## Baryshnikov dances, delights audience

What does the Texas Panhandle have that Birmingham, Ala., Tallahassee and Pensicola, Fla., New Orleans, La., and Dallas don't? Recent live memories of Mikhail Baryshnikov, the world renown ballet dancer.

Breathless anticipation swept this area when it was announced in early May that the Russian-born star would make an appearance in the Amarillo Civic Center auditorium on Aug. 15, courtesy of that city's Lone Star Ballet.

Season ticketholders of the organization had first call on tickets for the event; as a result, by the time sales went public in early June, tickets sold out the first day. Ticket prices ranged from \$25 to \$125; this reporter couldn't even wrangle a press pass, so appearing on a waiting list provided a far-fetched hope of seeing the famed dancer.

Two weeks prior to the performance, the call came; this writer could attend this historic event! The excitement lasted only a few days, however, as nationwide news told of an ankle injury plaguing the star, who was forced to cancel performances in the aforementioned cities. Gloom descended upon the Panhandle; the dancer's doctor predicted that ankle might be well by Aug. 12. Elsewhere, ticket money was being refunded to disappointed patrons.

Yet last Saturday night arrived and the versatile dancer performed before a sold-out Amarillo audience estimated at 2,500-2,600 people, including this writer. Men dressed in everything from blue jeans and T-shirts to tuxedos and ruffled shirts accompanied women dressed in cool, cotton seersucker frocks to backless, strapless designer originals at the event.

Thunderous applause greeted Baryshnikov as he joined 10 accompanying ballerinas on stage during act one's suite of dances from the full-length ballet, "Don Quixote." Choreographed by the multi-talented dancer, the spirited number was set before a backdrop featuring a Spanish bullfight.

The pace changed dramatically as the second act, entitled "Apollo," featured a dreamlike dance sequence with the star and three ballerinas performing against a night sky full of stars. Two 20-minute intermissions provided fans the chance to discuss the danseur's techniques.

The final act, "Who Cares?" utilized the music of George Gershwin. In modern dress before a big city skyline, the tour group obviously enjoyed their ballet routine bordering on modern dance as they danced with wild abandon to a standing ovation.

The main thought that occurred to this writer when the Russian defector first appeared was "phenomenal!" Such an observation via binoculars was maintained throughout the two-and-a-half hour event, although the performer's advancing age was, at times, evident. Yet the recent ankle problem did not seem to trouble the star as he performed complex, technical ballet steps with the greatest of grace and poise.

According to Kay Kennedy, board president of Lone Star Ballet, "Baryshnikov was quite reserved,

very gracious and courteous. He was very protected by a large entourage. He graciously accepted an honorary belt buckle commemorating Amarillo's upcoming centennial celebration, a gift which has only been presented to President Reagan, Governor Clements and two other recipients."

Amarillo was the only stop the veteran dancer made in Texas during his 1987 summer tour. Whether the event was attended by ballet enthusiasts or Baryshnikov groupies is unclear; yet for whatever reason, it was an event many Texans will always hold dear, as they know they witnessed one of the world's most famous ballet performers.

