A year in West Africa as a Peace Corps volunteer taught a Hereford resident a great deal about herself and her own heritage as well as giving her a unique experience in another culture.

Betty Wolle, who came to Hereford a year ago to take the position of music director at First United Methodist Church, was searching for "something different -- a complete change" when she wrote for information about the Peace Corps about four years ago.

"I didn't have a burning desire to do it, but after I applied, everything went through without a hitch," she explained. "I felt the Lord said, 'This is what you should do,' so I did."

"The process of applying and completing all the requirements for acceptance required about 10 months. Once the date was cast, she went to Sierra Leone, West Africa, where the first item on the agenda was two months of intensive training.

"I was supposed to go into community development but that didn't work out, so I taught in a college near Freetown," Ms. Wolle said.

The assignment was a touch of irony in her life. She had left the public education field because of "burn-out" after 12 years of teaching junior high school music.

"This was different, though, because I taught English and vocal and choral music to adults," said Ms. Wolle.

She found her students had an "intense" desire to learn and they endure great hardships to accomplish their end.

"They were in two groups -- those whose families had enough money to pay their way and those who had sponsors," she said.

In many, if not most, instances, there was not enough money for anything else, Ms. Wolle continued.

"They literally didn't have enough to eat," she said. "And, they are prohibited from working while they are going to school."


She described her students as willing to go without food or sleep to get an education. "They are like sponges -- they soak it up."

Ms. Wolle lived in a house with two other Peace Corps volunteers under circumstances that most Americans would consider nearly primitive.

"I graded papers most of the time by candlelight," she pointed out, "because the electric power never worked. The house was wired but we rarely had electricity."

And, cooking was done on a kerosene stove. She described her students as "tri-lingual."

**Black leaders mad at Guinier rejection****By TERENCE HUNT**

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Clinton is getting mixed results as he tries to repair frayed relations with black leaders after dumping the nomination of Lani Guinier as the nation's top civil rights enforcer.

"The people who helped put Bill Clinton in the White House are angry," Rep. Kweisi Mfume, D-Md., chairman of the Congressional Black Caucus, said Friday. "To some extent they do feel betrayed."

Some members of the caucus have threatened to withhold support from Clinton's economic program.

Mfume said the president offered to meet with the group Tuesday morning. However, he said the caucus was "reassessing and re-evaluating its relationship with this administration" and asked that the meeting be put off.

Clinton had better luck in a meeting with leaders of civil rights groups Friday.

"We expect to be with this

president for the next 3-1/2 years," said Joseph Lowery, head of the National Black Leadership Forum.

Yet, Lowery said the civil rights leaders told Clinton "of the pain, of the disappointment, of the frustration, of what we think was political violence against a wonderful young woman and against civil rights and against racial justice."

He said they urged Clinton "not to run from a fight." With his popularity rating down to 36 percent, Clinton cannot afford to lose the support of blacks and other core members of his constituency.

Clinton dropped Guinier's nomination late Thursday, agreeing with critics that her legal writings challenging traditional methods of enforcing voting rights laws and questioning the concept of majority rule were too radical.

As the search began for a new nominee, Guinier insisted at a news conference Friday that she was "the right person for the job."

**School, City to meet Monday about pool**

The possibility of a cooperative project on construction of a new swimming pool in Hereford will be explored by the City Commission and Hereford Independent School District trustees at a special meeting Monday.

Scheduled for 5 p.m. in the City Commission room at City Hall, the meeting is designed to allow discussion of swimming pool needs and design, as well as financing and operating options.

The city obtained a grant of \$500,000 from Texas Parks and Wildlife Department for construction of a new pool. However, an equal amount of money must be provided by the city to qualify for the grant. Proposed is a pool of olympic-

length, to be built in a city park, located on E. 15th, between Avenue C and Avenue E. Estimated cost, excluding some other park improvements, is placed at \$1 million.

Officials earlier this year vowed not to open the present city pool in Dameron Park because of needed expensive repairs and meeting requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

However, after hearing pleas from school officials and other interested citizens, the city agreed to open the pool for another season, hoping that a new pool could be ready by next year.

At a recent workshop of the City Commission, providing a new pool was listed as a priority for the city.

# Local Roundup

## City Commission to meet

A regular meeting of the Hereford City Commission features a lengthy agenda, including zoning change requests, consideration of plans for a pavilion in Dameron Park, appointment of members of city boards, hearing a request from Kid's Inc., and consideration of condemnation proceedings on property at 322 Avenue A. The meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the commission room of City Hall. Commissioners will meet at 6:45 p.m. for briefing on agenda items.

## Vote canvass slated

Deaf Smith County Commissioners' Court will meet in special session at 9 a.m. Monday to canvass the vote in Saturday's special election. No other business is scheduled for the meeting.

## Child board to meet

The Deaf Smith County Child Welfare Board will meet in regular session at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday in Room 200 of the Deaf Smith County Courthouse. Agenda items include: a financial report, appointment of nominating committee, discussion of foster parent recognition, discussion of a request from a foster parent and discussion of board meetings.

## Immunization schedule noted

The Texas Department of Health has announced its June immunization clinic scheduled for Hereford. Vaccines against polio, diphtheria, lockjaw (tetanus), whooping cough (pertussis), measles, rubella, mumps and HIB (hemophilus influenzae type B) will be offered. Charges are based on family income and size and ability to pay. Funds are used to help keep the clinic open. The clinic's regular sessions will be held from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. The clinic will be held in the Health Department offices, 205 W. Fourth St., Suite B. After Wednesday, sessions will be held this Thursday, then June 17 and 24.

"They used their tribal tongue, English and Krio, the official language of Sierra Leone, she said, adding that their English reflects the background of their country, once a colony of the British Empire.

