# Holiday celebration set Sunday evening

**Entertainment, free watermelon, food booths, fireworks display on program**

What could be more American than watermelon, singers on the back of a flatbed and an old-fashioned fireworks display?

Well all these things will be on tap today as Hereford celebrates the United States' 217th birthday today at Veterans Park.

This year's Fourth of July Celebration, sponsored by Deaf Smith County Chamber of Commerce, will get underway at 7 p.m.

Master of ceremonies County Judge Tom Simons will introduce the singers, who are local residents who have volunteered to share their musical talents with the community.

Local and area residents are invited to bring picnic lunches to the park and enjoy the evening, climaxed by a giant fireworks display beginning about 9:30 to 9:45 p.m.

Or, if you prefer, several non-profit groups will be on hand, selling a variety of food items, including Mexican delicacies, soft drinks and snacks.

In addition to the musical entertainment, free watermelon will be provided to everyone in attendance. Anipro Corporation of Hereford is providing the watermelons. Wes Klett, chairman of the July 4th Celebration committee, is chief executive officer of Anipro.

Entrance to the celebration in Veterans Park will be only at the north end of Veterans Park Road. This entry is located on New York Street, near the American Legion building. Victory Drive, also called Rabbit Road, will be blocked off Sunday near the south entrance of Veterans Park.

The City of Hereford and Deaf Smith County are helping fund the celebration, while about half of the expenses will come from private donations. The chamber urges interested citizens to mail their donations to: July 4th Celebration, Box 192, Hereford.

## Clinton announces suspension of U.S. nuclear weapons testing

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Clinton today announced a suspension of nuclear weapons testing and called on the world's other nuclear powers to do the same.

In remarks taped for his weekly radio address, Clinton said the United States would not test its nuclear warheads at least until Oct. 1, 1994 - as long as other nuclear powers don't either.

"If these nations join us in observing this moratorium, we will be in the strongest possible position to negotiate a comprehensive test ban and to discourage other nations from developing their own nuclear arsenals," Clinton said.

Clinton noted that during his election campaign he pledged a "wholehearted commitment" to achieving a ban on nuclear testing worldwide.

He stopped short of saying he would now seek such a ban, although Russian President Boris Yeltsin said Thursday that he had spoken with Clinton by phone and that the president had promised to work with Russia for a Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty.

The issue is expected to come up in Clinton's talks with Yeltsin at next week's economic summit in Tokyo.

An administration official who spoke on condition of anonymity said Clinton was prepared to send envoys to Britain, France, China and Russia to start discussions about negotiations on a test-ban treaty. All five nuclear powers have been observing a testing moratorium since last year.

"If, however, this moratorium is broken by another nation," Clinton warned, "I will direct the Department of Energy to prepare to conduct

additional tests" and seek approval from Congress.

Clinton directed the Energy Department to maintain its capability to conduct nuclear tests, saying that at the same time his administration would find ways to ensure the safety of the nuclear arsenal without actual nuclear detonations once a test ban goes into effect.

That would entail computer simulations and explosions of non-nuclear materials, experts say.

Clinton noted that when Congress imposed a nine-month moratorium on testing last October, it also allowed for 15 nuclear tests to be conducted until a comprehensive ban was achieved.

Clinton said the administration had originally considered conducting more tests until 1996. But "after a thorough review, my administration has determined that the nuclear weapons in the United States arsenal are safe and reliable."

He also said that renewed testing now, after a nine-month suspension, would undercut U.S. efforts to stop the spread of nuclear weapons and would prompt other nuclear powers to resume testing, too.

The president will decide next year whether to extend the moratorium further, depending on the willingness of the world's other four nuclear powers to progress toward a test-ban treaty, according to a Pentagon memo obtained Friday.

Clinton's decision comes after months of fiery debates within the administration among advocates and opponents of testing. Growing opposition to testing from Congress finally tipped the balance.


Testing foes argued that renewed testing would make it hard for the United States to achieve its goal of renewing the worldwide Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty, which comes up for review by its 157 signatories in January 1995.

## 'Little Gus' returns to Texas after 50-year stay in Greece

**Dallis here with daughter, Yiota Malouf**

For more than 50 years, Gus Dallis guarded his American citizenship with the idea that some day he would return to the United States from Greece.

Three weeks ago he did.

Now, he's at the Hereford home of his daughter and her family, Yiota and George Malouf, and marveling each day at changes that have occurred since he left West Texas in 1937.

Dallis first came to the United States in 1920, at the age of 13, arriving at Ellis Island in New York with no English and little understanding of what was about to happen to him.

"They were about to send him back to Greece because he didn't have any papers telling who would be responsible for him," his daughter said.

An uncle in Temple who had agreed to sponsor him finally was contacted and confirmed the arrangement in the nick of time.

Dallis traveled by train to Texas

and lived in Temple, moved to Georgetown with his uncle, Gus Kallas, then to Lubbock.

Since he and his uncle shared the same given name, friends dubbed him "Little Gus" and his uncle "Big Gus."

He learned English in school, studied for and received his U.S. citizenship in 1925 and was graduated from Lubbock High School in 1928.

His uncle was determined that the nephew make the most of his educational opportunities and Dallis enrolled in Texas Technological College.

"I had gone to college two or three years when I went to my uncle and told him I didn't need all that for the cafe business," Dallis recalled.

Big Gus disagreed. The nephew returned to his classes and received his degree in 1932.

"Tech didn't have 800 students and there were only 18,000 people in Lubbock," Dallis said.

In that environment, Dallis got to know quite well some men who in later years would have some impact on their hometowns, the state and the nation.

Some of the names should be familiar to this day. George Mahon, longtime U.S. Congressman from Lubbock. Preston Smith, former governor of Texas. Charles Guy, Lubbock newspaper publisher. Malouf Abraham, Canadian businessman and philanthropist. Bill Collins, Lubbock retail business leader.

Several of the men have died in the years since Dallis returned to Greece but the remaining members of the group will get together this summer to welcome Little Gus back to Texas.

A year after his graduation from Texas Tech, Dallis went to Greece for a visit but stayed only a year. He was in Lubbock again from 1934 until 1937, working in the restaurant business with his uncle.

"We had the Tech Cafe, then had a coffee shop in the old Lubbock Hotel," he said.

When he returned to Greece in 1937, he married and had full intentions of coming back to the U.S. and Texas.

Things didn't work out, though. (See DALLIS, Page 2)

### Poor school districts file appeal with supreme court

AUSTIN (AP) - Property-poor school districts sought to change the new education finance law before school opens by appealing to the Texas Supreme Court Friday for help.

Attorneys for poor districts seek to overrule State District Judge F. Scott McCown of Austin, who denied them a June hearing on the new law.

The measure, which is to go into effect this fall, gives the state's richest school districts several options for sharing some wealth with poorer ones.

The attorneys say the new law has as many problems as the current law, which has been ruled unconstitutional. They are seeking a court hearing to express their opposition and require a new way of distributing state education aid.

"If this plan goes into effect, hundreds of schools are going to have to slice their budgets while the richer schools do just fine," said Buck Wood, who is representing 87 poor districts. "Some school districts are losing 5, 6 and 10 percent of their entire budget."

Wood said he didn't expect any

school districts to close because of the new law, and that support staff would be laid off before teachers. But he said the pain is "significant."

"Under the new bill, poor districts are going to be far behind where they were last year," said Al Kauffman of the Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund, representing a separate group of 13 poor school districts in the suit.

State lawyers defend the law as constitutional and say it should be given a chance to work.

The new law is the latest effort to meet a Texas Supreme Court order to even out funding available to school districts that tax locally at similar rates. Schools rely on state aid, local property taxes and some federal money.

Two previous attempts to meet the court order have been found unconstitutional.

Officials have acknowledged that the Legislature didn't put in enough new state money to cover enrollment growth at current per-student spending levels.

He and his wife started their family and then the terror that was World War II settled over Greece.

"When the Nazis came into Greece, I had to stay out of their way, because I was an American citizen," said Dallis. The German occupation "destroyed everything," he added.

Dallis and his family lived in a village in the Peloponisos and fled into the mountains of the peninsula to escape the occupation forces.

