

# **Gruver Educator Named Tops In Region**

Gruver educator Patricia Overbey has been selected the Region 16 Texas Middle School Association's Outstanding Teacher of the Year. Overbey, who has taught in the Gruver School system since 1984, is a 22-year teaching veteran. She currently teaches fifth grade social studies, sixth grade English and reading and seventh and eighth grade art.

The award was announced by Matt Branstine, Gruver Junior High Principal.

"Mrs. Overbey is a great asset to our school," Branstine said. "She designs and teaches collaborative lessons with other teachers on units of study. She uses her talents to enhance the learning experience of her students."

Overbey's students are quick to add their praise.

"Mrs Overbey's songs, art, and posters make history and homework fun," fifth grader Mariela Barrera said.

Overbey, who minored in art, often incorporates projects and other artistic learning tools into her lesson plans.

"I try to bring my own personality to the classroom by encouraging my class to organize their learning through music, art and graphic organizers," Overbey said.

Her students enjoy Overbey's blend of methods into their learning experience.

"I'm not surprised she is the teacher of the year," student Daniel Swink said. "She is a very fun teacher."

Overbey hopes the experience in her classroom will have lasting effects on her students.

"I want my students to be life-long learners," Overbey said. Her dedication and concern for her students has not gone unnoticed by Region 16 or her students. "We have been learning about role models," Chris Ortiz said. "Mrs. Overbey is a role model to a lot of people, like me." ## **Unofficial Election Results** Special Election, State Senate, District 31

A special election was held on January 20, 2004 for the purpose of the Office of State Senate, District 31. Early voting began Monday, January 5th and lasted through January 16th.

Gov. Rick Perry called the special election when state Sen. Teel Bivins, R-Amarillo, announced his resignation. Bivins left the seat he had held since 1989 to accept the nomination by President Bush to serve as ambassador to Sweden.

Texas counties had less than 30 days to prepare from the time the governor called the special election on December 8, 2003, with the holidays landing right in the middle of that period.

Election results for the state returns were as follows: Kel Seliger (R) - 24,791, Kirk Edwards (R) - 14,273, Don Sparks (R) - 11,213, Bob Barnes (R) - 9,478, Elaine King Miller (D) - 5,738, Lee Gibson (R) - 2,429, Jesse Quackenbush (R) - 1,488

Since no candidate came away from the special election with more than 50 percent of votes, the top two vote getters (Seliger and Edwards) will face each other in a run-off in February on a date yet to be determined.

Kel Seliger, R-Amarillo and Kirk Edwards, R-Odessa, will face each other in the runoff because they placed first and second, respectively, in the special election.

Anyone registered to vote can participate in the runoff. Even hose who didn't vote in the special election can vote in the runoff. Bob Barnes, R-Odessa, Lee Gibson, R-Dumas, Elaine King Miller, D-Amarillo, Jesse Quackenbush, R-Amarillo, and Sparks failed to make the runoff, but not all is over for them.


They now have to decide whether to keep on toward the March primary election or cut their losses.

The March 9 primary will be to choose the parties' nominees for the regular election in November. The regular election will determine the seat holder for its next full term.

# **Splawn Named Interim Principal at Gus Birdwell Elementary**

Although the surroundings are new, Ken Splawn is already at home behind the principal's desk at Gus Birdwell Elementary where he dons his purple shirt, a gift of the faculty, every Friday.

A 35-year veteran in the education field, Splawn replaces Susan Kelly who recently took medical retirement upon her doctor's request.

Splawn served as elementary principal in Perryton schools for 17 years, from 1985-1999 at Central Elementary and from 1999-2002 at Willams Elementary, a school for fourth and fifth graders. Twenty-six of his 35 years in education have been with the Perryton School system. Before becoming a principal, Splawn was a teacher and a football coach.

"It was so unusual, on a Monday night in December, I was attending a retired school personnel meeting, and we had been discussing retired administrators who had served as interim principals," Splawn said. "I made the remark, 'There is no market for interim principals.""

# Interstate Tourism Route **Planned Around Wind Energy**

Capitalizing on increasing car travel in the High Plains regions of Oklahoma and Texas, a consortium of cities, businesses, and agencies have launched a travel project that interprets the history of wind energy along a 600-mile corridor.

Windmills and barbed wire were responsible for widespread settlement of the High Plains, and giant wind farms now promise to play an equally important role as a source of renewable energy. The historic, cultural, and scientific tale of wind will be wrapped up in an interpretive driving route, made accessible to car and RV travelers in the form of a map, an audio CD, and a web site.

Participating communities hope that the map and CD will entice travelers to spend a little more time in their town, perhaps rounding out their visit with a meal, some Main Street shopping, and a good experience that will make them want to return. Business partners are hoping that the trail will help publicize wind energy. State and local agencies are using the trail as a way to foster economic development in rural towns, create interstate relationships, help small communities work with large ones, and deliver new tourism "product" to the region.

