Europe remembers war victims

FRANKFURT, West Germany (AP) - Europe today paid solemn tribute to the millions of victims of World War II, which started 50 years ago on Sept. 1 when a German warship opened fire on a tiny Polish garrison.

Adolf Hitler's troops quickly overran Poland and the war spread around the globe. In the end, 50 million people had died.

By then the Nazis had shocked the world with the extermination of 6 million Jews and the United States had forever changed warfare by dropping nuclear bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki in 1945.

Dr. Tan outdoes carshades

WASHINGTON (AP) - When you climb into your sunbaked car in the shopping mall parking lot and crumple behind the wheel, gasping in a Saharan inferno, it's time for a few squirts from Dr. Domingo Tan's handy air conditioner in a can.

Tan, a Chinese-born physicist who lives in suburban Alexandria, Va., invented Instant Car Kooler, an aerosol spray containing 10 percent ethyl alcohol and 90 percent water mixed with a mint fragrance.

Those cardboard windshield "sunglasses" are no competition, Tan says.

To demonstrate, he opened the door of his aging Dodge sedan, which had been parked in the sweltering sun for a couple of hours with a cardboard sun-

shade in place. A large circular thermometer dangling over the front seat registered 122 degrees Fahrenheit.

Tan leaned into the car and pointed his can of Instant Car Kooler. "Psst-psst-psst."

Within half a minute, the thermometer had plunged 42 degrees to a more bearable 80 degrees. He said the sunshade alone reduces heat by only 10 degrees to 15 degrees.

Tan, 57, began working on his invention about 10 years ago, when his young son complained frequently about the suffocating heat in the family car.

"From physics, I know that water absorbs plenty of heat. It is a good medium for moderating temperatures," Tan said. "I also thought that when it gets

so hot, we pray for rain, and after it rains we know that the temperature drops."

Tan got his idea.

"It's like making rain inside the car, but the difference is that we don't make the whole car wet. Instead of rain there are drops of spray so fine that they vaporize right away," he said.

He also observed a baby's fever is reduced when its body is rubbed with water mixed with alcohol. So Tan added ethyl alcohol, or ethanol, to the car spray to make the water vaporize faster and reduce the air temperature even further.

Born in Fukien, China, and reared in the Philippines, Tan obtained a doctorate in physics from the University of Oregon in 1968, taught college physics in

Rochester, N.Y., and did laser research at the National Bureau of Standards in Washington until he entered private business in the 1970s. He and his wife run a jewelry and gift shop in an Alexandria shopping mall.

Tan received a patent for Instant Car Kooler in April, and began marketing the 16-ounce spray cans in mid-August. The retail price is \$3.50 each.

In less than three weeks, Tan and his two business partners have received orders for more than 25,000 cans from prospective distributors from New York to Texas, and as far away as Austria and Switzerland.

One exporter wants to ship Instant Car Kooler to the Middle East, where Tan says the heat inside automobiles can soar to 165 degrees or more.

Today is Friday, September 1, the 244th day of 1989. There are 121 days left in the year.

Today's highlight in history:

Fifty years ago, on September 1, 1939, World War II began as Nazi Germany invaded Poland. Great Britain and France declared war against Germany two days later.

On this date:

In 1807, former Vice President Aaron Burr was found innocent of treason.

In 1878, Emma M. Nutt became the first woman telephone operator in the United States, for the Telephone Despatch Company of Boston.

In 1905, Alberta and Saskatchewan entered Confederation as the eighth and ninth provinces of Canada.

In 1923, the Japanese cities of Tokyo and Yokohama were devastated by an earthquake that claimed some 150,000 lives.

In 1932, New York City Mayor James J. "Gentleman Jimmy" Walker resigned following charges of graft and corruption in his administration.

In 1945, Americans received word of Japan's formal surrender, ending World War II. (Because of the time difference, it was September 2 in Tokyo Bay, where the surrender took place.)

In 1951, the United States, Australia and New Zealand signed a mutual defense pact that came to be known as the ANZUS treaty.

