Finally, after weeks of laborious searching a young nan, nineteen years of age, was selected as the model for the portrayal of Christ. For six months Da Vinci worked on the production of six years Da Vinci continued fis Labors on his sublime work 0 art. One by one, fitting persons were chosen to represent each of the eleven apostles, space being left for the painting of the figure representing Iudas Iscariot as the final task of thus masterpiece.
This was the apostle, you remember, who betrayed fiis Lord for thirty pieces of silver. For weeks Da Vinci searched for a man
that with a fiard callous face, withi a countenance marked by scars o avarice, deceit, who would betray fis best friend.
After many discouraging experiences in searching for the type of person required to represent Judas, word came to Da been found. He was in a dungeon in Rome, sentenced to die for once, and this man was brought out from fis imprisonment in the dungeon and led out into the light of the sun.
There Da Vinci saw before hitm a dark, swarthy 1. in, his long portrayed a character of vicioustess and complete ruitn. At last the painter had found the person he wanted to represent the King this prisoner wis carried to Milan where the frece ars being painted.
For six months the prisoner sat before $\mathcal{D a}$ Vinci, at appointed hours each day, as the gifted artist diligently continued his task
of transmitting to his painting this base character in the picture representing the traitor and betrayer of the Savior.
As he finished fiis last stroke, he turned to the guards and said, "I have finished, you may take the prisoner away. He suddenly broke loose from their control and rushied up to Da Vinci, crying $I \mathrm{am}$ ?"
