Mattox urges panel to include measures on bill WASHINGTON (AP) - Texas Attorney General Jim Mattox urged members of a Senate panel to include measures on birth con-
trol, enforced child support and flexible job training in an upcoming welfare reform bill. The Texas Democrat was one of
several officials from arposs the several officials from across the
country testifying at a Finance committee hearing Thursday on welfare reform chaired by Sen. LLoyd Bentsen, D-Texas. Bentsen said the panel is "look-
ing for ways to help" children and ing for ways to help child ren and
indicated he is committed to making some welfare changes before the 100th Congress adjourns later this year.
"This "This committee is going to
make children its No. 1 objective this year," Bentsen said. Sen. Daniel Patrick Moynihan,
D.N.Y., has introduced a five D-N.Y., has introduced a five-
year, $\$ 2.3$ billion bill that would require states to make greater efforts to establish paternity and to institute automatic wage
withholding when child support orders are issued.
The "Family Security Act" also
would require states to set up education, training and work programs for welfare recipients and
to see that child care is available to see that child care is available "We will never gain such control unless we come to grips with the numbers of unplanned
children or children born to those children or children born to those
who raising them," Mattox said in prepared testimony.
He called for establishment of

O Agriculture grades beef according to
its color, texture and the amount of fat in a cut of meat. Most stores trim xternal fat to ${ }^{1} 4$ inch or less. But it's he marbling, or the internal flecks

Consumers now have three choices of grade: "Prime" has abundant marbling
and the highest grade is frequently served in grade is
restaurants.
"Choice" has slightly less marbing, but is still quite juicy. It's the
grade found most commonly in the grocery store meat case. ""Select" is relatively tender, but some juiciness. It's best suited for moist cooking methods, marinating or tenderizing and stir-fry