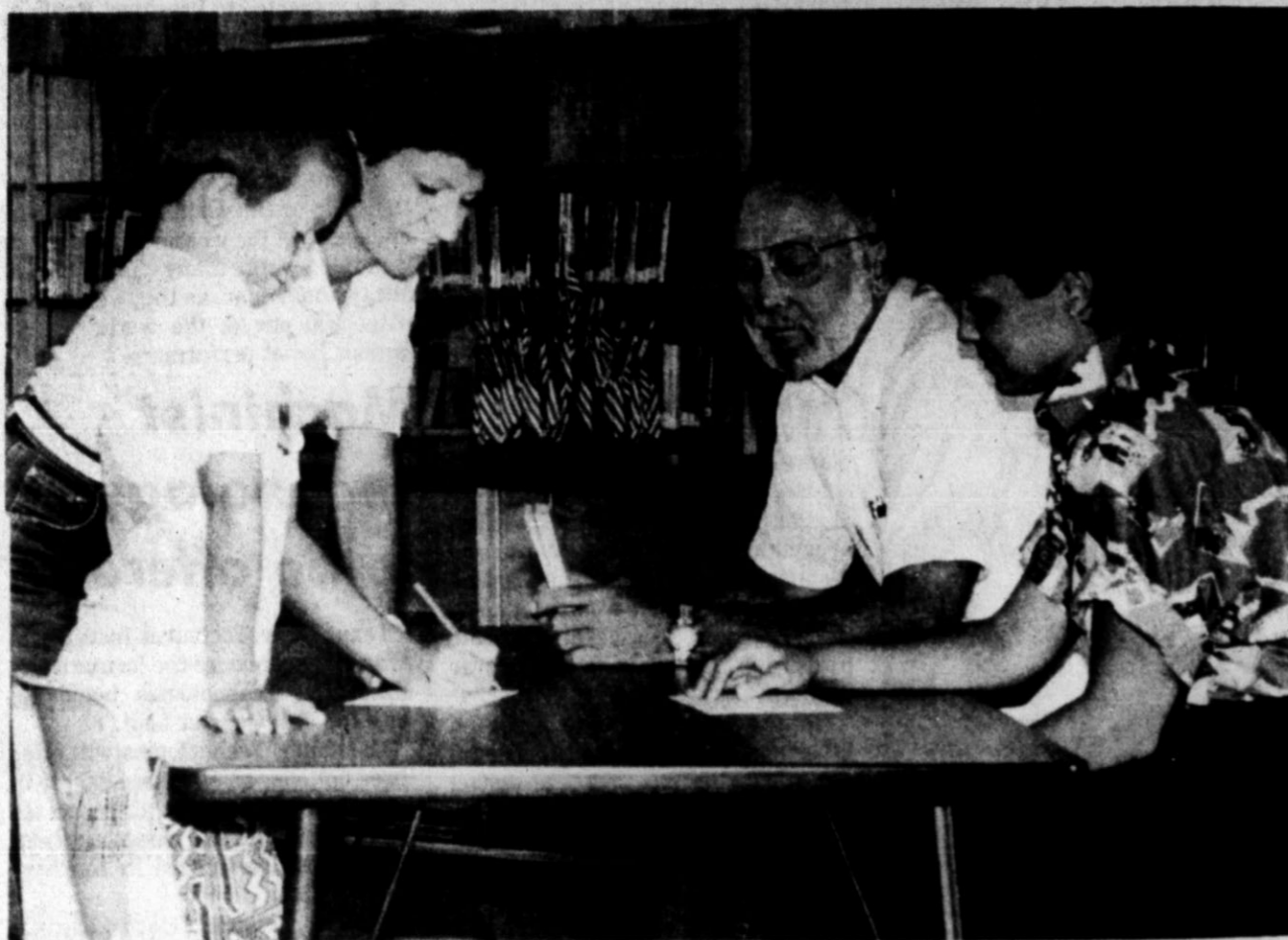

## Urbanczyk family reunion held

A record attendance of 192 persons were present at the 19th annual Urbanczyk family reunion in Thompson Park August 9th.

The children of the late Felix Urbanczyk were the host family: Theresa Kotara of White Deer, Ethel Stengel of Amarillo, and Irene Dziuk, Rosalie Stengel, Leona Mazurek, Tony Urbanczyk, Edna Reinart and Conrad's widow, Aurelio Urbanczyk, all of Hereford.

Relatives came from White Deer, Panhandle, Pampa, Groom, Hereford, Amarillo, Lubbock, Alvarado, McAllen, San Antonio, Nazareth, Wichita Falls, Dalhart, Austin, Suquamish, Wa., Pullman, Wa., Olympia, Wa., Columbus, Ohio, Miami, Florida, and Lake Arthur, N.M.

Special guests were two Polish priests from San Antonio, Father John Yanta and Father Frank Kuizaj, who celebrated on Saturday evening a wedding anniversary Mass in Polish at St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church, Pampa, honoring Henry and Ramona Urbanczyk which was followed by a reception in the M.K. Brown Civic Auditorium. Henry has been named to the Board of Directors of the Polish American Congress of Texas, and is a personal friend of Fr. Yanta. They are on the committee to plan Pope John Paul II's visit to San Antonio when he comes to the United States in September.