In 1961, the Soviet Union ended a moratorium on atomic testing with an above-ground nuclear explosion in central Asia.

In 1969, a coup in Libya brought Moammar Gadhafi to power.

In 1983, 269 people were killed when a Korean Air Lines Boeing 747 was shot down by a Soviet jet fighter after the airliner entered Soviet airspace.

In 1983, Henry "Scoop" Jackson, a 30-year Senate veteran known for his liberal views on social issues and a hawkish stand on national defense, died in Everett, Wash., at age 71.

Ten years ago: Hurricane David tore across the Dominican Republic, leaving hundreds of dead in its wake, before slashing across the Windward Passage into the mountains of eastern Cuba. The Pioneer 11 space probe survived two crossings through debris circling the ringed planet Saturn.

Five years ago: The astronauts aboard the shuttle Discovery launched their third commercial satellite in three days.

One year ago: Shipyard workers at Gdansk, Poland, ended an eleven-day strike, acting with some reluctance on the advice of Solidarity leader Lech Walesa.

Today's Birthdays: Former Defense Secretary Melvin Laird is 67. Actress Yvonne De Carlo is 65. Country singer Conway Twitty is 56. Conductor Seiji Ozawa is 54. Comedian-actress Lily Tomlin is 50. Singer Barry Gibb is 43.

Kindnappers think retaliation 'sacred'

Hostages in Lebanon endangered

NEW YORK (AP) - Captors holding U.S. hostages in Lebanon are motivated by a personal vengeance that will be more difficult to overcome since Israel kidnapped a Moslem cleric, says a U.S. Moslem leader who claims to have met with the hostage-holders in Beirut.

Mohammed Mehdi, secretary-general of the National Council on Islamic Affairs, said Thursday the kidnapping of Sheik Abdul-Karim Obeid worsened the prospects that the "exceptionally bitter, exceptionally paranoid" kidnappers will free the hostages.

"They feel the right to retaliation is sacred, and any questioning of that is illegitimate," said Mehdi, who claims to be possibly the only person in the United States who has met with the kidnappers in Beirut.

Obeid - who is affiliated with Hezbollah, the pro-Iranian extremist group believed to sponsor hostage-holders - was abducted from his home in south Lebanon July 28 by Israeli commandos. Israel, saying Obeid was involved in terrorism, has refused to free him.

"He is so damn bitter he is ready to drop such shells on New York, on Washington," Mehdi said of Anderson's captor, who lost his wife, children and grandparents when his village was bombed.

The captor responsible for holding Cicippio, who was kidnapped in September 1986, told Mehdi his children had been burned by American napalm dropped from an American-made airplane piloted by an Israeli. Three of the captor's five children died, Mehdi said.

Although Americans consider the kidnappers to be terrorists, Mehdi said, the kidnappers perceive themselves differently.

"They said, 'We are taking care of these people. Is this terrorism, or is the burning of our children terrorism?'"

Mehdi said his attempts to persuade the kidnappers that their actions violated Islamic law, that the taking of innocent hostages was contrary to the faith's teachings on personal forgiveness and individual responsibility, were "a dead road."

Mehdi claims to have met with people responsible for holding Cicippio and Terry A. Anderson, chief Middle East correspondent of The Associated Press, during a February 1987 visit to Beirut to appeal for the hostages' release.

The United States also should start trying to understand the suffering that caused the kidnappers to take hostages, Mehdi said.



Depression unrelated to cancer, study says

CHICAGO (AP) - Feeling down doesn't increase a person's risk of cancer, says a study that investigated the suggested link between mood and disease.

The study shows "a lot of speculation about the emotional component in (cancer) is just speculation," said Morton Bard, vice president for services and rehabilitation for the American Cancer Society.

The possibility of a connection between outlook and disease is certainly that there's no risk of cancer from depression," said Zonderman, co-author of a report on the study in today's Journal of the American Medical Association.

