala" held on April 10, 1999 raised over $\$ 18,000$ and had an expense ratio of less than $21 \%$. The Gala was a $45 \%$ increase over the previous best

Hill, but before Hill, but before going to bed I have a little talk with him." Hill replied, "Please read aloud. I, too, am a Christian man."
The paths of the two salesmen crossed again several times in the next year as they covered their sales territories in Wisconsin. Eventually, they decided to form a men's group "devoted to carrying out the Lord's work.
They named their brotherhood the Gideons after the farmer-
