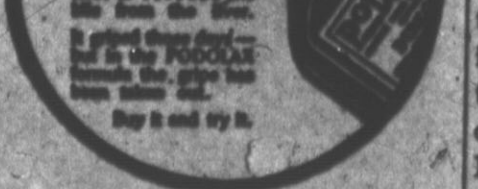

Ordinance No. 77.

An Ordinance to be known as Ordinance No. 77, protecting the City Water and Sewer service from pecuniary loss and prescribing a penalty for interference with said service.

Be it ordained by the City Commission of the City of Hereford, Texas:

Sec. 1. That in order to protect the City against loss resulting from the failure of any patron of the Water and Sewer service of the City of Hereford, to pay the Water and Sewer rents promptly as it accrues when due, the City Marshal is hereby instructed and required to disconnect any patron of said Water and Sewer service, who shall fail or refuse to pay his, her or their rents promptly when due.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person without authority from the Commission to turn water into any service pipe, or in any manner interfere with any water connection after it shall have been cut off by authority of this ordinance.

Sec. 3. Any person, firm or association of persons who shall desire to be supplied with City water after it has been cut off by authority of this ordinance, shall make written or verbal application to the City Marshal for the reinstatement of said service and pay therefor the sum of one dollar.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