Father Frank Kuizaj, a native of Silesia, Poland, the province from where the "Texas" Urbanczyk family originated and who is in San Antonio furthering his study of the English language, revealed that he was a relative of some of the members present. He gave a talk speaking the same dialect the Urbanczyks were familiar with and led the group in singing Polish songs. He gave the blessing before the meal in Polish and Father Yanta gave it in English.

John Kotara, III was master of ceremonies and led the memorial service. Relatives who died in the past year were Jimmie Dziuk, Howard Beddingfield, Sallie Haiduk, Louis Vednorz and Stanley Lawrence. A special prayer was said for the sick and the infirmed

members.

The only surviving members of Anton Urbanczyk's family are his daughter Adela (Mrs. Leo Bichsel) who resides in St. Ann's Home, Panhandle and a daughter-in-law, Annie Urbanczyk of Rhineland, widow of the late Alois Urbanczyk.

The youngest children present were Christopher Dylan Whitten, age one month, of Pampa, great-grandson of Adela Bichsel and Johathan Christopher Urbanczyk, age one year, great grandson of the late John Urbanczyk. The oldest Urbanczyk present was Florence Pawlik of McAllen, daughter of the late John Urbanczyk and the oldest member present was Ed Dziuk, Sr. of Hereford, son-in-law of the late Felix Urbanczyk. A special prayer was said for the safety of Dalan Rohan and Angie Beddingfield of Panhandle and Helen Obert of Dallas, daughters of the late Ben Urbanczyk, who left August 8th for a two weeks tour of Poland.

Many participated in a trivia quiz on the Anton Urbanczyk family which was compiled and led by Edna Reinart. Each of the Felix Urbanczyk displayed a photo album of their individual family. The rest of the afternoon was spent visiting by some while others enjoyed the entertainment of the Amusement Park and/or visiting the zoo.

Anton Urbanczyk was three years of age when he came to America from upper Silesia, Poland with his parents and 100 other families in 1854. They reached Galveston on Dec. 3, a 9-week voyage. Those who were physically able, went by boat to Indianola further down the Texas coast and walked 200 miles along the oxcart road toward San Antonio. They were met by Father Leopold Moczynska.

He led them to a spot 50 miles southeast of San Antonio, arriving there on Christmas Eve, when they had a midnight Mass of Thanksgiving. Only Father Leopold could speak the English language. He was working among German colonists in 1852 when he persuaded relatives and friends to come to Texas to escape the Prussian rule and find a place where they could worship and educate their children as they pleas-

ed.

Being fluent in several languages he was much in demand to help all immigrants who came to Texas and he stayed only a short time with the immigrants. Because their language, customs and culture were strange to the other people living in the area, communication was virtually impossible but the colonists helped each other and survived the many hardships.

Anton Urbanczyk moved his family to Rhineland in 1905. But the three brothers and their sister Adela moved further north; John in 1910, Ben and Felix in 1911, and Adela in 1921. Felix moved his family to Hereford in 1937.

The new environment was reminiscent of early times in Panna Maria. They too slept in hastily built houses—oftentimes two families to a building. They slept on feed sacks spread on the floor and endured Panhandle blizzards as best they could, burning cowships for fuel since there was no wood. But the settlers helped each other just as the first colonists did in Panna Maria and today are an asset to the White Deer community and surrounding area.

## Microwave tasty celery casserole

A quick vegetable casserole with a rich cheese topping is ideal for microwaving. This celery casserole takes little time to prepare and is a different lunch entree to serve with a mixed green salad and muffins.

### MICROWAVE COOKING

#### CELERY CASSEROLE

- 4 cups sliced celery
- 1 4-ounce can mushrooms, drained
- 1 tablespoon water
- 1 10 1/2-ounce can condensed cream of celery soup
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 cup shredded Swiss cheese

- 1/4 cup melted butter or margarine
- 2 cups herb-seasoned croutons

Place celery, mushrooms and water in a 1 1/2-quart casserole dish. Cook covered, on Full for 6 to 8 minutes, or until tender. Drain liquid from dish into a 2-cup glass measure. Add enough water to equal 1/4 cup liquid. Add celery soup and pepper to liquid and stir. Pour over celery in casserole. Sprinkle with shredded cheese. Place butter in small bowl. Heat on Full for 45 seconds to 1 minute, or until melted. Add croutons and lightly toss. Sprinkle croutons over top of casserole. Heat on Full for 11 to 13 minutes, or until heated through. This kitchen-tested recipe makes 6 servings.

