Twice Vanderbilt has been convicted of the crime he has been sentenced by juries to die by lethal injection. Following the hormal appeals, the U.S. Supreme Court has upheld the sentence. Enter Judge Justice. In 1988, Justice vacated that sentence because Vanderbilt, in the judge's opinion, had not been properly advised of his
rights before a psychiatrist examined the killer. Since that time, Judge Justice has been holding the case in his court on a stay of execution. Now, Judge Justice has announced, in a ruling made Aug. 12, that he is Now, ing out the death sentence eimposed by the courst beecause Vanderbitt is not a continuing danger to society. Vanderbilt has been siting on death
row since 1976, a very difficult place from which to endanger society. row since 1976, a very difficult place from which to endanger society.
Fifteen years and millions of dollars of tax money have been invested in trying to carry out the sentence that a jury of peer imposed on Vandertilt.

# MINDING YOUR OWN BUSINESS

## SELLING TO YOUR UNCLE

M
orris Carter ships popcom around the world. John Dry
den manufactures cushions for outdoor patio fumiture. Bill Hand owns and operates a welding shop. Charles McMahon is a manufacturing engineer.

These entrepreneurs have one thing in common. They sell their products and services to the same customer - their uncle. That's Uncle Sam, to be more specific.

Uncle Sam, alias the United States Government, is a big spender. In fact, our government is the largest single customer in the world. It has more than 2,000 purchasing departments that buy from big, medium-sized and small businesses.

Most small businesses don't have a clue about selling to the government. Who do you call? How do you get on the bidders lists? How do you know what the govemment wants to buy? How do you handle the infamous govermment paperwork? Other major
concerns are how long it takes to get paid and the fine print associated with govemment contracts.
Ready Resource
Across the country, agencies are available to help business owners do business with the government. They have many names including contract procurement centers, procurement assistance centers, contracting asssistance programs and govemment purchasing assistance centers. Regardless of the name, the mission is similar. These offices exist as a ready resource to help small businesses get government cgntracts.

In the northemmost 26 counties of the Texas Panhandle, the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission's Contract Procurement Center provides this service. Courtney Sharp coordiantes the program. "We have helped area businesses land more than $\$ 30$ million worth of federal, state and local government contracts." Sharp said. "Our procurement center opened just five years ago, so you can see he business is there."
Some Success Stories
John Dryden's firm, Paradise Cushions, has been successful in landing govemment contracts. The company makes designer cushions for upscale patio fumiture shops. It specializes in highquality, limited production items.
"We have a slow season after the summer production has been shipped." Dryden said. "We were looking for something to produce to keep our workers employed and to pay overhead." He ound help at the Contract Procurement Center.

By doing a computer search of requests for proposals, Sharp
located items that Uncle Sam needed and Dryden could produce. One of the best matches was a canvas backpack for firefighters.

Dryden knew he could build it and decided to bid. "We gor he contract, worth $\$ 625,000$," Dryden said. "That will keep us busy right up io spring production.

Morris Carter landed a three-year contract in 1988 to sel popcom to U.S. Government locations in Europe and the Pacific Rim. "It was good business for us," Canter said. "The paperwork really isnt that bad, and we generally get paid in 30 to 60 days."

Charies Mcimahon has been the successfui bidder on govern ment contracts. However, he feeis there may be ways of making money, even when you arent the lowest bidder. "If you lose a bid, McMahon advised, "call the low bidder. You may be able to subcontract part of the order. "McMahon points out that often there is more profit and less red tape involved for a subcontractor. "You may be a winner even when you lose," he smiled.

Bill Hand has landed several small contracts but feels that the red tape is a real problem. "They really pile the paperwork on you," Hand said. "Sometimes, I think the extra business isn't worth the hassle." Hand felt that he might be better off working on non governmental accounts.

 hits the high points By Suranne GillThe book on Babe," swy actor Stephen Lange, "is that he was a simple man, but IVe never really met a simple man." First and foremost, Geors Herman "Babe" Ruth was a gian among bascball players. He shook the game to its foundations, and he personified the era in which he lived.
Born six years before the century, young George Ruth was left by his father at a Baltimore orphanages, and he never stopped being a kid. When he lef Baltimore, his one thought was to play baseball, or, as the script of NBC: Bebe Ruth puts it, to "have fun." His exuberance spilled over into his private life, which was largely unreported in the press at the time. He ate, smoked, gambled and womanized. ate, smoked, gambled and womanized. And when he

swing after that of Chicago White Sox slugger "Shoeless" Joe Jackson. "He had the perfectest swing I ever saw in my life," Ruth said.)
With Ruth, everything must be raised to a higher order of magnitude. He was not only physically big(Lang gained 35 pounds inst to nley the youne relative pounds iust to piay the young, reiativehave since been broken, no one player has equaled his performance on the has eq
field.
Babe Ruth paints its hero in broad, quick strokes. Lang gives the part his all, but he can't overcome the glibness of the script. Too many scenes are set up simply to shoehorn in a famous quote, either by the Babe or about him. At that, Babe Ruth offers nothing of his seasons with the Boston Red Cor, when, as a pitcher, he set a shut record that still stands.

The film's finest moments come when Ruth is with children (the apocryphal hitting-the-home-run-forapocryphal hitting-the-home-run-forJohnny scene is not here, thank goodness) or with his own hero, Yankee manager Miller Huggins
(Bruce Weitz). Pete Rose appears, in a (Bruce Weitz). Pete Rose appears, in a
much-publicized cameo, as Detroit much-publicized cameo, as Detroit
Tigers player-manager Ty Cobb. Due to the producers' licensing agreemen with Major League Baseball, Rose, who is currently banned from the game, was not allowed to appear in uniform.

When executives at NBC Sports made the decision to bring regular season college football back to the network after 26 years, they decided to do things in a bis way. And they did signing an exclusive five-year agreement to broadcast all "Fiehtin Irish" home games.
Who can blame executive producer Terry O'Neil, himself a Notre Dame alumnus, for acting siddy about the deal? After all, five of the top six all-time highest rated college football games involved Notre Dame. Over the last three seasons, TV audiences for Notre Dame games have been 52 percent higher than the average for college football telecasts, and, in the last decade, Notre Dame has played in the three highest rated college games.
The partnership between the university and the television network was forged in a struagle involving the Collene Foothall Association and a court battle between the NCAA and the univeraties of Georgia and Othohom over rights to negotiate televition over re But by tokine adventege of the cituation, NBC and Notre Deme heve situation, NDC and Notre Date have set what could be a dagerous trend in college football recruiting.
In making a major financial commitment to one school, NBC's fortunes have become irrevocably linked to the success of that school's football program. Pandora's Box is open.
