Even without Lusby, the Lynx maintained field control and brought home the victory.
One of the game's biggest plays was made by Carlos Hernandez.
Canadian was in scoring position Canadian was in scoring position after a pass reception and a 62 yard run toward the goal line. Hernandez zeroed in on the runner, chased him down and saved the Lynx from an almost certain Canadian score. He also was able to do a good job
