I'm hold ing these meetings to hear what's on the minds of voters and that' what I'll take back to Austin." He went on to say "One issue I will be expected to vote on is casino gambling and that's where you opinion is critical."He then asked on the issue of casino gambling. The vote came out $10 \%$ in favor, $90 \%$ apposed. Bivins stated that it was about the same average as every other poll that he had take, so he felt he should vote against that issue when it was presented.

Hints for dealing wiith the upcoming holidays