The study is a 10-year follow-up on 6,403 people who took part in a 1971-75 survey by the National Center for Health Statistics, which gathered extensive data on psychology and medical risk.

The researchers updated the subjects' medical history.

Using the results of two psychological tests conducted during the earlier survey, they identified 1,002 as "down most of the time," Zonderman said.

Of those subjects, 110, or 11 percent, had been diagnosed with cancer or had died from it since the original study.

Of the 5,401 subjects who were considered not depressed, 527, or 10 percent, had been diagnosed as having cancer or had died of it.

The 1 percentage point difference between the cancer rate for the two groups is statistically insignificant, the researchers said.

"We found that depressive systems didn't predict who was going to get cancer or who was going to die from cancer 10 years later," Zonderman said.

There was no difference in results when researchers adjusted the study to allow for other factors that could relate to cancer, including sex, age, marital status, smoking habits, family history of cancer, hypertension and cholesterol level.



Agassi, Chang advance at Open

NEW YORK (AP) - Andre Agassi and Michael Chang, the established veterans of the tennis kiddie corps, already are looking over their shoulders.

Agassi, 19 and ranked sixth in the world, and Chang, 17 and rated seventh, easily won second-round matches in the U.S. Open on Thursday. They've already survived longer than Mats Wilander, John McEnroe and Brad Gilbert.

Not that they feel comfortable. Even though their best tennis is ahead of them - and even though Chang won the French Open this year - both teen-agers know losses to up-and-coming players like themselves always are lurking on the next court.

"It doesn't matter who you play, you can't take it lightly," Agassi said after beating Neil Broad 6-3, 6-2, 6-3. "I think we bring out the best in each other."

"It's kind of like what happened with Martina and Chrissie. They brought out the best of each other for a lot of years. When you have a lot of competition around you, it definitely brings your game to a whole different level."

Chang, who beat Thomas Hogstedt 6-1, 6-3, 6-3, brought his game to a higher level at Paris. He has catapulted from 30th in the world rankings, but he knows there are plenty of players who can duplicate his streak of success.

"I think that we are a really

good group of young, good players, particularly because we grew up playing together and everybody pushed everybody to their limit," Chang said. "If you didn't work hard, you would basically be at the bottom of the group. Having that, everybody wanted to be the best in the group and everybody pushed everybody."

Other American members of the new wave include Jim Courier, 19; Sampras, 18, who ousted Wilander Wednesday night, and David Wheaton, 20. The foreign contingent includes 10th-seeded Alberto Mancini of Argentina, 20; Nicolas Pereira of Venezuela, 18, and Goran Ivanisevic of Yugoslavia, still two weeks shy of his 17th

birthday.

Agassi thinks the young Americans could be dominant in the 1990s.

"Chang has proven himself to be a great player," he said. "You have to be a great player to win a Grand Slam tournament."

"We've got Courier, Sampras. Sampras proved last night that he can play with the top players, and Courier has proven that."

"In the next year or so, we're going to be a real dominating force in men's tennis, providing that things go as well as they have so far. There's no doubt about it."

There are, however, a few "oldtimers" who might have

something to say about that. Most notable, of course, are Ivan Lendl, the top seed who routed John Fitzgerald on Thursday; No. 3 Stefan Edberg, an easy winner over Peter Lundgren, and Boris Becker, who played 1986 Open finalist Milos Meier today.

Women's winners on Thursday were No. 3 Gabriela Sabatini, No. 6 Arantxa Sanchez Vicario, No. 8 Helena Sukova and No. 15 Conchita Martinez. Among the men, No. 9 Tim Mayotte, No. 12 Emilio Sanchez, No. 13 Jimmy Connors and No. 16 Andrei Chesnokov advanced.

Also in action today were Chris Evert, Martina Navratilova, Zina Garrison and Aaron Krickstein.

Lendl, a three-time winner here who has been a finalist every year since 1982, recognizes the challenge from the youngsters.

"What I've been saying for the last year or so is that the game has gotten better," said Lendl, by far the most consistent men's player this decade.

