It was an exciting game in Stinnett when the Spearman Lynx defeated the West Texas Comanches in district 1-2A

competition this past Friday night. The final score was Spearman-38, West Texas-15. This brings the record for the Lynx to 6-2 for the season, and 2-1 for

The Lynx had control from the beginning when Michael Lusby took the opening kickoff back 43 yards to midfield and scored six plays later on a 20-yard run. The Lynx then held West Texas to three plays on their first possession, and Lusby returned their punt 61 yards to the Comanches' 3-yard-line. He scored on the next play to make it 14-0 with 6:41 left in the first

The Lynx had 246 rushing yards and 70 passing yards, for a total of 325 yards, compared to the Comanches' 204 total yards.

Carlos Hernandez, 195 lb. junior runningback, was named the offensive player of the week. Hernandez rushed for 28 yards on three carries. He also had one reception for 15 yards and one touchdown. He graded 85% on the film grade.

Quentin Shieldknight, 225 lb. junior tackle, and Chuck Grayson, 140 lb. junior cornerback, were named defensive players of the week.

Shieldknight had two unassisted tackles and seven assisted tackles.

Grayson had one unassisted tackle and 5 assisted tackles. He also had one fumble recovery.

Individual rushing stats for the Lynx*are as follows: Lusby had 30 carries for a total 191 yards, with four touchdowns; Aaron Witten had seven carries for 17 yards; Aaron Winegarner had four carries for 10 yards, and Hernandez had three carries for 28 yards. Winegarner completed four passes on six attempts, for at total of 79 yards.

Individual receiving stats were: Clayton Wilkerson had one catch for 22 yards; Grayson had two catches for 42 yards; and one touchdown; and Carlos Hernandez had one catch for 15 yards; and one touchdown.

The Lynx will host Stratford this Friday night at 7:30 p.m. at Lynx Stadium.

Windbreak Trees Available

Seedlings for conservation windbreaks are now available for order through the Hansford County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD). Landowners in Hansford County are encouraged to purchase the one-year-old seedlings before preferred stock is sold out, says a Texas Forest Service official.

Each year thousands of regionally adapted seedlings are grown from seed by the Texas Forest Service West Texas Nursery in Lubbock. The agency's primary objective is to produce and sell quality seedlings at a price landowners can afford, allowing them to plant large quantities of trees for windbreaks, says Robert Pewin, Texas Forest Service Forester, Lubbock.

"Windbreaks are trees and shrubs systematically planted adjacent to fields, homesteads, or feedlots as a barrier to reduce or redirect the wind," Fewin explains. "They create permanent, natural protection and habitat for wildlife, reduce erosion, and increase land value and anesthetics.

Wildlife packets for habitat establishment also are available. Each of the four wildlife packets contain 100 bare-root trees and shrubs which cater specifically to the habitat needs of quail and pheasant, deer, turkey or squirrel.

Seedlings ordered this fall will be shipped or delivered in March



Focus On The Family

QUESTION: My mother and father were harsh disciplinarians when I was a child, and I was afraid of them both. My cousin, on the other hand, was raised in a home with very few rules. She was a spoiled brat and is still selfish today. Would you compare these two approaches to child rearing--the authoritarian and the permissive homes--and describe their effects

DR. DOBSON: They are equally harmful to children, in my view. On the side of harshness, children suffer the humiliation of total domination. The atmosphere at home is icy and rigid, and they live in constant fear of punishment. They are unable to make their own decisions, and their personalities are squelched beneath the hob-nailed boot of parental power. Lasting characteristics of dependency, hostility and even psychosis can emerge from this overbearing oppression.

The opposite approach--ultimate permissiveness-is equally tragic. In this setting, the children are their own masters from their earliest babyhood. They think the world revolves around their heady empire, and they often have utter contempt and disrespect for those closest to them. Anarchy and chaos reign in their homes, and their mothers are often the most nervous, frustrated women on the block. When the children are young, their mothers are stranded at home because they are too embarrassed to take their little devils anywhere. These children later find it difficult to yield to outside symbols of authority, such as teachers, police, ministers or even God.

