City experiencing a building permit rush

Hereford has experienced an economic boomlet in the first half of 1993, especially when compared to the same period in 1992

Value of building permits issued this year by the City of Hereford, from January to the end of June, amounts to \$1,480,415, compared with a total of \$286,812 during the same period in 1992.

Actually, the six-month total this year even exceeds the year's total for 1992. Boosted by a permit of \$800,000 for construction of a nursing home, the '92 permits added up to \$1,463.868. The city issued 95 permits during the year.

Although there was little difference in the number of building permits issued in the first six months by the city -- 47 last year and 50 this year -- the value of improvements and alterations is significantly higher More than \$1.4 million issued in first six months of this year

In 1992, there were no permits issued for new homes during the first six months. Construction was permitted for two new homes, for a total value of \$300,000, in the first six-month period in 1993

A single commercial building permit was issued by the city in the January-June period of 1992. The \$100,000 permit was taken out by Scott Oil Change.

Through the end of June of this year, 13 commercial permits have been issued, most of them for alteration or remodeling in two shopping areas of the city. Only one permit was issued for new construction, that for

a \$10,000 warehouse at 103 Cooper.

The largest permit so far this year was taken out by National Medical Care, Inc., for \$265,000, for a facility in the North Gate Plaza shopping center.

Permits of \$200,000 each were issued to Conway Oil Company for a remodeling job at 403 25 Mile Avenue, and First United Methodist Church for alterations in the church's fellowship hall and kitchen.

A \$150,000 permit was issued Taylor and Sons for remodeling of space in Sugarland Mall for a new

Several businesses are opening in the North Gate center. Anthony's applied for a permit for \$85,000; Balfour Optical for \$18,000, Francisco's for \$7,500, Rick's Ice Cream Parlor for \$12,000 and The Office

Other major permits have been issued to Little Caesars, \$45,000; Calco Machine, Inc. \$10,000, and Purma Mills, \$50,000.

The 1991 building permit picture/marked a low in the economic health of Hereford, as determined by construction, either new or remodeling and alterations.

On a total of 99 permits issued, the amount represented was only \$831,450. In the first six months of that year, 39 permits were taken out for a total of \$390,992 in construction.

The record for building permits in Hereford was set in 1985 when 168 jobs were listed with a value

Insurance companies announce rates hike

AUSTIN (AP) - State Farm Insurance Cos. has announced it will raise property insurance premiums an average of 12.4 percent, and auto rates, an average of 8.3 percent.

Meanwhile, Farmers Insurance Group of Cos. raised statewide auto insurance rates an average of 5.7 percent effective Wednesday, with homeowners' insurance rates rising an average of 11.7 percent, effective Aug. 1.

State Farm on Wednesday cited weather-related losses and increasing claim costs as the reason for the rate

"We are concerned about the affordability of our products and regret that it is necessary to adjust our rates," said State Farm spokesman Charles Wirth.

"However, hail and wind losses in Texas have pushed up our claim costs," he said.

Rates will vary by coverage and location for individual policyholders. The new rates are effective immediately for new customers and will apply to existing customers as their policies are renewed.

Farmers Insurance blamed lawyers

for their hikes. 'Attorney involvement in auto insurance claims rose by 60 percent from 1977 to 1988 industrywide," Mark Toohey, a Farmers spokesman, said. "Half of the money paid by insurance companies for injuries from auto accidents goes to lawyers and to pain-and-suffering awards."

Under Texas law, insurance companies can raise their rates without having to get state approval if the increases are within a certain

The rate changes are within that limit, but State Board of Insurance Chairwoman Claire Korioth said she was disappointed in the increase.

She urged consumers to shop around.

"The Texas Department of insurance doesn't encourage people to leave one company for another. But we urge consumers to put in a little time and determine which companies give the best deals," Ms. Korioth said.

"Texas' competitive system gives consumers the opportunity to shop around for a better deal," she said.