Even as the war ended, another threat arose, this in the form of Communist guerrillas who attempted to gain control of Greece.

Dallis acknowledges that the United States foreign policy of the day probably was responsible for keeping Greece out of the hands of the Communists.

After the war, Dallis worked with United Nations relief and later with the American mission in Greece. His fluency in English and Greek were invaluable to relief workers as well as citizens of the area.

"He became the translator for the entire area," said Yiota Malouf.

The daughter followed in his footsteps when it came time to get her college education -- she came to Lubbock to enroll at Texas Tech and almost immediately met some people who had known her father.

She recalls vividly a conversation with a man who told her he had a good friend at Tech who was from Greece. "We called him Little Gus," the man said.

Both she and the new acquaintance had a good laugh when she told him Little Gus was her father.

She met George Malouf at Tech

and they were married. They tried on more than one occasion to persuade her parents to come to the U.S.

"My mother was in poor health, though, so they never could come, even to visit," she explained.

Last year Mrs. Dallis died. Gently, the Maloufs again campaigned for Dallis to move back to Texas.

"In May, we talked to him and he said, 'I think I'm ready' so I went to Greece immediately," said Mrs. Malouf.

George Malouf said he could hardly believe his ears when his wife called from Greece to tell him when she and Dallis would fly to New York.

"We've waited so long for this," said Malouf.

The Maloufs have made one brief trip to Lubbock for Dallis to see his former hometown. They attended the consecration of St. Andrew's Greek Orthodox Church where John Kallas, the son of Gus Kallas, is president of the congregation.

Over the July 4th holiday, they planned to drive to Houston where Dallis could be re-united with a son and his family. Another daughter still lives in Greece.

Little Gus Dallis is re-adjusting to American life, enjoying the news programs on television and working on a special project, a book of proverbs which he says will be in both Greek and English.

Besides protecting his U.S. citizenship by not voting in Greece, Dallis took care to maintain his English language skills. His oral language is excellent and, his son-in-law said, he could easily teach the language.

"He'll correct all of us," George Malouf laughed.

## Somalis ambush UN troops, kill 3

MOGADISHU, Somalia (AP) - Somali militiamen, repeating tactics they used a month ago with deadly efficiency, ambushed U.N. troops Friday, killing at least three Italian soldiers and wounding 21.

Hospital officials said at least five Somalis were killed and 42 wounded as the U.N. forces counterattacked with tanks and U.S. and Italian helicopter gunships. Four Somalis policemen aiding the U.N. soldiers were also wounded, a military spokesman said.

The attack, the bloodiest against U.N. forces since warlord Mohamed Farrah Aidid's militia killed 24 Pakistani U.N. troops on June 5, shows that a potential quagmire lies in store for U.N. peacekeepers here.

Despite a U.N. assault on Aidid's headquarters on June 17, his supporters have staged nearly daily attacks on U.N. troops, showing an ability to catch the better-armed forces by surprise and drive them from militia areas.

Friday's six-hour firefight took place in an area that contained the city's main gun market and some refugee camps and homes.

It began after Italian troops finished searching a compound that was suspected of being an illegal weapons cache. After leaving the compound about 8 a.m., they were blocked by several makeshift barricades where Somalis began hurling rocks.

"The rocks turned into small-arms fire, and that turned into machine-gun and rocket-propelled grenades," said the U.N. military spokesman, Maj. David Stockwell.

It appeared to be a well-planned ambush by Aidid's supporters, which

mirrored the June 5 attack that began when gunmen ambushed U.N. troops as they were leaving an area after a weapons search.

Snipers perched in nearby buildings kept U.N. troops pinned down Friday, Italian tanks mounted with 90 mm cannons provided ground cover for troops trying to retrieve their dead and wounded.

At one point, two wounded Italians were laid atop a tank and rushed to a military hospital.

Residents of refugee camps caught in the cross-fire gathered their meager belongings and fled as Italian helicopter gunships hovered overhead. Angry Somalis threw rocks at some foreigners' vehicles and forced them away from the area.

American Cobra helicopter gunships were called in about noon and fired 20 mm cannons at crowds of gunmen. The body of one Somali civilian lay on the street, along with several wounded Somalis.

Stockwell said the ambush was a desperate move by a losing force.

But the U.N. envoy, retired Adm. Jonathan Howe, had said he hoped the June 17 reprisal raid against Aidid - launched because of the ambushes against Pakistani troops - would deter further attacks by his followers.

Howe also has said he wants to resume long-hammered humanitarian work and avoid having too much U.N. manpower focused on capturing Aidid, who is wanted for the June 5 attack.

Thirty-four U.N. soldiers have died since June 5, twice the total number killed in combat in the five months before the United States handed control of the operation to the United Nations.

## Focus on Your City

In our last "Focus on Your City," we dealt with why we must do something different about solid waste. This time, we would like to explore the options available and why your City Commission has chosen the option it will use.

First of all, the City has engaged two different solid waste engineering firms at different times to take a look at the problem. From both of these firms has come the same conclusion regarding our final solution.

We are producing anywhere from 25 to 40 tons of solid waste per day based upon a 30-day month, even though we only collect 5 1/2 days per week. The amount varies from season to season depending upon such things as grass clippings, tree limbs, building activity, etc.

The first option, and the one your Commission has voted to go with, is to haul to a high-volume, approved landfill. We are lucky to have the option to haul to either of two landfills which are fairly close--the BF&I landfill at Canyon or the Amarillo landfill. Both have met necessary regulations and would be risk-free for our use.

Engineers have estimated our cost at \$62.64 per ton to haul to the Canyon landfill, using our present equipment with some upgrading. In the future we can probably up-grade our equipment further by using different type trucks to reduce the number of trips per week.

I suppose the best thing about the option is that we have not locked ourselves into any permanent position should the rules of the game change. If the landfills get way out of line in their charges, we can always obtain land here and go back to our own landfill. Perhaps in a few years, common sense will again prevail and we can consider the incineration of our solid waste.

Just to put a bottom line on this column: (1) If we haul our waste to Canyon, the cost is estimated at \$62.64 per ton using our present equipment; (2) To incinerate, a cost of \$65.14 per ton and (3) To build a new landfill near Hereford, the cost is \$72.80 per ton. These are estimates only, but we have to assume that they are fairly close.

In future columns, we will explore what things we, the people of Hereford and Deaf Smith County, can do regarding costs of solid waste disposal.

NAFTA talks planned

## next week in Mexico

MEXICO CITY (AP) - U.S., Canadian and Mexican officials will meet here next week to conclude agreements on jobs and the environment, the last obstacles to turning North America into a huge free trade zone, a Mexican official said.

The high-level talks are to resume despite a U.S. judge's order threatening to delay the treaty on the grounds that before Congress approves it, U.S. laws require a study on the treaty's environmental effect.

Commerce Secretary Jaime Serra Puche on Friday announced the fifth round of talks on the North American Free Trade Agreement would be July 8-10.

He said important progress had been made on the side accords to protect American jobs and the environment that the Clinton administration has demanded as requisite to approving NAFTA. Next week's meeting will be to resolve the remaining differences.

Some American labor leaders fear the treaty will result in U.S. companies moving en masse to Mexico, where wages are much lower.

The three countries hope to secure the free trade zone by Jan. 1, 1994.

The pact would unite 360 million people from the Yukon to the Yucatan into one market. Unlike the 12-nation European Community's union treaty, NAFTA does not involve creating a single currency or political entity.

On Thursday, the U.S. Justice Department announced it would appeal a court decision that could delay the proposed trade pact.

GRADY, N.M. -- For Bootleg resident Jennifer Hammock, leaving home for the first time by herself was a big trip -- all the way to the nation's capital.

Miss Hammock portrayed a floor manager in the mock House.


Finally, the students also heard several special speakers, including Attorney General Janet Reno and Helen Thomas of United Press International, who spoke during the National Press Club breakfast.

### Clinton ratings jump, poll says

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Clinton's approval rating is 46 percent, up from 39 percent a week ago, according to a poll released Friday.

However, 47 percent of those surveyed disapprove of Clinton's overall handling of the presidency, according to a USA Today-CNN-Gallup poll.

