The limited number of reverse mor-
tgages are to be available through
banks and other lenders by next

The mortgage principal, interest

when the house is sold or when a bor-
rower dies, just as a conventional
mortgage would have to be settled
before heirs could take possesssion of
a property.
"It will be possible for the elderly
to take out a reverse mortgage
without putting out a penny," said

OK? Is there cholesterol in cocoa? consider your total fat and saturated fat intake, not just the cholesterol content. So you really should avoid
frying food with any oil or fat. When you must use fat, use corn oil or
saffower oil and avoid the oils that contain lots of saturated fat. It is true hat vegetables and cereals do not