The Insurance Department offers free booklet called "Shopping Smart," which offers tips on saving money on insurance, she said.

Convicted killer executed today for 14-year-old crime

HUNTSVILLE, Texas (AP) -Convicted killer Curtis Paul Harris was executed early today for using a tire jack 14 years ago to fatally club a motorist who had stopped to help Harris and his brother with their received no prison time. disabled car.

Harris, 31, and his brother, Danny, both were sentenced to lethal injection for bludgeoning Timothy Merka, 27, of Mumford, in what Samaritan" killing.

Merka had been flagged down by the Harris brothers the night of Dec. 11, 1978 when their car broke down on a rural Brazos County road.

When Warden Jack Pursley asked Harris if he had a final statement, Harris replied "No," then said "No"

He was pronounced dead at 12:27 a.m. CDT, eight minutes after the lethal drugs began flowing into his

Harris' execution was the second this week in Texas. A Houston man, Markham Duff-Smith, was executed early Tuesday for arranging the killing of his mother so he could collect his inheritance.

Curtis Harris was 17 at the time of the Merka killing. His brother was 18.

Their disabled car had been stolen earlier by companion James Manuel and they flagged down Merka, who worked at nearby Texas A&M University, to give them a battery

Testimony showed Danny Harris held down Merka, who was pleading for his life, while Curtis beat the man with the tire tool. Then they emptied his pockets, took his wallet and drove home to Bryan with his pickup truck.

Clinton offers \$1 billion plan to end timber fight

Clinton is hoping to end the deadlock over the northern spotted owl and logging in the Northwest by severely injecting \$1 billion to help ease the loss of logging jobs.

A timber plan to be announced at the White House today would reduce timber harvests to about one-third what they were in the 1980s when logging in federal forests west of the Cascade Mountains was at its peak, administration officials said.

To offset the economic impact, Clinton is offering more than \$1 billion over five years for new jobs and retraining, economic development for businesses and community assistance, officials said.

The jobs will be mostly in watershed restoration and ecological programs, and the money would have to be approved by Congress.

The administration proposal comes nearly three months after Clinton at a forest conference in Oregon promised to resolve the longstanding dispute between loggers and environmentalists over protection of the threatened owl.

But it is not likely to end the fight. Timber industry representatives and their allies in Congress already have said the proposed logging reductions - an annual drop from 4 million board feet in the 1980s to 1.2 million board feet - is too severe. Efforts will be made to increase the predicted Wednesday.







In-depth review of super collider team is ordered

WASHINGTON (AP) - Troubled by accusations of poor management at the super collider, Energy Secretary Hazel O'Leary has ordered an in-depth review that could result in a shakeup of the team building the giant atom smasher.

O'Leary, who strongly criticized the performance of the collider's managers during a House Energy and Commerce oversight subcommittee hearing Wednesday, said the review will be completed in 30 days.

One focus of the probe is whether the Energy Department should terminate its management contract with Universities Research Association, the non-profit consortium of universities now overseeing construction of the collider in Texas.

Other options, O'Leary said, include renegotiating the contract to strengthen Energy Department oversight and dividing the contract into two components: construction and scientific work.

The director of the collider laboratory, Roy Schwitters, had scant comment when asked in an interview about the review, which he said he hadn't heard about until Wednesday's

Asked if O'Leary's comments suggested that his job and those of other top managers were in jeopardy, Schwitters replied: "I don't know what the details of her 30-day review. are. I can't answer it until I understand better."

Announcement of the review comes just six days after the House voted for the second consecutive year to kill the collider, now estimated to cost \$10 billion or more.

While O'Leary didn't question URA's handling of the science issues,

The Shangri La had a unique history. On April 18, 1942, Gen. James Doolittle led his squadron of Army B-25 bombers off the deck of the USS Hornet for the raid on Tokyo. The Japanese thought they had sunk the Hornet earlier in the South Pacific, so when the press asked President Roosevelt about the launch site, he responded: "Let's say they came from Shangri La."

