## Flag burning

wo agencies of the government saying it's illegal to burn trash in the backyard but legal to burn the U.S. flag in the front!
According to the latest Supreme Court ruling(by a narrow $5-4$ vote), desecration of Old Glory is "symbolic speech"
and protected under the first amendment's freedom of and protected under the first amendment's freedom of
speech. This ruling came despite the fact that the federal government and every state except Alaska and Wyoming have laws against flag-burning.
The Environmental Protection Agency outlaws burning of trash in your backyard, garbage in a landfill, or B.S. in a
creek, but the burning of the flag is now protected under the First Amendment.
The U.S. government prints a lengthy official manual detailing how to treat the American flag. It gives specific
instructions on how to show it, drape it, troop it, post it, fold instructions on how to show it, drape it, troop it, post it, fold it, salute it, fly it, hold it, respect it, revere it, and how to
come home dead beneath it. The flag is more than a come home dead beneath it. The flag is more than a
symbol. Justice Blackmun once wrote that "The flag is a symbol. Justice Blackmun once wrote that "The flag is a
national property and the nation may regulate those who would make, imitate, sell, possess or use it."
Objections to a constitutional amendment prohibiting desecration of the flag are based on the belief it would open the door to a lot of other restrictions upon American freedoms. We fail to see how such a narrow and specific amendment would endanger our right to free speech.
A liberal majority on the Supreme Court and a Congress that listens to the protests of the tiniest group of minorities has resulted in the nation ignoring the wishes of the majority of American people.
Portecting the voice of dissent is important, but dissent
should not include the desecration of our flag should not include the desecration of our flag.

## Politics, pay hikes

MEARS AP Special Correspondent WASHINGTON (AP) - Thomas Foley knows a political trap when he sees one - he didn't become speaker of the House by walking into them. of he House by walking int them. So there will be no new pay raise debate in the Democrat-controlled debate in the Democrat-controlled House unless and until Republicans sign on enthusiastically, and declare he issue off limits politically. endorsement of govemment pay raises from President Bush; he says the administration will have to be solidly and actively behind the measure. And he says that endorsement is going to, have io be binding on the Republicans' he says to be binding on the Republicans' national political committees as well national political co as "The white house. to be absolute For good measure, the speaker said there will have to be solid support in the Democratic Senate, too, before the House takes on the issue of congressional pay again. In the past, the Senate sometimes has had a free political ride on the issue, voting against pay raises while anticipating House action - or inaction - that would put them into effect. It didn't work this year. The House did vote, spurred by public protests against a 51 percent pay raise that was due to take effect Feb, 8 and rejected due to take effect Feb. 8, and rejected top executive branch officials and for federal judges also were scrapped. So congressional salaries stayed at $\$ 89,500$ a year, with senators and at $\$ 89,500$ a year, with senators and representatives still entitled to supplement them with the widely criticized practice of accepting spechmaking and similar fees. speechmaking and similar fees. Judicial and exectutive pay stayed put, coo, since the 22 -year-old pay rais system was based on a package deal That provides the hook in the terms Foley set for action on a federal pay raise. While the speaker said he personally opposes tying judicial and congressional pay, a House majority would not vote to pry them apart. Bush has proposed pay raises of up to 25 parcent for judges and top ecomme its honoraria, cutting the ceilings by 50 percent on Jan. 1, 1990, and banning those payments entirely a year later. That is supposed to be be done in tandem with a congressional pay raise. Bush did not specifically propose one, but said he would work with Congress toward that end. administration commitment Foley

remember that the patch on a gutter should always be on the inside, not on ut the downspout is clogged, it sometimes can be cleared by pouring

as much pressure as possible. If this oesn't work, attach something like automobile chains to a length of rope

Today's trend in housing design features hardwood floors and
entrances. Hardwood floors can be special asset in your home, especiall if they're well-maintained. Summer seems to bring a surge of home cleaning so here are hints to help you your home.
A good floor polish will help you accomplish this task. For best results sweep, clean and dry-mop the floo
before applying polish before applying polish. Loose dirt and
old polish residue will prevent the new polish from working, so the floors will still look dull. Apply the polish in thin coats. The
label instructions will tell you label instructions will tell you the
correct materials to use, quantity and method of application. $\left.\begin{array}{c}\text { Some } \\ \text { hardwoods with urethan finish may }\end{array}\right)$ hardwoods with urethan finish may
require special instructions or products. Vacuum, sweep and dry mop
regularly to keep dirt from being regularly to keep dirt from being
ground into the floor. Remember to wipe up spills immediately before the attract more soil.
If you have some dark spots on wood noors, it may be from exposure to dry on the floor. To remove the spots, follow this procedure:
-Remove solvent-based wax mineral spirits.
-Apply white vinegar to the spot and leave for three to four minutes. Repeat these steps as pecessar. If the spot is not removed after several applications, try a four percen oxalic acid solution. Oxalic acid available at most home improvemen stores. Carefully read and follow labe -If the oxalic acid doesn't work

you'll just have to live with the spot, or call in a professional floor finisher.
The scratches and small worn areas on wood floors can often be concealed by applying a small amounto of polish
with very fine steel wool to the floor. with very fine steel wool to the floor.
Wherever possible Wherever possible, apply the polish
in the direction of the wood grain and rub it genuly until the color blends with the floor. Wipe off the excess and then polish the area with a clean, dry cloth.