Connors, who turns 37 on Saturday and is the oldest player on tour, routed qualifier Bryan Shelton on Thursday. He didn't think the new wave in the sport was significant.

"There always has been enough young American players to fill anybody's expectations," Connors, a five-time U.S. Open champion, said.

SWC ready for 75th grid season

The Southwest Conference begins its 75th year of football Saturday with Southern Methodist returning after a two-year absence and R.C. Slocum making his coaching debut at Texas A&M University.

The Aggies play host to Louisiana State in a 5:30 p.m. nationally televised (ESPN) matchup at Kyle Field.

Slocum, who was A&M's defensive coordinator, replaces

Jackie Sherrill who resigned last December.

At 7:30 p.m., football will be played at Ownby Stadium on the SMU campus for the first time in 41 years as the Mustangs play host to the Rice Owls, winless in their last 18 games.

SMU will be coached by Forrest Gregg, who starred for the Mustangs before achieving NFL fame as a player and coach.

The Owls also have a new coach, Fred Goldsmith, who was Arkansas' defensive coordinator last year.

In the other SWC game Saturday, Coach Jack Pardoe's Houston Cougars will play at Nevada-Las Vegas.

On Monday night, Texas opens the season in a nationally televised (ESPN) game at Colorado.

LSU was a two-point favorite over A&M, Rice was a 13-point choice over SMU, Houston was a two-touchdown favorite over Nevada-Las Vegas, and Colorado was a 9-point pick over the Longhorns.

"We didn't think the day would

ever get here but we're ready to line up against somebody with a different colored jersey on," Gregg said. "The players and the fans are ready, too."

Rice is a big favorite for the first time since "Moby Dick was a minnow," said Owls' public relations director Bill Cousins.

"I don't know why everybody is making us such a big favorite," said Goldsmith. "We're not Notre Dame."

Slocum served as interim head coach against TCU last season

when Sherrill decided to sit out the game in the wake of alleged NCAA rules violations. The Aggies beat Texas Christian 18-0. But the victory was not credited to Slocum's record.

Slocum was an assistant coach at A&M for 16 of the last 17 years.

LSU has won the last three meetings and leads the series 25-14-3.

Texas A&M's Darren Lewis is the top returning rusher in the nation, gaining more than 1,600 yards last year and a first-team

berth on The Associated Press All-America team.

Houston quarterback Andre Ware, who had an SWC-record 25 touchdown passes in 1988, will lead the Cougars against the Rebels.

Texas will face Colorado without starting free safety Willie Mack Garza, who suffered a knee injury in a scrimmage and will be lost for the season.

The Longhorns are coming off a 4-7 season last year and Coach David McWilliams is under pressure to get them competitive.

Colorado is one of the favorites in the Big Eight Conference.

Oilers search for starting TE

HOUSTON (AP) - Chris Verhulst has played in one pro game but he's the most experienced tight end on the Houston Oilers' roster.

The Oilers lost Jamie Williams to Plan B free agency, and Calvin Magee, obtained from Tampa Bay in the off-season, retired from football before the start of training camp.

Just when Verhulst thought the starting job was his by default, fifth-round draft choice Bob Mrosko, a blocking wizard from Penn State, burst upon the scene.

The pair will be battling for the starting job Saturday night when the Oilers close out their exhibition schedule against the Dallas Cowboys at Texas Stadium in Irving.

Both teams are 2-1 in preseason.

"I don't know if we're prepared to declare a starter, it's coming right down to the final game," quarterbacks coach Kevin Gilbride said.

Verhulst came to the Oilers as an outstanding receiver with few

blocking skills, the opposite of what's expected of the tight end in the Oilers' four-wide receiver offense.

"Just looking at what we do with our tight end, blocking will always be the first priority and pass catching second," Gilbride said.

Verhulst worked hard in the off-season to upgrade his blocking.

"I knew that my receiving and running was up to par for this league and it was the blocking that had to come around," Verhulst said. "I can feel improvement every day."

