we've heard deal with the $\$ 50,000$ settlement agree we've heard deal with the $\$ 50,000$ s
ment, not the decision to let him go.
The only explanation the public got was: "Con flicts and differences have arisen between Holder and the District which adversely affected achievement he purposes, goals and objectives of the District.
Since we elect trustees to handle the school' business, that statement might have been sufficient if a $\$ 50,000$ payment not been involved. The public deserves to know why it was necessary to make such a settlement agreement with the superintendent, but it appears that part of the agreement was for the board and Holder to keep quiet about the situation.
Since those decisions were made in executive sessions(behind closed doors), we may never know for sure just what happened and why. ## Better idea

A bill to revise the no-pass, no-play law is an improvement on the original law, but still is not the best bill to serve the students of Texas.
Legislation authored by Sen. Bill Sarpalius D-Hereford, would reduce the weeks of ineligibility o students who fail a class to three from six. Certainly, it was a hardship on many teams when the six-week rule was implemented. In the first year, som athletic teams were cut back drastically whent he first round of grades came out. But by the second year,
students had learned to deal with the rule and fewer students had learned to deal with the rule and fewe But the old rule, and even the amended rule, if pass ed, isn't the best way. A student who has all As and Bs, but perhaps flunks one difficult class, isn't allowed to play. But another student who makes straight Ds stil is allowed to continue extracurricular activities. Wouldn't a grade average be a fairer judge of academics? Require that students meet 75 or C grade averages to stay in extracurricular activities. Then, if not, ban them for three weeks.