The poll also found that 56 percent of respondents approved of Clinton's handling of foreign policy, compared with 44 percent in late May.

The survey came just days after Clinton ordered the bombing of Iraqi intelligence headquarters in retaliation for an alleged assassination plot against former President Bush.

Among other findings in the poll:

- Clinton's approval rating on defense rose from 49 percent in April to 55 percent in the latest survey.
- Only 35 percent of respondents

approve of Clinton's handling of the economy, while 59 percent disapprove.

44 percent support the president's economic plan; 49 percent oppose it.

The nationwide survey of 1,008 adults taken Tuesday had a margin of error of 3 percentage points.



**Here's some more Questions and Answers about flag protocol:**

Q. Can the flag be flown after dark?

A. Customarily the flag is displayed from sunrise to sunset. But if properly illuminated, the flag can be displayed 24 hours a day.

Q. Should the flag be displayed in bad weather?

A. Only if it is made of all-weather material to prevent it from being ripped or torn.

Q. Where should the flag be displayed in front of buildings, on speaker's platforms, churches, auditoriums, parades?

A. On the speaker's right or to the right of any other flags or banners.

Q. Who must authorize the flag to be flown at half staff?

A. There is no prohibition to keep local officials or private citizens from flying the flag at half staff on appropriate occasions at their own opinion. The only time the code prescribes that the flag should be flown at half staff is on Memorial Day until noon.

Q. If the flag touches the ground, or becomes soiled, must it be destroyed?

A. The intent of the code is to prevent the flag from becoming soiled. If otherwise in good condition, it may be cleaned.

Other events, such as parties and barbecues, often involve alcohol consumption. The National Safety Council reminds all Americans to celebrate safely this Independence Day and avoid driving while intoxicated.

It's no secret that fighting drunk driving is an uphill battle. Public service campaigns, media attention and law enforcement have been used to combat it.

But many Americans fail to get the message. They remain unaware that alcohol is a depressant drug which slows reaction time, reduces coordination and impairs vision. They remain unconvinced that calling a cab or arranging for a designated driver are options that could prevent an accident. They don't care that 50 percent of all motor vehicle accidents involve alcohol use.

This letter is not written for those people. It is meant for their potential victims.

Know how to spot a drunk driver. Signs include: driving at excessive or very slow speeds; stopping without apparent cause; swerving or straddling the center lines; turning abruptly; not responding to traffic signals; or, driving at night with the headlights out.

If you see any of these warning signs, react quickly. Maintain a safe following distance. Do not try to pass. If the drier is behind you, turn right at the nearest intersection and let that vehicle pass. If you can, report the location and description of the vehicle, including the license plate number, to your local police station or sheriff's office. In most cases, you will not have to identify yourself.

Remember this holiday weekend, you can be responsible for your actions, but you cannot control "the other guy." Know how to spot a drunk driver so you can protect yourself and the people you love.

The Naval Shipyard at Mare Island, Vallejo, Calif., which will be closed, employs 6,369 civilians and only 181 military personnel. The doomed Naval Shipyard at Charleston, S.C. has 5,771 civilians and 58 military personnel.

June 28

#### The (McAllen) Monitor, on taxes and the federal deficit:

As the U.S. Congress churns through the seemingly endless hours of debate over the federal budget, millions of Americans across the land are trying to figure out how they'll pay the new taxes ...

Sealed off on Capitol Hill, isolated from the people they claim to serve, representatives and senators only can see one thing: More cash will be taken from the productive private sector of the economy to be wasted on the anti-productive special interests that pay for campaigns ...

And some Republicans apparently have not even learned the lesson of former President Bush's defeat. # Spanish lessons help police avoid tragedy

DALLAS (AP) - Sgt. Ruben Padilla tells a story to help explain why the Los Angeles Police Department started giving its officers Spanish lessons 15 years ago:

Two officers trying to stop a Hispanic man on the street noticed something shiny in his waistband. Twice they said in English, "Stop, don't move," but the man just walked toward them. They drew their guns and saw the man reach for the shiny object.

At the last minute, one officer demanded he drop the gun: "Deje! Deje!" The man immediately complied.

What fell to the ground was not a gun - it was a can of beer. And what the officers had on their hands was not a threat but a man who hadn't understood a word they'd said.

"That was a situation where a life was probably saved," said Padilla, the LAPD's Spanish training instructor.

Such life-and-death encounters are occurring around the country as more and more immigrants, particularly from Mexico and Central America, make their way to the United States. Police departments increasingly find themselves struggling to communicate with the people they're trying to serve, protect or arrest.

"There are all kinds of problems associated with that, including shootings," said Hubert Williams, president of the Police Foundation, a national organization that researches law-enforcement issues.

When dealing with immigrants, "we should know about their culture," Williams said. "We should be able to communicate with them like we do other people."

Two recent incidents in Dallas underscore the critical nature of the language barrier.


One has drawn extensive publicity: the killing of Juan Rodriguez by a plainclothes officer driving an unmarked car. Relatives say that Rodriguez spoke virtually no English and probably thought that he was being robbed when the officer identified himself and confronted him in an alley.

Police say the Mexican man was drunk and reaching for a gun in his waistband when officer David Denham shot him three times, including twice in the back. Dallas police are conducting an internal investigation, although they say there is no evidence that the officer violated departmental procedures.

The other case, which passed with little notice, also involved a killing. But instead of trying to apprehend a Spanish speaker, officers were trying to help one - and apparently couldn't.

A Salvadoran woman called police because her sister was being threatened with a gun. By the time officers arrived, Reina Velasquez had been fatally shot - and police could not understand the sister's hysterical Spanish. They had to call for a backup who could; meanwhile, "the suspect was in the process of fleeing" and remains at large, Sgt. Jim Chandler said.

After the Rodriguez killing, which the FBI is investigating, Hispanic leaders charged that not enough basic Spanish is taught to Dallas police officers. Future problems could be avoided if the department steps up training, the leaders said.

"I think it would make a big difference," said Detective Gil Cerdá, president of the Latino Peace Officers Association. "I think because of this tragedy, the police department can see some kind of importance in what we're trying to tell them.

"There are literally thousands of Hispanics out there that don't speak English," he said.

Dallas is about 21 percent Hispanic, according to the 1990 U.S. Census. Nearly 70,000 of those residents speak English poorly, if at all; nearly 23,000 households have no one able to speak the language well.

The Dallas department picked up Los Angeles' training example in 1990 and requires significantly less instruction. Even so, it's doing more than other cities with large Spanish-speaking populations, officials say.

"That was a situation where a life was probably saved," said Padilla, the LAPD's Spanish training instructor.

Such life-and-death encounters are occurring around the country as more and more immigrants, particularly from Mexico and Central America, make their way to the United States. Police departments increasingly find themselves struggling to communicate with the people they're trying to serve, protect or arrest.

"There are all kinds of problems associated with that, including shootings," said Hubert Williams, president of the Police Foundation, a national organization that researches law-enforcement issues.

recalled a few problems involving police and people speaking foreign languages but said they all had been resolved uneventfully.

A backup officer is available "in most of these incidents that occur," he said.

Officer David Magnusson, spokesman for the Miami Police Department, said he knows a few commands in Spanish but still calls for backup when he encounters non-English speakers. In critical situations, those words may not come to mind.

"In a stressful situation, most people are going to resort to their native language," Magnusson said.

That may be what happened to officer Denham in Dallas. He joined the force after Spanish training was instituted, officials said, but spoke only English when he tried to apprehend Rodriguez.

"I don't know if he knew enough to where he could have communicated with the man," said Chandler, a police department spokesman.

Dallas incoming police chief, Ben Click, has signaled concern about continuing education, although he hasn't criticized police handling of the shooting.

Spanish "is like a lot of second languages - it needs to be brushed up on a regular basis," he has said.

Basic skills can help in less serious situations, Padilla said. An officer who can understand or deliver simple phrases can build a more effective relationship with a community of Spanish speakers.

Officer Marcie Geisler, a recent graduate of the Dallas academy, said she has had many opportunities to use commands she picked up during training. The instances have all been routine, she said, primarily during traffic stops, when making arrests or gathering vital statistics.