"The preseason work going against first-teamers has helped. Going against second- and third-teamers, you don't know the level you need to play at."

Mrosko came from the wood-work to a possible starting assignment as a fifth-round pick.

"It's hard to look inside of a player and tell what kind of player

he'll be," Gilbride said. "I don't know that he really jumped out at us because of his athletic ability."

"It's really the inside of the guy that's come to the fore. It's allowed him to overcome any physical limitations."

Mrosko, 6-5, 265, led the team in training camp fights, drawing the praise of the coaching staff.

"He's tough as nails and every time you look around, he's in a fight," Oilers general manager Mike Holovak said.

team's leading rusher, and wide receiver Drew Hill, the top receiver last year, also remain out of camp in contract disputes.


The Oilers will be facing Dallas rookie quarterbacks Steve Walsh and Troy Aikman, who are fighting for the starting position.

Rasmussen nearly no-hits Phillies

SAN DIEGO (AP) - Dennis Rasmussen's bid for a no-hitter was spoiled, but San Diego's National League West title hopes remain intact following the left-hander's fourth victory in five outings.

"There are a lot of games left," Rasmussen said after the Padres' 5-1 victory over Philadelphia on Thursday. The third-place Padres moved within 6 1/2 games of idle San Francisco in the division race, and trail second-place Houston by 2 1/2 games.

"We've got a feeling here every

game that we can come back and win," Rasmussen said.

The Padres have won seven of eight games and finished August with an 18-11 mark, gaining 3½ games on San Francisco over that stretch. Tony Gwynn says that adds up to a pennant race with 28 games remaining.

"It's do or die. We just have to keep winning," he said. "Originally, I thought we'd have to cut it to five (games) by Sept. 1 to have a shot, but we're in good shape."

Rasmussen's bid to become the

first pitcher in the Padres' 21-year history to throw a no-hitter ended after he walked Len Dykstra to open the seventh. Tommy Herr followed with a single to right, and former Padre John Kruk hit a run-scoring single to chase Rasmussen, 8-9, from the game.

Mark Grant came in to retire the side and finish the game, allowing three hits in earning his second save.

It was the second time Rasmussen has gone into the seventh with a no-hitter. He went 6 2-3 innings in

1987 while with the New York Yankees.

"In the seventh, I was really thinking about it," Rasmussen said. "I made some good pitches to Dykstra but he got on. Then Herr hit a fastball in. I got him out on the same pitch before. He just got under it a little."

Benito Santiago led the San Diego offense with a three-run homer to left in the sixth off Don Carman, 4-15. The catcher's ninth homer followed one-out singles by Chris James and Gary Templeton.

"It wasn't that bad a pitch, but I left it out over the plate," Carman said. "One pitch got me."

Carman is winless in four decisions against San Diego this season.

"He just can't make the pitches right now," Phillies manager Nick Leyva said. "He can't get his location down. That's the thing that hurt him."

The Padres took a 1-0 lead in the second on a double by Jack Clark and an RBI single by James.

San Diego's fifth run scored in

the seventh. Roberto Alomar singled, stole second and third and scored on a throwing error by Herr.

Rasmussen, who had a perfect game until he walked Dickie Thon with one out in the sixth, threw just 59 pitches in the first six innings, 39 for strikes.

"I'm just glad we don't have to face him again," Leyva said. "We tried a different lineup (Thursday). We put in some of our everyday players against him, but it still didn't work."

Toronto gains tie for AL East lead

When the Baltimore Orioles, losers of 107 games a year ago, moved into first place on May 26, few expected them to stay there very long.

Among those who figured it might not last was Orioles shortstop Cal Ripken. Today, he isn't so sure.

"It's something we never expected at the start," Ripken said Thursday night after Cleveland routed Baltimore 11-0 to dump the Orioles into a tie with Toronto for the top spot in the American League East.

"We wanted to become competitive and improve in certain areas this year, with an eye toward the future," Ripken said. "And all of a sudden we're in the middle of a

pennant race. When you go into the last month of the season with a chance to win the division..."

