Vice President George Bush
and Senator Al Gore Jr., are and Senator Al Gore Jr., are

most votes for the Republican most Votes for the Republican
and Democratic nominations for President in the March 8 Texas
Primary Elections. rimary Elections.
Both Bush and Gore enjoy 2-10 1 leads over their ncarest rivals, and Republicans' Senator Bob Dole
and Democrats' Gary Hart and Governor Mike Dukakis.
On the other hand, millions
of Texans registered to vote will probably not even go to whe polls during either the Primary or General Election this ycar.
Many voice disillusionment today's campaigns, and the lack of published information about the candidates.

Today's doctor has many tools at hand to find out how a pregnancy is progressing. For instance, if you are over 35, your doctor may offer you
the opportunity to have amniocentesis. This test is given around the 16th week of pregnancy to see if your baby has certain genetic
defects. The procedure is simple, and usually done on an out-patient basis. By using ultrasound to find the exact location of your fetus, the doctor in-
serts a long thin needle into serts a long thin needle into your ab-
domen into the amniotic sac enveloping the fetus. Your doctor will withdraw an ounce or so of fluid then send it to a genetics lab for testing. You will get the test results several
weeks later. Amniocentesis can tell you if your baby has a genetic defect such as Down syndrome, spina bifida, and numerous other genetic dicorders and what your baby's sex