Her Spanish instruction consisted of vocabulary lessons and mock situations.

"I think it was pretty good training," she said. "I can get the gist of what's going on."

Although she said she couldn't hold a lengthy conversation, she believes that what she learned in

training was sufficient to do the job.

"By the time you get out of there, you've got the basic knowledge," officer Geisler said. "With their broken English and my broken Spanish, we figure out what's going on."

Dallas officer David Andree said that one of the first times he tried out the Spanish he'd learned, the people he approached - a group of men sitting in a car drinking - pretended not to understand English.

Officer Andree said the driver responded with "Que?" when he asked what his name was. But then officer Andree started to use Spanish, much to their surprise.

"They acted to learn the language all of a sudden," he said.

Some cities with majority Hispanic populations don't place heavy emphasis on Spanish training. To a degree, officers said, it's because they

don't have to.

"In our curriculum, the way it stands, we do not have time for language instruction," said Lt. Dan Preston, training director at the El Paso Police Department. "On the positive side for us, I would guess that 75 percent of our officers are Spanish-speaking anyway."

Non-Spanish speaking officers are usually paired with those who can speak the language, Preston said.

Such a setup can be advantageous, especially because some of the city's neighborhoods are practically 99 percent Spanish-speaking, he estimated. Overall, the city is 69 percent Hispanic.

Officer Magnusson of Miami said that 492 of the department's 1,039 officers were of Latin descent. The city is 62 percent Hispanic.

The Miami academy offers Spanish courses and many officers

volunteer to take them, Magnusson said.

In Miami, Spanish-speaking officers are not always assigned to patrol in neighborhoods with predominantly Spanish populations, he said, although it is beneficial when it turns out that way.

Even when an officer speaks only English, Spanish speakers should get the message, the officer said.

The threatening stance of someone pointing a gun "is a universal language," he said, adding that there is no excuse not to comprehend the seriousness of such a situation. "They know by the tone of voice and seeing police there."

It wasn't so clear in Dallas, a witness to the Rodriguez killing has suggested.

"I never once knew that this man was a policeman," Juan Luis Ortiz told The Dallas Morning News after the shooting.

## Research on onions will be showcased in tour at Lubbock

Onion-growers, whether commercial or gardening, will have an opportunity to learn more about their vegetable during an Onion Variety Trial Research and Demonstration Tour to be held Tuesday near Lubbock.

Besides growers, seed company representatives, research specialists from Texas A&M and Texas Tech and faculty of the two universities are expected to attend.

The tour will begin at 9 a.m. at the Texas A&M Research and Extension Center on FM 1294, east of I-27 at the Shallowater exit. The tour will move to the farm of Steve and Patti Jones at 10:30 a.m.

During the tour, participants will be able to evaluate both transplant and direct seed onions.

Tour hosts are Roland Roberts, professor and extension vegetable specialist; David Bender, associate professor, both of Texas A&M, and Stanley Young, Lubbock County extension agent.

Varieties include 12 short-day onion transplants, 22 intermediate onion transplants and 17 long-day direct seeded onions. Four replicates of each variety were planted. The tops of over 30 percent of the onions are down after a recent rainstorm.

"Our onion variety plots are growing well," said Dr. Roberts.

## Pesticides need federal approach

### Academy of Science report raises issues

The chairman of the American Corn Growers Association, Carl L. King of Dimmitt, has called for a federal approach to issues raised in a report from the National Academy of Sciences on the use of pesticides in farming.

King said that chemicals have made a contribution to farming and, "For the majority of farmers, chemicals have had a definite and beneficial role to play in helping guarantee a safe, adequate and nutritious food supply."

The corn producer noted that farmers traditionally have been leaders in protection of the environment and called for a public sensitivity to the challenges farmers face in the use of chemicals.

"We must rely in large part on the guidelines that we have to go by and assume that labels reflect what the Environmental Protection Agency and Department of Agriculture have found to be safe," King added.

"At the same time, we recognize

that it is important to determine optimum inputs of all materials. This will help protect the environment while ensuring the greatest return to the farmer.

"Because of that, we call for a federal approach to complement programs such as we are doing with our innovative Bottom Line Corn Growing Contest, to help determine those optimum inputs."

King added that entrants from throughout the United States have responded to the contest.

"This is an indication that farmers are willing to take the leadership to solve problems associated with excessive use of chemicals," he said.


King noted that if a federal effort were put forth to improve prices, change certain policies of the government such as restrictions on crop rotations, and to ensure a fair market for farmers, the need to use labor-saving chemicals would be reduced.

## Combest questions result of funding bill

WASHINGTON--U.S. Rep. Larry Combest(R-Texas) expressed strong concern this week over passage of a funding bill that could put federal crop insurance out of reach for many farmers.

Combest, as a ranking member of the House Agriculture subcommittee on credit and rural development, opposed the unforeseen effects these proposed revisions.

"This legislation raises questions about the affordability of federal crop

insurance coverage for those farmers in counties who have had large Multi-Peril Crop Insurance claims 70 percent of the time since 1980," said Combest. "My concern is that new farmers with a short history and one big loss would have to pay outrageous premiums to be insured."

Combest added that "we know all too well in West Texas how easy it is to have just one bad year. Our thunderstorms bring welcome rains, but often include destructive hail and floods."

The congressman said the Agriculture Committee has asserted itself against attempted changes made by the Appropriations Committee to agriculture programs. Generally speaking, House procedure prohibits the Appropriations Committee from making changes to programs approved by the full Congress, said Combest.





## Question/ Answer

Q: Will stretching a copper wire across a roof help to control moss the way a copper ridge cap can?

A: Not only is moss on a roof ugly, but it can grow so vigorously that it raises and loosens shingles making the roof vulnerable to water penetration during a driving rain or snow melt.

You can control moss by spraying the roof with chemicals available in nurseries and garden supply stores. If you use these chemicals, follow the

manufacturer's directions because most of them are toxic to humans, corrosive to metals and harmful to plants.

Another way to control moss is to stretch bare copper wires about every 5 feet horizontally along the butts of the shingles. Also stretch a copper wire along the ridge. Rain and snow melt will carry the leachate from the copper wire down the roof.

Copper leachate is corrosive to metal, so protect the inside of steel gutters with gutter paint.



## Courier, Sampras to play all-American final

WIMBLEDON, England (AP) - One men's finalist nearly skipped Wimbledon with a bad shoulder. The other nearly got booted out.

Nevertheless, Pete Sampras and Jim Courier outlasted everyone else, setting up an all-American final Sunday on the Fourth of July. Also at stake will be the No. 1 ranking, which Courier can reclaim with a victory.

Steffi Graf was to face Jana Novotna Saturday in the women's

final. Graf was aiming for her fifth title, while Novotna was playing in her first Wimbledon final.

Although they are the world's top-ranked players, neither Sampras nor Courier was expected to get this far. The top-seeded Sampras was suffering from an inflamed tendon in his right shoulder and considered withdrawing on the eve of the tournament.

"The Wednesday and Thursday before this event started I really had

my doubts about playing here, but I kind of sucked it up and got four or five hours of treatment to give myself the best chance to play here," Sampras said after his 7-6 (7-5), 6-4,

6-4 semifinal win Friday over Boris Becker.

The shoulder acted up at times in earlier matches, but Sampras showed no effects of the injury against Becker. He hit 12 aces and served at an average speed of 113 mph.

"I didn't feel any pain out there today," Sampras said. "I know now I'm going to be fine for Sunday. As things turned out, it's been feeling pretty strong for the most part."

Courier, the No. 3 seed who beat

Stefan Edberg 4-6, 6-4, 6-2, 6-4 in the semifinals, was fortunate to be playing the second week.

During his third-round match last Saturday against Jason Stoltenberg, chair umpire Jeremy Shales was ready to default Courier for what he considered abusive language. Only the intervention of tournament referee Alan Mills kept Courier from being kicked out.

"The umpire thought I said something directed at him, which I didn't, and he reacted to default me, which was to say the least, I think, an overreaction," Courier said. "Luckily Alan came out on the court and straightened things out."

Now, for the first time since John McEnroe beat Jimmy Connors for the title in 1984, two Americans will play in the final.