"It was like I was just a person one day and the next day all this happened at once," Weatherspoon told members of the Southwest Conference press tour.

"People started to notice you. They wanted to see you."

But Weatherspoon takes no special credit for his overnight stardom.

"It could have happened to anybody but it happened to me because I was in the right place at the right time," Weatherspoon said.

"The run and shoot does that. There are big areas for the running back to run."

With Jason Phillips and James Dixon each catching more than 100 passes, defenses often forgave the lone running back.

The Cougars compiled a 9-2 regular season and Weatherspoon became a folk hero.

"Before, the football players hung around together but now we communicate more with the other students on campus," Weatherspoon said.

Dixon and Phillips got most of the attention last season.

Weatherspoon averaged 8.5 yards per carry last season, leading the nation in yards per carry.

Weatherspoon was recruited by former Houston coach Bill Yeoman, the father of the veer option offense.

"When I played with my brother (Anthony) they called him Big Spoon and me Little Spoon," Weatherspoon said. "Then when

my younger brother came on they called him Teaspoon."

"Now you could say he's Tablespoon" because he's bigger than me."

Weatherspoon had to get his weight under control after ballooning to 233 pounds after spring practice.

"I was eating three meals a day and plenty of second and third helpings," Weatherspoon said. "I always do that in the spring."

"I'm just giving my body something back that I took from it during football season."

Weatherspoon is back down to 206 and ready for the season to start

although he'll be sharing the super back position with senior Kimble Anders, a co-captain.


'Dark Shadows' to be on video







Diana Ross works overtime

LOS ANGELES — Diana Ross is back at work again, and this time she's "Workin' Overtime."

After a self-imposed hiatus of two years because she was, in her own words, "at home having babies," Ross has returned to the concert stage with her Workin' Overtime World Tour.

In April she began the tour that has taken her to Belgium, Switzerland, Norway and Denmark.

Before it is over, it will have included 26 countries. In September it moves on to Australia, New Zealand and the Orient.

When she appeared at the Wembley Arena in London in early June, HBO was there to tape the concert, and Saturday, the cable channel will present a 60-minute excerpt as part of its ongoing musical series "HBO World Stage."

Clad in a wardrobe of sparkling costumes that has become one of her trademarks, Ross recalls the past with some of her hits from the '60s when she was lead singer with the Supremes.

The program includes "Reach Out and Touch," "Upside Down," "Baby Love" and "You Can't Hurry Love," as well as songs from the movie "Lady Sings the Blues" (in which she portrayed Billie Holiday) and songs from her latest album, "Workin' Overtime," for which the tour is named.

"The original concert was a little more than two hours," said Betty Bitterman, vice president of original programming for HBO. "We had to cut it down to 60 minutes to fit into our 'World Stage' format, so we unfortunately had to cut out some songs, but we did retain the original flavor."

Ross, however, was very much involved in HBO's presentation of the concert, Bitterman explained, and she acted as producer of the show

along with Steve Binder.

Ross' return to the spotlight coincides with her return to Motown, the record company responsible for her original rise to fame.

"She's come home again to Motown," said Michael Mitchell, national director of

publicity for Motown, "and we're so excited to have her back here at her roots."

He explained that the singer will not only record for the label but will act as an adviser on Motown's Executive Committee, providing input from an artist's point of view.

More to photo than Oprah

LOS ANGELES — What's in a picture?

In this case, it's a svelte Oprah Winfrey in a Bob Mackie gown gracing the cover of TV Guide.

The face looks like Winfrey's, but there's something about the body that isn't quite right.

Even with her much-publicized diet, Winfrey's figure still doesn't match the one in the illustration.

And no wonder, because that body belongs to Ann-Margret, who wore the slinky dress in that exact leg-crossed pose for a TV special 10 years ago.

She's even shown wearing Ann-Margret's diamond ring.

