AUSTIN (AP) - With the stroke of a pen, Gov. Bill Clements is putting the brakes on drinking while driving.
Clements, who says he's never hoisted a drink while behind the wheel, Thursday signed into law a bill that prohibits drinking while
driving. driving. "think it's been long overdue. I'm delighted to see it go on the

## \$11 billion spent on child care

WASHINGTON (AP) - Child care costs Americans billions of
dollars each year, and probbems such as the inability to find a sitter disrupt the jobs of 450,000 parents a month a fovernmen study shows.
Some 5.9 percent of employed mothers using child care other than
schools reported that they or their husbands schools reported that they or their husbands lost time from wor
monthly because of problems with their child the Census Bureau reported Thursday. That would add up to an estimated 450,000 parents a month with babys-sitting or other child care problems.
Even so, American families spend an estimated $\$ 111.1$ billion an
nually on child care, according to the survey of 19,000 households nually on child care, accord.
taken in the winter of 1984-85.
The study, "Who's Minding the Kids," was designed to measure the extent of child-care services used by employed mothers across
the nation. It found $t$
It found that 5.3 million families with employed mothers pay for
child care, at an average cost of $\$ 40.33$ a week. That includes family arrangements in which some money is paid to a relative to watch the children, as well as baby sitters and professional day-care services. Of the 7.7 million women using some type of child care service had their child cared for at the home of another perse -78 percent. Professional day care centers had the fewest problems, 1.3 percent. The women were asked whether they or their husband had lost time from work in the month prior to the interview because of pro-
blems with their child-care arrangements.
