## Jury deciding Carbajal's fate

Wednesday and ended late Monday evening after Carbajal was question-

torney Roland Saul and defense attorney Jerry Smith.
The attorneys made their closing arguments this morning.
In his charge to the jury, District In his charge to the jury, District
Judge Wes Gulley instructed the jury
they could find Carbajal guilty of murder; involuntary manslaughter if the jury determined Carbajal
acted in a fit of passion; innocent by acted in a fit of passion; innocen
reason of insanity; or innocent. Carbajal testified that his wife and
her mother, Soyla Tamez, practiced her mother, Soyla Tamez, practiced
witcheraft and that he had witnessed various acts of "worship" which in-
volved the burning and sacrificial burning of chickens after their blood had been drunk. He said that he meet Marina when she was 10 years old and that at that
time she was still drinking milk from time she was still drinking milk from a baby botie. He told jurors that he
was 13 at the time, and when they were 12 and 15 years of age, respec
tively, they were living together tively, they were living together.