The composite portrait was the work of free-lance artist Chris Notarile, whom TV Guide assigned to illustrate Winfrey sitting on her estimated \$250 million fortune.

"And that's what we got back," said TV Guide editor David Sendler.

When the magazine landed on racks last week, Sendler received a call from a Time magazine reporter who was under the impression the portrait was really a composite photo — the kind one would expect to find in TV Guide owner Rupert Murdoch's other tabloid publications.

TV Guide had come under intense media scrutiny recently for incorporating tabloid elements, and this latest incident appeared to be the next logical step in the "Murdochization" process.

But Sendler insists the magazine knew nothing about the drawing until he heard from Time.

He subsequently discovered that Notarile, like other artists who are inclined to use photos for inspiration, chose Ann-Margret to inspire his creativity.

"I'd rather the artist hadn't done it," Sendler acknowl-

edged, adding, "There is really no way we can control it. We can't have an encyclopedic knowledge of every single photo ever taken."

TV Guide has used

Notarile's work before and will use it again, but Sendler said he intends to discuss the matter with the illustrator before his next expedition into the photo files.







Paige turns over new leaf in her role of Aunt Iona on ABC's 'General Hospital'

Have you seen Aunt Iona on "General Hospital" lately? Smack in the middle of the summer doldrums, Janis Paige made her debut as Iona Huntington, eccentric owner of Windemere cottage on Spoon Island, playing mother hen to her niece Katherine, while irritating her friend Robert with her nosy ways.

In a jiffy, the energy level jumped when Janis got on camera. Actors perked up and so did viewers. Something was apparently going on. Call it personality, presence or plain old professionalism.

Paige is back. She doesn't sing "Hey, There," the way she used to in the '50s as the star of Broadway's "Pajama Game," but the lady just knows how to make viewers take note. That's what she's been doing ever since her contract player days in support of Bette Davis, Olivia de Havilland and Ann Sheridan at Warner Brothers.

"I'm not sure who or what Aunt Iona is," Paige says. "I think the writers are waiting to see what I do with her." That doesn't bother the lady. She's happy to be back at work during the best time of her life... a minor irritation is having to use her VCR.

"I need to tape my shows," she says. "But I don't know how. So I call a VCR doctor who comes out, fiddles with the machine, charges me \$69

and leaves. Nothing works, I'm mad."

On Sundays, Paige works out at Jane Fonda's Shop, and laughs when she remembers the old days at Warner's when boss Jack Warner used to yell, "Get that weight off."

"I've always had baby fat. Always been on a diet," she says. "But in those days we just danced! No one lifted weights or heard of aerobics."

In those bygone days, directors hugged, actors offered support, and stars such as Bette Davis and Olivia De-Havilland stood up to the studio moguls, fighting for women's rights and better pay.

"We owe a lot to Bette and Olivia," Paige declares. "They had some power and used it. And directors like Michael Curtiz stopped yelling. Zachary Scott and Jack Carson gave advice and affec-

tion. We don't see much of that today. What a pity!"

The youngster from Tacoma, Wash., did it all backwards. She learned her trade in Hollywood at Warners and at MGM. Not waiting around to become a major star, Janis went to New York, got her first job within a day in Leland Hayward's "It Remains to Be Seen," and went on to star in "Pajama Game."

When the musicals became scarce on Broadway, Paige performed in Las Vegas, and on all the TV variety shows. After that, it was episodic TV such as "Trapper John, M.D.," a few short-lived series and now the soaps.

"I knew I had talent," she admits. "My late husband, Ray Guilbert didn't believe talent could be taught. He'd say 'You have to have discipline, but if you get too technical, the life goes out of a performance. When you lose that spark, that fun, it never comes back.'"

Paige has always worked on instinct when it comes to making choices. "The gut tells the head what to do."

She remembers jumping horses in class when she was 12 years old, learning to take one jump at a time, pausing with the horse, then moving forward. "I never got over that feeling," says Paige. "It still happens now and then at work. I haven't lost that, thank goodness. And I'm still here."