"I've been watching Wimbledon finals for as long as I can remember," Courier said, "so it's particularly special for me to think that I'm there and I'll be playing another Yank on the Fourth of July. I certainly never expected to do it."

Sampras won the U.S. Open in 1990, while Courier has won the French Open and Australian Open twice each. Both men said they would treasure a Wimbledon title.

## Commissioner's decision forces 'Skins' Marshall to become Oiler

HOUSTON (AP) - The Houston Oilers have another All-Pro on their team and the Washington Redskins aren't even getting a No. 1 draft pick in return.

NFL Commissioner Paul Tagliabue ruled Friday that Wilber Marshall has a valid contract with the Oilers, ending a three-month dispute over the All-Pro linebacker who spent the last five seasons with the Redskins.

Marshall had been designated a franchise player by Washington under terms of the new collective bargaining agreement between the NFL and its players. But when the Redskins could not sign him, they released Marshall from the franchise status,

permitting him to talk with other teams. If he signed, a trade would be arranged.

Marshall was on the verge of a contract with Houston worth a reported \$2.9 million when Oilers owner Bud Adams changed his mind and called off the deal. Tagliabue ruled, however, that the player and the Oilers had reached a binding agreement on June 2.

At the same time, however, Tagliabue said the Oilers had properly called off trade talks with the Redskins when Adams decided to pull out of the deal.

The commissioner said Redskins general manager Charley Casserly

improperly interfered with Houston's efforts to halt negotiations with Marshall by offering him a substantial sum of cash - reportedly \$150,000 - to accept the Oilers' offer.

Because of that interference, Tagliabue reduced the terms of the draft choice compensation due the Redskins for Marshall, awarding Washington the Oilers' third-round draft choice in 1994 and fifth-round pick in 1995 instead of a No. 1 and No. 5 in 1994.

"When an owner of an NFL club (Houston) properly directs his staff to end trade talks and contract negotiations with a player, an official of a second club cannot with impunity force the negotiations to an opposite conclusion, as Mr. Casserly did here by agreeing to make a substantial payment to a player to sign with another club," Tagliabue said in a statement.

## Phillies, Padres complete doubleheader at 4:40 a.m.

The opener was held up a total of 5 hours and 54 minutes by three delays.

In the second game, Mitch Williams (2-3) singled off Trevor Hoffman (2-3) to drive in Pete Incaviglia with the winning run.

Elsewhere in the NL it was San Francisco 3, New York 1 in five innings; Chicago 11, Colorado 8; Florida 4, Atlanta 2; Houston 7, Cardinals 1; and Los Angeles 4, Montreal 3.

### Astros 7, Cardinals 1

Scott Servais hit a three-run homer to highlight a five-run fifth off Joe Magrane (7-7), helping Houston cool off St. Louis at the Astrodome. It was only the Cardinals' second loss in their last nine games.

Mark Portugal (6-3) was the winner, giving up one run and eight hits while striking out eight in seven innings.



Each district winner will also be awarded a \$600 college scholarship and must compete in the state contest in order to receive the district level scholarship. The state winner will be awarded a \$2,000 scholarship and the runner-up will receive a \$1,500 scholarship.

## Health news reported

A 30-year-old treatment for slipped discs, a condition doctors call herniated lumbar intervertebral disc, is receiving new attention from physicians and people with leg pain caused by a herniated or slipped disc.

The treatment, called chemonucleolysis, involves injecting a natural enzyme called chymopapain into the center of the herniated disc. The enzyme, which comes from the latex of the papaya plant, breaks down and partially liquifies the jelly-like material in the inner part of the disc. The disc's ability to absorb

water is greatly reduced and pressure on the nerve root that is causing the pain is relieved.

A number of studies have been done on this treatment and their results show it's as effective as and safer than surgery over the short and long term. In a one-year follow up study published in the international medical journal "Spine," patients who received the chemonucleolysis treatment had an overall success rate of 66 percent while those who had a procedure called automated percutaneous lumbar discectomy had a success rate of only 37 percent.

Chemonucleolysis treatment of sciatica has also been shown to be cost effective in the short term and most importantly in the long term as it does not contribute to "failed back surgery syndrome."

A toll-free number has been set up by the International Intradiscal Therapy Society for patients and physicians who want to learn more about chemonucleolysis and about who are the most likely candidates for this treatment. For additional information, call 1-800-426-4868.

I also hope that you all have a safe holiday. Playing with fire can be very dangerous, so be sure to have a bucket of water handy or a fire extinguisher in case of an emergency.

If you did not have time to come by the library before the holidays, on Tuesday there will be a few new titles ready. **Tell Me No Secrets** by Joy Fielding, the author of **See Jane Run**, is a book you do not want to miss reading. Jess Kostner is the young, no-nonsense district attorney who can hold her own against Chicago's toughest. She has survived a wrenching divorce, and must now contend with an ex-husband that has a disconcerting way of popping up in the most unexpected places. Jess's mother has also disappeared in a most bizarre way and Jess still has trouble with an occasional panic attack. On top of it all there is a married colleague who continually makes aggressive passes towards her; a brother-in-law who has a strange, creepy hold over her sister; a handsome stranger that has just entered her life; and then there is Rick Ferguson, the thuggish rapist. Jess is convinced that Rick brutally attacked Connie De Vuono, but the evidence is shaky. Connie is convinced that Rick will find a way to kill her if she testifies against him. Then Connie disappears and Jess has a nagging feeling that the malevolent eyes of a stalker are upon her. Maybe it is just nerves, and Jess Always gets jittery right before a big trial. Is there anyone she can trust?

For those of you who liked **Green City in the Sun** and **The Dreaming** by Barbara Wood, you will really enjoy her new book entitled **Virgins of Paradise** available this week. The story takes the reader back in time to the aristocratic Egyptian family in postwar Cairo. A time where women still wear the veil and live in harems.

Under the watchful of their grandmother and the other prominent women in the Rasheed family, Camelia and Jasmine begin to mature into lovely young women. Cairo is changing and Camelia and Jasmine take advantage of the opportunity to break away from tradition and embark on a new and often turbulent life. Jasmine journeys to America to become a doctor after being cast out of the family. Camelia becomes one of the foremost dancers in the Middle East. Camelia and Jasmine must find a new identity as they merge into the modern era, while they fight the magic, mythology and superstition of an ancient nation.

**Robin And The King** by Parker Godwin takes the story of Robin Hood on into his later life and exploits as defender of the English people. Robin becomes a friend to Rossel, the King's son, but, must continually be on guard for the dangerous enmy of Ranulf of Bayeux. William of Normandy, who had conquered the Anglo-Saxon people year's before, is on the throne and Robin finds himself committed to freeing his fellow countrymen from the absolute rule of any king. But that crusade must come second when an enemy from France threatens to destroy William's entire kingdom by putting England's way of life to an end. This foreign threat sets in motion a fierce conflict that is fought by all loyal Englishmen. Even Marian finds herself defending their home, emerging as a powerful ally united with Robin in an effort to save their people.

**Patricia D. Cornwell's Cruel and Unusual** is another baffling case for Dr. Kay Scarpetta. Convicted murderer Ronnie Joe Waddell is executed by electrocution at 11:05 p.m. in the Commonwealth of Virginia. As Virginia's chief medical examiner, Dr. Kay Scarpetta Watches the clock waiting to perform the autopsy on the executed murderer. On that same December night, three hours after the execution 13 year old Eddie Heath's grotesquely wounded body is found propped against a dumpster. Richmond Police Lieutenant Pete Marino and Dr.

Scarpetta are shocked to find the boy's body arranged in the same position in which Waddell used for his victim. The clues: old blood stain, fragments of feather and fingerprints found at the scene point to Waddell, the one who could not have committed the murder. The book, written in 1963, contains a handwritten inscription, "To Rosa Parks for all that you have done for your fellow Negroes and for all America, Martin Luther King Jr."

Parks' refusal in 1955 to give up her bus seat to a white man sparked the Montgomery, Ala., bus boycott, a pivotal event in the civil rights movement.

## Encourage kids to be curious

The hustle and bustle of our neighborhood is predictable from day to day.