To repeat, both extremes of authority are disastrous for the well-being of children. There is safety only in the middle ground, which is sometimes difficult for parents to locate.



move from Spearman.) Next they visited Churchill Downs, and the race track of the Kentucky Derby. At Joplin, Missouri they toured the Precious Moments Chapel and attended the show Fountain of Angels. They were scheduled to arrive in Guymon on Saturday, and at Buffalo, Oklahoma, the sun was shining, but by the time they reached Elmwood, 50 miles east of Guymon, wind and blowing snow caused the road to be closed. All the group and other travelers spent the night in crowded quarters at the little motel there. As they drove to Guymon the next day, they counted 13 cars and trucks in the ditch.

The dreadful weather on Saturday caused many accidents, but fortunately no serious injuries. Spearman escaped the brunt of it which seemed to be west and north, then moved to the east. Some of the reports follow:

Bob Boxwell, Charles Newcomb and Jeff Boxwell of Perryton were enroute to Guymon to hold a funeral about noon. They had no difficulty, except for the strong wind and blowing snow, until they turned north on Highway 207 just west of Hansford. The visibility became zero, and they were turned back by officials closing the road. Several other vehicles were included in the turn around. They tried #136 north from Gruver, but soon the complete whiteout forced them to turn back. Some of the cars were attempting to attend the funeral. It is to be rescheduled.

Carole Dickens had left Guymon to return to Spearman about noon, and had just turned south on #207 (about two miles) when the swirling snow caused her to lose all sense of direction. She was disoriented by the whiteout and

couldn't even see the truck which struck her car from the rear, forcing it into the ditch. Brandon Baker, driver of the Five Star Equipment truck, couldn't see the car ahead, though he was driving very slowly. It was an hour and half, at least, before the Spearman ambulance finally reached them and brought her to Hansford Hospital. She was not

seriously injured. Carole expresses deepest appreciation to the ambulance driver, and the EMT personnel who finally managed to cover the hazardous highway to reach them and so capably cared for her. They had been detained at the scene of another accident south on 207 near the Flintrock Feed Yards.

Deputy Allen Mires had been enroute to the accident on 207 and began to be in the snow soon after he turned north from highway 15. By the time he reached the area of Flintrock Feeders, the swirling, wind driven snow caused a complete whiteout. He barely could see the front of his car, so he radioed the ambulance, fire truck and others behind him of the condition. A pick-up passed him, barely averting a collision. He stopped to pull off the road when he was struck from behind by a Dodge pickup which spun him around

The Gruver ambulance struck a Chevrolet pick-up. Both vehicles were out of commission. Many other vehicles were stopped at the scene. Several of these were trying to reach Guymon for the funeral; all of this during a cold, windy whiteout.

Allen started to leave his car to check on the occupants of the other vehicles when he realized that he had back injuries. He and another injured man, whose name is not available, were placed in the Gruver ambulance in an attempt to keep them warm.

Eventually another Gruver ambulance reached them and brought them to Hansford Hospital. The Spearman ambulance was able to go on toward the accident farther north. The Spearman Fire Department was on the scene, and the accident was worked by a DPS officer. The ambulance and Allen's car had to be hauled back when trailers could reach them. Allen was taken on to an Amarillo hospital and released late Monday. He will be recuperating at home for several days. The other man was not seriously injured.

Fire Chief John Kunselman was driving the fire truck answering the call to the wreck north on 207. There was no fire, and the firemen assisted in traffic control.

The intense whiteout caused all highways in the vicinity to be closed. Many were the expressions of appreciation for the ambulance crews, firemen and other volunteers. They were in danger trying to assist and control traffic, and the community is certainly indebted to them.


When the Greyhounds played the Shamrock Fighting Irish, Gruver shut them out with a 39-0 score. It was no different at Vega last Friday night.