**Astros get 4-game sweep over Braves**

HOUSTON (AP) — Billy Hatcher and the scuffed ball controversy heated up as the Houston Astros completed a four-game sweep of the Atlanta Braves, a sweep that Braves manager Chuck Tanner says may have ended any playoff hopes the Braves had.

Hatcher, the Astros left fielder, had four hits, including his 10th homer of the year and scored three runs Monday night to lead the Astros an 11-2 victory over the Braves.

"They sure pounded our heads in," Tanner said after the Astros outscored the Braves 33-8 in the four-game series. "This probably knocked us out of it."

The scuffed ball controversy began when both benches cleared after Rick Mahler, pitching in a rare relief role, hit batters Kevin Bass and Glenn Davis to lead off the Astros' sixth.

The pitch to Davis was a fast ball up and in that hit him in the neck.

"I was not throwing at him," said Mahler. "I'd never try to hit anyone in the head. The pitch just got away because it was one of the scuffed balls (Astros pitcher Mike) Scott had used the inning before."

In the top of the sixth, the Braves asked home plate umpire Bob Davidson to check Astros starting pitcher Scott's baseball.

"It was definitely the same ball Scott had used," echoed Braves catcher Ozzie Virgil. "It was scuffed."

Tanner added, "I think he was scuffing it, at least early on, but he's an excellent pitcher and he had to do what he had to do."

Scott, who defeated the Braves for only the third time in 13 previous decisions ran his record to 13-9 with a six-hit, 10-strikeout performance over 8 innings. He had last defeated the Braves on April 29, 1984.

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — Thad Bosley got his chance because Bo Jackson, the major league's leading strike out artist, was having one of his bad nights.

Bosley's ninth-inning, two-out, pinch-hit single gave the Kansas City Royals a 7-6 come-from-behind victory over the Texas Rangers on Monday night.

Jackson, who has 146 strikeouts, started for the first time in nine games, but struck out four times.

"I like Bosley off the bench because he has done well off the bench," said Royals' Manager Billy Gardner. "He's hit a couple of home runs for us. But we'll stay this way for awhile (with Jackson in the starting lineup). It's a big win for us."

"Instead of dropping to seven games behind Minnesota we're still six."

Bosley got the game-winning hit off reliever Steve Howe after back-to-back, two-out doubles by Danny Tartabull and Frank White had tied the score 5-5.

"Bosley knows Howe from the National League so he had a pretty good idea how to hit him," Gardner said.

John Davis (2-0) picked up the victory in relief while Jeff Russell (4-3) was saddled with the loss.

It was Kansas City's best comeback victory since Aug. 19th of last year.

The Rangers dropped 9 and 1-2 games behind the Twins in the American League West.

It was Bosley's first pinchhit in his last 10 tries.

"I felt sooner or later something good would happen," Bosley said. "I've been hitting the ball hard. My job is to be ready on the bench and I did. This is the first time I feel I have really contributed to the team's success."

The Rangers have lost 13 of their last 19 games. It was the 32nd time this year that the Rangers had lost a game after having a lead.

"We let this one get away," said Rangers' Manager Bobby Valentine. "When we have a four run lead in the seventh inning I expect to win the game. We should have nailed it down."

The Rangers led 4-0 and 5-1 before the Royals rallied.

Larry Parrish and Mike Stanley homered for Texas while Tartabull hit a homer for the Royals.

In the second game of the series, Kansas City's Mark Gubicza (9-12) will meet Charlie Hough (12-8) of the Rangers.