-First, pick a theme together. Are your kids intrigued with life under the sea? Make July and August marine life months.

Schwarzkopf was hit in the face and chest when one exploded.

## Knowledge is power in war against allergies

Sneezing, runny nose, nasal and sinus congestion and itchy, watery eyes. If you suffer from these allergy symptoms, you're not alone. 3. One of the most common causes of allergies within the home is a microscopic insect that lives in carpets, bedding and upholstery.

TRUE. The typical home contains millions of dust mites, which feed off flakes of dead skin and food debris. To keep dust mites off mattress, box springs and pillows, zip them in allergen-proof plastic encasements.

4. To help keep the air in your home free of dust and pollen, you should vacuum upholstered furniture frequently.

TRUE. Also, to minimize allergens within the home, dust with a damp rather than a dry cloth, wash bedding and blankets regularly on the "hot" cycle and rent a high efficiency particulate air (HEPA) filter, available from medical supply stores.

ATLANTA (AP) - Coretta Scott King says the policy banning homosexuals from the military is similar to the one that once kept blacks segregated in the armed forces.

TRUE. Pollen clinging to hair after a day outdoors can rub off on your pillow, triggering allergy symptoms as you sleep.

# Early immunization can save kids' lives

Contagious childhood diseases can be crippling, even deadly. Yet, according to studies by the Centers for Disease Control, in some urban neighborhoods less than half the children under two years old are fully immunized polio, diphtheria, measles, mumps and several other vaccine-preventable diseases.

Infant immunization is so important that some public health agencies offer free shots. But, even when these vital vaccines are provided at no cost, many parents still don't take advantage of this service. Some may lack convenient transportation, and many don't want to take time off from work.

But, most of all, experts say, more public education is needed.

"Many parents don't realize how important proper immunization is for small children," says William L. Lieber, president of Kiwanis International. "And most parents simply don't know what shots their children need, and when."

To help solve this problem, Kiwanis clubs have launched a major,

multimedia public education program. The Kiwanis campaign is built around the slogan, "All Their Shots, While They're Tots," to emphasize the point that children should be fully immunized by age two.

The Kiwanis campaign includes billboards and posters, radio and television spot announcements, and public service ads in magazines and newspapers. In addition, payroll inserts and postage meter imprints can be provided to businesses, and a 14-minute videotape is available for viewing in physician and clinic waiting rooms.

Children should be immunized for nine vaccine-preventable diseases before age two. At birth and one month, children should be immunized for hepatitis B. At two months and four months, immunizations are needed for diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (DTP), polio, and haemophilus influenzae.

At six months boosters for DTP, hepatitis B, and haemophilus influenzae are needed. Finally, at 15 months children should be immunized for measles, mumps and rubella (MMR), and get boosters for DTP, polio and haemophilus influenzae.

Kiwanis is one of the world's leading service clubs. Kiwanis clubs are dedicated to fellowship and community improvement through voluntary service projects. There are almost 9,000 Kiwanis clubs with 330,000 members in 80 nations.

The immunization campaign is just one part of a major Kiwanis service program called "Young Children: Priority One." The program encourages local Kiwanis clubs to create projects to meet the needs of children from prenatal development to age five.

## Talk to your children before taking trips

**OKLAHOMA CITY (AP)** - How many times on a long car trip do parents hear these words: "Are we there yet?" Probably more times than they care to count!

Young children have little concept of time and space, says Wanda Draper, a child development specialist at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. So parents should respond in terms that children can understand.

"We'll be there when we stop and sleep two more times," is a good response, Draper said. Or parents can say, "after some snacks and some play, it won't be too long until we reach our destination."

Older children, ages 7 to 13, can be asked to chart out how long it will take to get to the next major town. "This way, you are allowing them to use their minds, which tends to quiet down their bodies, which are very confined by the car," she said.

## Set a healthier table

There's good news for many Americans concerned about their diets.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration and the U.S. Department of Agriculture are requiring more reliable and more useful nutrition information on food packages. Almost all foods will have to carry nutrition information that will help with today's health concerns. Titled "Nutrition Facts," it will usually be found on the back or side of the package.

Many new labels will also carry "shorthand" nutrition information that will usually show up on the front of the package. For example, definitions of words such as "light" and "low fat" are now set by the government so they mean the same thing for every product on which they appear.

Most health experts agree that what we eat can raise--or lower--our risk of certain diseases. For example, a diet low in fat can help reduce the risk of getting certain kinds of cancer.

To help consumers apply these scientific findings to their own diets, claims linking a nutrient or food to the risk of a disease or health-related condition will be allowed under certain circumstances on FDA-regulated products. Seven such claims will be allowed:

1. Calcium and a lower risk of osteoporosis;

2. Fat and a greater risk of cancer;

3. Saturated fat and cholesterol and a greater risk of coronary heart disease;

4. Fiber-containing grain products, fruits and vegetables and a reduced risk of cancer;

5. Fruits, vegetables and grain products that contain fiber, particularly soluble fiber, and a reduced risk of coronary heart disease;

6. Sodium and a greater risk of high blood pressure;

7. Fruits and vegetables and a reduced risk of cancer.

## - YOUR EYES -

### GLAUCOMA

Glaucoma is a sneaky disease. In its early stages it rarely causes any pain or noticeable symptoms. There may be a decrease in side or peripheral vision, but most often it comes on so gradually that the patient is unaware of the changes. Yet it can and does cause blindness.

That's why it's so important to have your eyes tested regularly by your optometrist.

In glaucoma, pressure builds up within the eye because of the overproduction of certain natural fluids or, more often, because the fluids are not draining properly. This condition is not related to high blood pressure -- except that, like high blood pressure, it can be controlled to avoid damage to the eye. Early detection and prompt treatment are vital.

In a fast and painless test, your optometrist measures the pressure within the eye. The tonometer test is usually standard procedure in the regular eye examinations of those over 35.

**DEAR ANN LANDERS:** You were right when you said it was depressing that so many family members don't get along. It is especially true around holidays such as Thanksgiving and Christmas.

It is difficult for me to understand how children and parents can toss each other away like so much garbage. My mother-in-law's two sisters do not speak to one another because of a fight that happened so long ago no one remembers what it was about. A good friend of mine doesn't speak to two members of her family because of a family loan.

I am grateful for the small family I have. My parents were Holocaust survivors whose family members died in the gas chambers. My sister and I grew up without aunts, uncles or cousins and with only one grandparent. We created a family out of our parents' immigrant friends and their children.

My parents did not have the advantage of a "normal" childhood. They spent their teen years witnessing the worst atrocities that humans can inflict on one another. When they came to the United States in 1948, no one offered them counseling to help them heal, so they made some mistakes raising my sister and me.

I hope your readers who are still bitter about their parents will consider for a moment how their parents were raised. Maybe they had difficult life experiences and did the best they could under those circumstances.

More important, what are those readers doing to heal themselves and break a generational cycle of family dysfunction? Are your readers doing the best THEY can? --Deborah in Boca Raton

**DEAR DEBORAH:** Thank you for a compassionate letter that could open some eyes and heal some wounds.

We are all molded by how we were treated in our early years, but it never ceases to amaze me how some people who had extremely rough handling turn out to be sweet and gentle. I know such people and admire them greatly.

**DEAR ANN LANDERS:** I recently read your column about divorce being too easy to get. I believe that is a mistake. The real problem is that it is too easy to get married.

There are places where people can get married the same day they take their blood tests. I have heard that some states don't even require a blood test. When people are in a hurry, they go across the state line so they don't have to wait.

Why do they do this? Because they are afraid if they don't get married at once, the fish will get away. Well, I have news for them. If love is here to stay, it will be here today, tomorrow, next week, next month or even next year.

## Create a child's secret garden

It's not too late to start an outdoor gardening activity with your younger kids.

The key to creating interest with budding gardeners is to keep the project simple and small enough to maintain, using fast-growing seeds and plants.

Here are some ideas to get your child started on his or her own secret garden:

-Pick a small container.

Find a planter box, an old wheelbarrow or even an old wagon and poke holes in the bottom. Kids will enjoy planting and tending their own kid-size mini plot.