Immediately, there was a special war bond drive to raise funds to build a USS Shangri La. It was launched at the Norfolk navy yard on Feb. 24, 1944, and christened the USS Shangri Laby Mrs. Doolittle. The Shangri La took her place with the carrier force in the South Pacific, and she was launching aircraft when the Japanese accepted the unconditional terms of the Allied command on Aug. 16,

In May of 1946, the Shangri La was in Norfolk to load radiocontrolled aircraft and their "mother" planes to take part in Operation Crossroads to test the effects of the atomic bombs at Bikini Atoll. During the next 24 years, the ship was decommissioned several times for major overhaul and modernization including installation of the new heavy duty steam catapults and the canted, or angled, flight deck. The ship took part in the Viet Nam conflict.

Her final decommissioning was in 1971, and in 1988 she was sold for scrap to Taiwanese ship breakers.



> Bags and sheets of moisture-vaporresistant extra heavy aluminum foil, pliofilm or polyethylene-lined papers are suitable for dry-packed vegetables, fruits and meats. Bags can be used for liquid packs, but are less convenient than rigid containers. Plastic bags should have an air-tight seal. Fill bags, leaving enough head space to make a "goose neck" twist. To make the goose neck twist, squeeze air from filled bag, twist top, turn over about half way, and tic with freezer wire or rubber band. Bags and foil sheets are used with or without outer cardboard cartons to protect against tearing. Bags without a protective carton are difficult to

Label containers with the name of the fruit or vegetable and the date frozen. If a food locker is rented, include the locker number on the package.

Loading the Freezer

Freeze fruits and vegetables soon after they are packed. Put them in the freezer a few packages at a time as they become ready, or keep packages in the refrigerator until all are ready. Then transfer them to the home freezer.

Put no more unfrozen food into a freezer than will freeze within 24 hours. Usually this will be about 2 to 3 pounds of food per cubic foot of freezer capacity. Overloading shows that freezes too slowly may lose It is also associated with an increased quality or spoil. For quickest freezing, place packages against freezing plates or coils, leaving a little space between packages so air can circulate freely. After food is completely frozen, arrange in freezer so that food frozen longest will be used first.

women in the United States die of heart attacks and more than 90,000 die of strokes. These statistics are prompting some women to adopt new eating habits.

When preparing meals at home, it is important to choose foods carefully and check labels to make sure the meals you prepare are nutritionally balanced. When dining out, pick a restaurant with a varied menu.

Most food labels list the units per serving of six specific factors: calories, protein, carbohydrates, fat, cholesterol and sodium. Here's a quick overview of each and the effects they have on our health:

Calories. A calorie is a unit of heat energy derived by the body from food. Exercise causes the body to "burn" calories.

Protein. Protein is the basic structural material for all plants and animals. An excellent energy source, protein can be found in such foods as meat, fish, poultry, eggs, milk and cheese.

Carbohydrates. Carbohydrates are made up of multiple units of simple sugars connected to each other. When carbohydrates are eaten, they are ultimately broken down into glucose, a single sugar, which is then converted to energy. Some sources of carbohydrates are vegetables, cereal, rice, bread, pasta, nuts, fruits and grains.

Fat. Fat is a body substance which does not dissolve in water but does dissolve in organic substances. Fat is not all bad; it is a concentrated form of energy. However, eating large amounts of fat can increase the chances of developing cancers of the down the rate of freezing, and food colon, breast, uterus, bone and lung.

> Cholesterol. Cholesterol contributes to the formation of sex hormones, skin oils and digestive juices. Since it is produced naturally by the liver at a rate of one to two grams a day, it is really not necessary to take in any additional cholesterol. Every food that comes from an animal contains some cholesterol. This includes eggs, cheese, meat, milk, poultry and fish. Plants and plant oils do not contain cholesterol.