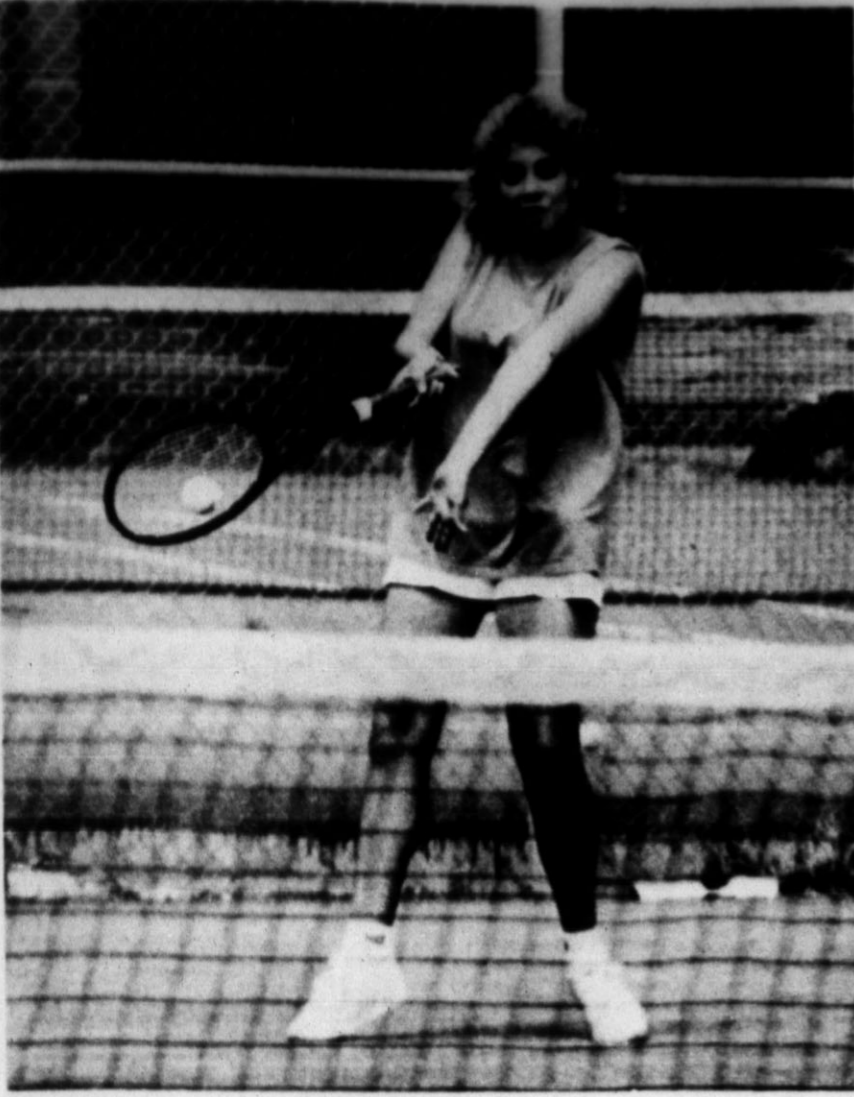

## Infection hampers repair of fracture

DEAR DR. GOTT — Fourteen months ago I was in a motorcycle accident. I fractured my arm (which was pinned with a 6-inch screw) and developed osteomyelitis. The fracture appears to be healing, but I was told that this was impossible because of the myelitis. What is the truth, and what is the outlook for keeping my arm? How should I monitor it?

DEAR READER — Osteomyelitis (bone infection) is a troublesome complication of surgery to repair fractures. In most cases, the infection is introduced either during the injury or during the operation. A foreign body (such as a pin, a screw or an artificial joint) can act as a reservoir of bacterial contamination, because the synthetic material has no way of cleaning itself once it is in the body.

Ordinarily, an infected screw would have to be removed in order for the infection to be eradicated; bone healing may be delayed until the infection has been cleared up with antibiotics. However, in your case, the osteomyelitis appears to have been controlled, allowing the fracture to knit.

Your orthopedic surgeon can best monitor your progress. To do this, he or she will require serial X-ray examinations to document the formation of new bone at the site of the injury. In addition, the surgeon probably will base much of his or her judgment on whether your arm is gaining strength and whether you are free of pain.