-Plan the garden.

Let your youngster be a landscape architect. Cut out a piece of white tissue paper the length and width of the planting container. Figure out where you will plant seeds and seedlings. Using a black marker, help your child write the words (or draw a picture of the flower or vegetable) on the portion of the plan where you want them to grow. Then indicate with an "X" the exact spot you want to plant the seeds and seedlings.

-Plant.

Set the gardening plan over the soil in the plant container. Mist it lightly with water to hold it in place. With a pencil, poke holes in the soil through the tissue at each "X" where you wish to plant seeds and seedlings. And drop in the seeds and plants. Mark each row or section with a labeled popsicle stick.

When the garden is planted, carefully remove and discard the tissue paper plan.

Help your child get in the habit of watering the garden frequently. Look for budding sprouts that will appear in a week or two. Happy harvest!

## Ask Dr. Lamb

**DEAR DR. LAMB:** I read your column about gout. I had a blood test recently which showed that I have arthritic gout. I have swelling and pain, especially in my right ankle. The doctor prescribed allopurinol, which I take every morning. So far, I feel no relief. I, too, would like a list of foods good for me and those I should not eat. I do not smoke and never use alcoholic beverages. Which vegetables are high in purines? We enjoy fresh asparagus. We eat a lot of beef. What is that harmful? I like good meat!

**DEAR READER:** There are several forms of gout. The acute painful attacks are managed somewhat differently from the chronic form of gouty arthritis. That is caused by the slow deposition of uric acid products (sodium urate). These deposits can cause serious deformity of the joints. Allopurinol (Zyloprim) is used to prevent acute attacks but not to treat them once they occur. It also is used to treat chronic gouty arthritis.

You cannot expect an immediate result from allopurinol. In patients with gouty arthritis, the uric-acid level may not even fall initially because the urate deposits are being mobilized and keep the blood level high. At the beginning of allopurinol treatment, it is often advisable to take colchicine with it to prevent acute attacks or pain.

I am sending you Special Report 86, Gout: The Disease of Kings, which will provide the dietary information you need as well as information on the management of gout. As you will see from that report, vegetables are not high in purines, but the following contain moderate amounts of purines and should be used moderately if at all: peas (mature), lentils, mature bean seeds, cauliflower, spinach, eggplant, mushrooms and, regrettably, asparagus. But that still leaves a host of vegetables that you can use. Uric acid is made from purines.

Red meats are on the list of foods that contain a moderate amount of purines, so you should not use more than one serving of these a day.

**DEAR DR. LAMB:** My cousin went through a CT scan and several X-rays. He was diagnosed as having a tumor on his left kidney and he has polycystic kidney disease. Can you explain this disease to me, because I have never heard of it? What treatment is involved and is it curable? We are very concerned because his doctor isn't doing anything at present for his condition.

**DEAR READER:** A simple cyst of the kidney is common and does not require treatment. As many as half of the population over age 50 have such a cyst.

When there are multiple cysts, it is called polycystic kidney disease. This condition may cause back and flank pain and blood in the urine, or it may be painless. It is an inherited disease. The kidneys are enlarged from the cysts. In the adult form, treatment is really to prevent any complications that might occur, including avoiding any instrumentation that might cause a kidney infection and treating high blood pressure should it occur. Should the kidneys fail, which often never happens, then a person becomes a candidate for a renal transplant or dialysis.

Your letter is not clear whether your cousin has both a tumor of the kidney and polycystic kidney disease or just the latter. If there is a tumor, not just a cyst as well, then that is an entirely different matter.

Cut firewood in spring or early summer. This will allow it to dry properly and burn more easily next fall.



## Fox's 'Front Page' braces for inevitable changes

Two weeks before the projected launch of Fox Broadcasting Company's news magazine "Front Page," executive producer David Corvo already knows what his new show is going to need more than anything else: time.

"All of these (news magazine) programs need time to grow," he says by phone from his Los Angeles office. "They launch, then you have to make adjustments."

Corvo should know. He supervised the CBS news magazines "60 Minutes," "48 Hours" and "Street Stories" before joining Fox last year.

"Front Page," which aired its first edition on Saturday, June 26, will keep things fluid and experimental during its first weeks, he said.

"It's a news magazine that I think will be recognizable to viewers who enjoy that kind of program on other networks, but it will have, I hope, the Fox spin to it," Corvo explained. "One of the differences is that it will be slightly younger in its approach, in its look and in some of the story selections ... most important, in its attitude."

Each hourlong program examines three main stories, he added, with "video essays" interspersed: "We will develop a regular group of these (filler items) as we grow, but in the beginning we're going to rotate a lot of ideas through and see which ones work and which ones don't."

Correspondents for the show are Ron Reagan, Andria Hall, Tony Harris, Josh Mankiewicz and Vicki Liviakis. Reagan, the best-known on the team, was host of a short-lived but well-received talk show last season that, in addition to reports for "Good Morning,

America," earned him his spot on "Front Page."

"I thought he was terrific," Corvo says of Reagan's talk show. "It was a serious, issue-oriented program, and I thought he handled a lot of issues very well. These long pieces on magazine shows are interview-driven, and I know that's one thing Ron has demonstrated his skill at, in a slightly differ-

ent format. That skill should be translatable to our show."

While acknowledging that Saturdays traditionally have not been a great night for news programs, Corvo is quick to add, "but it's a great night for Fox. Fox has won the night for the past couple of weeks, and it usually comes in either first or second for the night. Our lead-in, 'Cops,' is one of Fox's most successful programs, and there should be some affinity between audiences for that show and ours."

"I'm in the thick of my first assignment now," says Liviakis, who comes



## Food cable channels are coming to a television near you

LOS ANGELES (AP) - The buzzwords in the cable TV industry today are as futuristic as "interactivity" and "information superhighway." They're also as traditional as shopping, food and romance.

While waxing lyrical about the dazzling potential of hundreds of channels and services like movies on demand, networks and suppliers are trusting that the tried-and-true can mesh with the new world.

Avid consumers will be glad to know that cable TV has yet to achieve its full home-shopping potential. That's according to exhibitors at the recent National Cable Television Association convention.

Today, America; tomorrow, the world: QVC Network Inc., the U.S. television shopping service, and British Sky Broadcasting, a European pay-TV service, are planning a TV shopping service for Europe come fall.

On the domestic side, the joy of shopping is also coming to - of all places - the New Inspirational Network.

The 2-year-old network reaches 7.1 million homes and bills itself as a cross-denominational effort to bring religious, family-oriented programming to television. Now, home shopping will join the mix.

Testing on the daytime shopping service may begin as early as August, says network President David Cerullo.

"It won't be a straight offering of products," Cerullo said. "There will be a weaving in of inspirational thought and talk."

The changing cable world - with its predicted 500-channel, digital compression superhighway, and with new federal regulation - makes such profitable services especially valuable, he says.

"Cable systems and networks are trying to determine who is going to survive in this changing environment, and how they can develop new revenue streams," he says.

Coming interactive TV technology, which will allow viewers to order items directly through their TV set, will give increased importance to home shopping, Cerullo says.

Industry analyst Larry Gerbrandt,

with Paul Kagen Associates Inc., says electronic retailing is widely expected to be a key source of revenue in the interactive age.

"We see a lot of the players beginning to stake claims to the new territory," Gerbrandt says. He noted that, without interactive technology, home shopping has evolved into a \$2.5 billion business.

Cable TV is also nibbling on another lucrative area: food. The TV Food Network is being launched later this year, offering a menu of food news, cooking shows and cookbook reviews.

"You say food channel and people say, 'What?' But then it's, 'Gee, why didn't people think of this earlier?'" says Reese Schonfeld, president of the Food Network.

"The reason is that television is a male-dominated industry," he says. Experts predict up to 70 percent of the network's audience will be women - making it attractive to advertisers, Schonfeld says.

Programs will include "Food in a Flash," "Eating Light" and "Robin Leach: Talking Food," which will feature Leach, a

chef-sidekick and celebrity guests.

"It will be Larry King with a kitchen," Schonfeld says. "If Robin brings Henry Kissinger in, and he has a potato dumplings recipe, we'll eat his recipe and talk foreign policy."