The project is designed to coincide with the annual International Windmill Fair, held this June in Shattuck, Oklahoma. The event attracts windmill enthusiasts from all over the world, and will be a

cooperative tourism project between Oklahoma and Texas, and crucial support from the Oklahoma Department of Tourism helped turn a local initiative into an interstate venture. Major energy suppliers such as Oklahoma Gas and Electric, and Western Farmers' Electric Cooperative of Lawton have also seen the trail as a vehicle to advance their twin goals of community development and publicity for renewable energy. Bergey Wind Power, a manufacturer of home wind energy turbines, saw the trail as a way in increase consumer awareness about its products.

The world's largest historic windmill collection, the American Wind Power Center in Lubbock, also saw the project as a way to address important conservation issues related to the upkeep and restoration of historic windmills. Similar concerns of the Buchanan Windmill Park and Shattuck Windmill Museum led to early support for the project. The historic collection at the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum in Canyon, and the Alternative Energy Institute at West Texas A&M University, were also interested in the exposure to their facilities that the trail could bring.

Convention and visitor bureaus in Norman and Lubbock see the venture as a way to add another level of activities and tourism product to their current mix. The Big 12 rivalry between Sooners and Red Raiders has, like all football rivalries, caused the respective communities to learn a lot about each other. In the case of Lubbock and Norman, the wind power trail was a natural extension of the tourism exchange that occurs every year between the two cities. Wind energy and the construction, maintenance, and business activity associated with it made the wind power trail a logical link for communities such as Woodward and Elk City, towns that have aggressively pursued economic development through tourism. These same issues-wind power, community revitalization, and a

This is the first large-scale desire to publicize their community—led to early support by the Spearman . Economic Development Corporation.

Although Oklahoma and Texas have robust tourism industries, and although both states have complementary tourism products, the division created by state lines has long acted as a barrier to cooperation between the two neighbors. Hardy Watkins, director of Travel and Tourism for the Oklahoma Department of Tourism, immediately recognized that a successful project in the sparsely populated High Plains would depend on cooperation that followed geographic contours rather than state lines. "The wind doesn't exactly respect state borders," was a comment heard early on.

Watkins and travel package manager Barbie Elder, also with the department of tourism, emphasized that the scope of the trail needed to follow the wind farms and windmill museumseven if that meant leaving the

comfortable confines of the state line. In the same vein, Kathy Adams, director of the regional tourism council Red Carpet Country, saw the interstate project as one that deserved the regional support of her organization. Shattuck, Oklahoma, has a lot more in common with Spearman, Texas, than either of those towns have with their respective state capitals.

Participants do not expect that their communities will be filled overnight with wind power enthusiasts. They are confident, however, that the wind power trail will attract interest in the short term, and will pay longterm dividends in terms of tourism, economic development, and support for renewable energy.

Begun as a light-hearted conversation at the Panhandle Diner in Spearman, the wind power trail was dreamed up by chamber director Gina Gillespie and developed as a concept by the Spearman Economic Development Corporation. The trail now includes stops in Lawton, Norman, Elk City, Woodward, Shattuck, Spearman, Canyon, Plainview, and Lubbock. Additional communities will likely be added to the trail, and many "right-ofway" windmills-those observable from the road—will also be included on the map.



SPEARMAN - Josephine "Jo" Kirk, 87, died Friday, January 16, 2004.



# **March 9th Republican Primary**

February 9th is the last day to register to vote for the March 9th primary election.

Early voting will be held at the Hansford County Courthouse in Spearman and the branch office in Gruver City Hall from February 23rd through March 5th.

March 1st is the last day applications may be submitted for an early ballot by mail for the primary, runoff and the general elections. Ballots will be mailed beginning January 24th.

The primary election day will be Tuesday, March 9, 2004 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the following polling places: Precinct 1: City Hall, 30 SW Court, Spearman; Precinct 2: Renner Ranch, 10175 Co. Rd. H, Spearman; Precinct 3: Cristo-Redentor Catholic Church, 202 Hwy. 15, Gruver; Precinct 4: Gruver High School Library, 405 Garrett, Gruver; Precinct 5: Assembly of God Church, 214 SW 6th, Spearman; Precinct 6: Spearman High School, 403 11th, Spearman; Precinct 7: Oslo Lutheran Church, 8605 Co. Rd. F, Oslo; and Precinct 9: Morse Community Building, 301 Main, Morse.

Two candidates filed for the Hansford County Judge position. Benny Wilson, who was appointed by the Hansford County Commissioners Court to fill the unexpired term of Judge Jim Brown, and Cody Cazares.

Four candidates filed for the Hansford County Sheriff position, including Deputy Pete Ochoa, Deputy Gary Evans, Deputy Lance Swan and Spearman Police Officer Edward Mayfield.

Two candidates filed for the Tax Assessor/Collector position. They are Linda Cummings, currently serving as assistant tax assessor/collector, and Jackie Reed Nelson, an employee at First State Bank.

Three candidates filed for the Precinct 3 County Commissioner seat. They include Tim Stedje, who was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Kent Guthrie, as well as Charlie Bell and Ty Williams.

Butch Reed, County Commissioner for Precinct 1, County Attorney John L. Hutchison, 84th Judicial District Judge William D "Bill" Smith and 84th Judicial District Attorney Clay Ballman are all running unopposed in the primary election.