Sometimes doctors use special blood tests, such as white blood cell counts, to assess whether osteomyelitis is persistent.

DEAR DR. GOTT — Could my acne rosacea be caused by the three cups of coffee and two large diet colas I drink daily?

DEAR READER — Rosacea is a chronic form of acne in adults that causes dilation of blood vessels in the skin of the cheeks, forehead and — especially — the nose. It is not related to the consumption of coffee and cola drinks, except in the rare person who may be allergic to substances in these drinks.

Severe rosacea on the nose causes a peculiar and disfiguring redness and

overgrowth of tissue called rhinophyma — the W.C. Fields type of puffy, bulbous nose. Some heavy drinkers seem to be predisposed to this unfortunate skin condition. Acne rosacea can be treated with antibiotics; for rhinophyma, plastic surgery may be necessary.

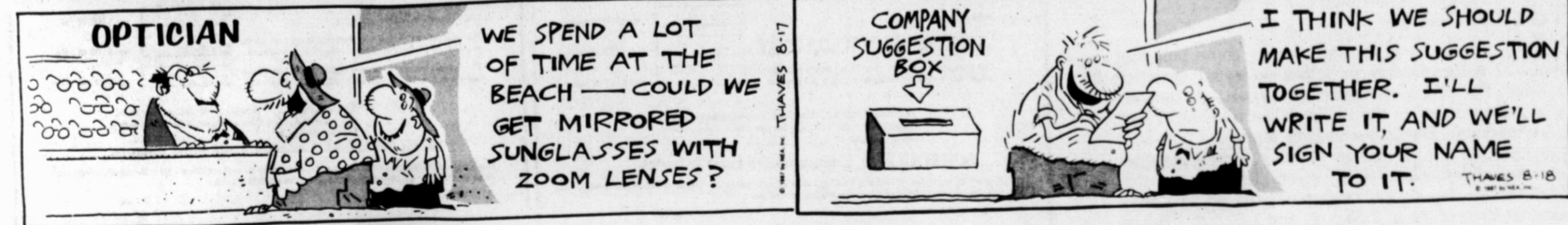

## Cisneros decides against run for statewide office

SAN ANTONIO, Texas (AP) — Saying he wants to devote more time to his sick child and civic projects, Mayor Henry Cisneros announced he would not seek the governorship or any statewide office in 1990.  
Cisneros, who announced his decision Monday, had been considered a Democratic front-runner for governor under Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby decided last month not to enter the gubernatorial race.  
Cisneros said he made his decision so supporters could commit to other

candidates. Attorney General Jim Mattox welcomed the news, saying it was "a tremendous boost for me."  
Cisneros, 40, is in his fourth term as mayor. He is one of the state's top Hispanic leaders and a rising national leader who was interviewed as a possible vice presidential running mate in 1984.  
"... Today I wish to state that I will not be a candidate for the office of governor, senator or any other statewide position in 1990," Cisneros said. "This decision having been reached, I believe it is best to set it forth clearly for family, friends and

fellow public officials.  
"It will allow me to tackle some very challenging issues in San Antonio... without opponents damaging those efforts for reasons of wanting to cripple a campaign for higher office," he said. "No one can truthfully say that these initiatives are being pursued to advance my political ambitions."  
Another factor in Cisneros' decision is the health of his 2-month-old son, John Paul Anthony, who was born with a congenital heart defect and an abnormal digestive system.  
"The family stresses associated with John Paul's care require attention that is not compatible with gearing up for a major statewide effort," Cisneros said.  
Cisneros called several state officials, including Mattox and Treasurer Ann Richards, to tell them he would not be running for governor in 1990. Both Democrats are prospective candidates for that office.  
Mattox said Cisneros told him "he felt it was not fair to me nor our mutual friends for him to not make a decision because he knew there are people who would be torn between the two of us."  
Land Commissioner Garry Mauro, another Democrat, said Monday, "I'm a lot closer to running for governor in 1990 today than I was yesterday." Mauro said he would not have wanted to run against Cisneros.  
In Corpus Christi, Ruben Bonilla, president of the Mexican-American Democrats' political fund-raising arm, said Cisneros' decision is somewhat disappointing to Hispanics, but that he should not be counted out.  
"By no means is Henry Cisneros' obituary being written today," Bonilla said. "There is no doubt in Texas today that Jim Mattox will sleep with a new buoyancy."  
Cisneros, whose mayoral term expires in April 1989, said he would concentrate on such civic issues as a stadium proposal and proposed regulations for developers whose plans could affect the Edwards Aquifer.