The service is being offered free to cable operators if they sign up before its November debut and offer it to viewers as part of the basic cable program package.

The Food Network will reach 2.5 million homes the first year. That figure is expected to grow to a projected 18 million to 20 million homes within three years, Schonfeld says.

Advertising eventually is expected to help the network turn a profit.

And finally, will the high-tech TV world still have room for love? A new network, Romance Classics, is betting yes.

Romance Classics will feature classic and contemporary film and TV programs with romantic themes. It is part of Rainbow Programming Holdings Inc., which also includes American Movie Classics.

to Fox after serving this past year as weekday co-anchor and reporter for "The 10 O'Clock News" at KCOP-TV in Los Angeles. "It's an investigative piece on a scam, and it's got all the elements: sex, drugs, rock 'n' roll. It's very current and 'sexy.' I'm not trying to be coy, but this story is just so hot right now that other people are starting to sniff around and, obviously, I don't want anyone to report it before we do."

Like Corvo, she thinks the "younger demographic" of "Front Page" will help distinguish it from other news magazines.

"There will be stories of universal appeal, but we're targeting an audience from 25 to 49. All of the correspondents are in their 30s, but we tend to think of ourselves as still young," she says, laughing.

## Dukakis heads cast of PBS' 'Tales'; Disney presents 'Barcelona '92'

Next spring, look for PBS' six-hour miniseries version of Armistead Maupin's novel "Tales of the City," starring Oscar winner Olympia Dukakis. Donald Moffat and Laura Linney. Maupin, who was also the subject of a recent public television documentary, began his "Tales" as a series of columns in the San Francisco Chronicle in the 1970s.





## Fox's 'Front Page' braces for inevitable changes

Two weeks before the projected launch of Fox Broadcasting Company's news magazine "Front Page," executive producer David Corvo already knows what his new show is going to need more than anything else: time.

"All of these (news magazine) programs need time to grow," he says by phone from his Los Angeles office. "They launch, then you have to make adjustments."

Corvo should know. He supervised the CBS news magazines "60 Minutes," "48 Hours" and "Street Stories" before joining Fox last year.

"Front Page," which aired its first edition on Saturday, June 26, will keep things fluid and experimental during its first weeks, he said.

"It's a news magazine that I think will be recognizable to viewers who enjoy that kind of program on other networks, but it will have, I hope, the Fox spin to it," Corvo explained. "One of the differences is that it will be slightly younger in its approach, in its look and in some of the story selections ... most important, in its attitude."

Each hourlong program examines three main stories, he added, with "video essays" interspersed: "We will develop a regular group of these (filler items) as we grow, but in the beginning we're going to rotate a lot of ideas through and see which ones work and which ones don't."

Correspondents for the show are Ron Reagan, Andria Hall, Tony Harris, Josh Mankiewicz and Vicki Liviakis. Reagan, the best-known on the team, was host of a short-lived but well-received talk show last season that, in addition to reports for "Good Morning,

America," earned him his spot on "Front Page."

"I thought he was terrific," Corvo says of Reagan's talk show. "It was a serious, issue-oriented program, and I thought he handled a lot of issues very well. These long pieces on magazine shows are interview-driven, and I know that's one thing Ron has demonstrated his skill at, in a slightly differ-

ent format. That skill should be translatable to our show."

While acknowledging that Saturdays traditionally have not been a great night for news programs, Corvo is quick to add, "but it's a great night for Fox. Fox has won the night for the past couple of weeks, and it usually comes in either first or second for the night. Our lead-in, 'Cops,' is one of Fox's most successful programs, and there should be some affinity between audiences for that show and ours."

"I'm in the thick of my first assignment now," says Liviakis, who comes



**Food cable channels are coming to a television near you**

LOS ANGELES (AP) - The buzzwords in the cable TV industry today are as futuristic as "interactivity" and "information superhighway." They're also as traditional as shopping, food and romance.

While waxing lyrical about the dazzling potential of hundreds of channels and services like movies on demand, networks and suppliers are trusting that the tried-and-true can mesh with the new world.

Avid consumers will be glad to know that cable TV has yet to achieve its full home-shopping potential. That's according to exhibitors at the recent National Cable Television Association convention.

Today, America; tomorrow, the world: QVC Network Inc., the U.S. television shopping service, and British Sky Broadcasting, a European pay-TV service, are planning a TV shopping service for Europe come fall.

On the domestic side, the joy of shopping is also coming to - of all places - the New Inspirational Network.

The 2-year-old network reaches 7.1 million homes and bills itself as a cross-denominational effort to bring religious, family-oriented programming to television. Now, home shopping will join the mix.

Testing on the daytime shopping service may begin as early as August, says network President David Cerullo.

"It won't be a straight offering of products," Cerullo said. "There will be a weaving in of inspirational thought and talk."

The changing cable world - with its predicted 500-channel, digital compression superhighway, and with new federal regulation - makes such profitable services especially valuable, he says.

Cable systems and networks are trying to determine who is going to survive in this changing environment, and how they can develop new revenue streams," he says.

Coming interactive TV technology, which will allow viewers to order items directly through their TV set, will give increased importance to home shopping, Cerullo says.

Industry analyst Larry Gerbrandt,

with Paul Kagen Associates Inc., says electronic retailing is widely expected to be a key source of revenue in the interactive age.

"We see a lot of the players beginning to stake claims to the new territory," Gerbrandt says. He noted that, without interactive technology, home shopping has evolved into a \$2.5 billion business.

Cable TV is also nibbling on another lucrative area: food. The TV Food Network is being launched later this year, offering a menu of food news, cooking shows and cookbook reviews.

"You say food channel and people say, 'What?' But then it's, 'Gee, why didn't people think of this earlier?'" says Reese Schonfeld, president of the Food Network.

"The reason is that television is a male-dominated industry," he says. Experts predict up to 70 percent of the network's audience will be women - making it attractive to advertisers, Schonfeld says.

Programs will include "Food in a Flash," "Eating Light" and "Robin Leach: Talking Food," which will feature Leach, a

chef-sidekick and celebrity guests.

"It will be Larry King with a kitchen," Schonfeld says. "If Robin brings Henry Kissinger in, and he has a potato dumplings recipe, we'll eat his recipe and talk foreign policy."

The service is being offered free to cable operators if they sign up before its November debut and offer it to viewers as part of the basic cable program package.

The Food Network will reach 2.5 million homes the first year. That figure is expected to grow to a projected 18 million to 20 million homes within three years, Schonfeld says.

Advertising eventually is expected to help the network turn a profit.

And finally, will the high-tech TV world still have room for love? A new network, Romance Classics, is betting yes.

Romance Classics will feature classic and contemporary film and TV programs with romantic themes. It is part of Rainbow Programming Holdings Inc., which also includes American Movie Classics.

to Fox after serving this past year as weekday co-anchor and reporter for "The 10 O'Clock News" at KCOP-TV in Los Angeles. "It's an investigative piece on a scam, and it's got all the elements: sex, drugs, rock 'n' roll. It's very current and 'sexy.' I'm not trying to be coy, but this story is just so hot right now that other people are starting to sniff around and, obviously, I don't want anyone to report it before we do."

Like Corvo, she thinks the "younger demographic" of "Front Page" will help distinguish it from other news magazines.

"There will be stories of universal appeal, but we're targeting an audience from 25 to 49. All of the correspondents are in their 30s, but we tend to think of ourselves as still young," she says, laughing.

## Dukakis heads cast of PBS' 'Tales'; Disney presents 'Barcelona '92'

Next spring, look for PBS' six-hour miniseries version of Armistead Maupin's novel "Tales of the City," starring Oscar winner Olympia Dukakis, Donald Moffat and Laura Linney. Maupin, who was also the subject of a recent public television documentary, began his "Tales" as a series of columns in the San Francisco Chronicle in the 1970s.

Also on PBS, look for an encore of all 39 episodes of NBC's critically acclaimed series "I'll Fly Away," as well as a new two-hour finale featuring regulars Sam Waterston, Kathryn Harrold and Regina Taylor. Actress and model Iman has joined the cast of TNT's "Heart of Darkness," currently filming in Belize. 


