The state Comptroller's office recently reminded Texas businesses to
render their properny with county appraisal districts by Apriil 15 . To render is to list the taxable inventory, futriture and fixtures, machinery and

lanuary 1. 2003. Appraisal districts use the information to set property values
Business owners and operators are required by law to file an annual property tax rendition, but any property owner--including homeowners. armers and ranchers-may render their property with county appraisal
districts. Rendering allows property owners to record their opinion of shirics. Rendering allows property owners sporecoral salue and ensures that the appaisal district sends them a notice before placing a higher value on their property.
If more than one appraisal district appraiss a property, the property If more than once appraisal district appraises a property, the property