## Bouncing checks may reflect hard times

MIDLAND, Texas (AP) - When the Permian Basin's economy was flattened by last year's oil-price drop, checks started bouncing in increasing numbers.  
If the number of bad checks is an indicator of how the economy is doing, then the signs are mixed for Midland and Odessa.  
This year, fewer bad checks are being referred to the Midland County Attorney's office. But the number of bad checks referred to the Ector County Attorney's office in Odessa is about even with last year's record-shattering number.  
Midland County dealt with 8,973 bad checks last year, said Barbara Carr, the Hot Check Division's administrative assistant. Through July this year, the county has seen 3,524 hot checks.  
The Ector County Attorney's office had to deal with 34,000 bad checks last year, said Hot Check Division Supervisor Jana Pugh. The year before, 15,000 hot checks were referred to the division, she said.  
"That was just a real jump," she said. "People in other counties just can't believe the number of bad checks we've had."  
About 5,000 insufficient checks were referred to the Ector County office in the first seven months this year, and 5,072 were referred to the office from January through July last year, she said. She did not have any precise figures for 1987.

Another reason for the increased restitution, she said, is that thousands of transient laborers who worked in the oilfields have moved away.

People in Ector County tend to shop earlier, so there is a flurry of bad checks in the final quarter, Ms. Pugh said. Midland County sees a surge of bad Christmas checks in January, February and March, Ms. Carr said.

**POLLY'S POINTERS** — Windows must be replaced

By Polly Fisher

**DEAR POLLY** — My husband works in a little "gate house" which has Plexiglas windows. These have such a film on them that it is hard to see out. We've tried all the cleaners we can find, including one made especially for Plexiglas, but nothing seems to help. Have you any suggestions? — MRS. J.C.W.

**DEAR MRS. J.C.W.** — I'm afraid those windows need to be replaced if those inside want to have a clear view of the outside world! If the plastic can't be cleaned by washing with a mild detergent solution or special plastic cleaner, the windows are probably scratched. Many tiny scratches over the entire surface of the window look like a film or haze. (This is similar to glassware that is "etched" by chemicals and harsh detergents.) According to my sources, the scratches can't be cleaned away. — POLLY

**DEAR POLLY** — For the past 50 years of sewing, I have found my way of fabric marking very easy. To transfer pattern markings to fabric, I take a small stitch wherever a mark needs to be made. I don't knot the thread, but take a stitch, then clip the thread leaving an inch or so of thread on either end. A series of these can mark a dart or tuck line, while single stitches mark dots, centerlines, etc. The thread can be quickly pulled out when the mark is no longer needed. Everything is clearly marked and there are never any lasting markings on the fabric. — ADELE

**DEAR ADELE** — Although at first glance your method looks like more work than other fabric marking methods, I found that it is really very quick and easy. The little thread "tacks" take only a moment to do and they pull out leaving absolutely no marks. I really like this method.

**DEAR POLLY** — I have a recipe for coconut cream frosting that calls for one cup of toasted coconut. Do you have a recipe for toasting coconut? I looked through all my cookbooks and couldn't find anything. — MABEL

**DEAR MABEL** — Nothing could be simpler than toasting coconut. Just spread the coconut in a thin layer in a shallow pan, then toast it in a 325-degree oven until golden brown. This can take from 10 to 20 minutes, depending on how dry the coconut is to start with, but keep a close eye on it at all times. Stir the coconut every few minutes so it browns evenly. Remove the coconut as soon as it is golden, as it will darken quickly once it starts to change color. Toasted coconut adds a delightful new flavor when added to custards, used as a cake or pie topping, or sprinkled on frosted cookies. It's easy to make and fun to experiment with. — POLLY
