students -25 percent of the boys and 42 percent of the girls - reported that they had thought seriously about
ending their lives, and 15 percent had gone so far as to attempt potentially fatal injuries, the national Centers for Disease Control reported Thursday.
Dr. Lloyd Kolbe, director of the Dr. Lloyd Kolbe, director of the
school Health, said the suicide figures na
were suprorising. "We justd didn't think sta