Although her students loved music and had "incredible rhythm," Ms. Wolle learned that they had little understanding of music as an art.

"I taught vocal technique, ear-training and sight-reading," she said about her work.

The experience in the college was a far cry from her days in public school education. Ms. Wolle changed her career focus to the church music field when she began to feel the effects of "burn-out."

She spent seven years with St. Paul United Methodist in Las Cruces, N.M., then accepted a position with First United Methodist Church in Odessa.

Before going to Odessa, though, she had considered the possibility of entering the United Methodist Church's mission field, but never took the big step. Then, after two years in the Odessa church, she began the process of joining the Peace Corps.

Peace Corps volunteers are paid a living allowance based on the standards of the country in which they work. When they leave the organization, they receive about \$2,000 for each year served.

Though born in Texas, in Spearman, Ms. Wolle has spent a good part of her life in New Mexico. Her father, an extension agent, moved his family to Las Cruces when he joined the staff of New Mexico A&M, now New Mexico State University, in Las Cruces.

She earned a bachelor's degree in music education from Texas Western College, since then re-named University of Texas at El Paso, and a master of arts in education at NMSU.

Under her direction in the music program at the Hereford church are the adult sanctuary choir, three children's choirs and two handbell choirs, one for adults and one for children. She spends some time in the Kids' Day Out program each week and goes to Kings' Manor-Westgate each week.

She also works with the church organist, Elaine Calkins, and the new church pianist, Dee Ann Trotter, in the overall music ministry of the FUMC.

Ms. Wolle said, "It's neat to be in a smaller town, again," explaining that Las Cruces has grown so much since she moved there.

"And, I like being in West Texas," she said, "and Hereford, especially."

On her return to the U.S. after the Peace Corps experience, Betty Wolle tried another career, this time in business.

"I was office manager for court reporters, doing billing and so forth," she said.

Suffice to say, after about 10 months she decided "music is more my thing," and returned to the field, coming to Hereford.

Although she spent only a year in West Africa, her experiences in Sierra Leone opened her eyes to the benefits of living in the United States, she said.

"Living there taught me about corruption and accountability -- the leadership of that country is so corrupt and greedy," she observed. "I feel grateful for our kind of government. At least the leaders are accountable for what they do."

Sierra Leone was a British colony before being granted independence in 1961. The people there must struggle just to stay alive, she said.

"It gave a whole new dimension to my life, as well as a new respect for my heritage, both family and country, and a closer relationship with God," she declared.

## Guatemala's congress seeks new president

GUATEMALA CITY (AP) - Congress was set the task of electing a new president today, after the vice president's claim on the post was opposed by demonstrators in the streets, the Constitutional Court and, perhaps most importantly, the powerful military.

The court ruled late Friday that Vice President Gustavo Espina Salguero had been a "co-participant" in ousted President Jorge Serrano's power grab. Serrano had dissolved the Supreme Court and congress, ruling by decree for eight days before the military toppled him Tuesday.

With Espina thus constitutionally disqualified, the court gave Congress 24 hours to find Serrano's successor. Jose Lobo Dubon, president of Congress, called for the 116-seat legislature to convene before midday today to vote on nominations for the presidency.

Espina, apparently with military backing, had declared he was assuming the presidency on Wednesday, the day Serrano fled into exile. But Congress blocked his

swearing-in. The rebellious Congress was backed by thousands of demonstrators and Nobel peace prize winner Rigoberta Menchu, Guatemala's most prominent human rights activist. Menchu had said Espina's bid was "a military coup with a civilian face."

The National Consensus, a powerful coalition of business, political and labor leaders also opposed Espina, and said late Friday that the army had reacted "positively" to its proposal that Espina be kept from assuming the presidency.

But Defense Minister Jose Domingo Garcia Samayoa issued no immediate statement on whether he still supported Espina against a rising tide of opposition.

The military continues to have great influence after ruling for decades. When Serrano took office in 1991, he was the first elected civilian president to succeed another in more than 150 years of Guatemalan history.

## Country star Twitty dies of aneurysm

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. (AP) - Country singer Conway Twitty died early today after collapsing on his tour bus after a show. He was 59.

Twitty's family was with him when he died at Cox Medical Center-South, said Linda Barnett, a hospital spokeswoman.

The cause of death was not released.

Twitty was returning Friday to his Hendersonville, Tenn., home from a concert in Branson when he was stricken, said MCA records spokeswoman Susan Levy.

WSMV-TV in Nashville, Tenn., reported that Twitty underwent surgery for an abdominal aneurysm.

Twitty, who began his career as a teen rock 'n' roll idol in the 1950s, had performed a matinee concert at the Jim Stafford Theater in Branson, the popular country music center south of Springfield.

About 6:30 p.m., four miles south of Springfield, the bus pulled in to a truck stop and crew members got off for refreshments.

When they returned to the bus, they found Twitty had collapsed, Ms. Levy said. Witnesses said Twitty was unconscious as he was put into an ambulance, according to KTTS radio in Springfield.

Twitty, born Harold Jenkins, achieved his first No. 1 record in 1958 with the pop-rockabilly ballad "It's Only Make Believe."

He switched to country in the mid-1960s and over the next two decades had more than 30 No. 1s, including a string of duets with Loretta Lynn.

Among his biggest hits are "Hello Darlin'," "Don't Cry, Joni," "Tight-Fitting Jeans," "Linda On My Mind" and "You've Never Been This Far Before."

He recently completed an album, scheduled for release this year, and was scheduled to appear on a cable TV show this weekend.

# Ex-priest gets 275 years in prison

ALAMOGORDO (AP) - A molestation victim of retired priest David A. Holley says he hopes a minimum 55-year prison term imposed by a state district judge would send a message to other pedophiles.

Holley, 65, was sentenced Friday to a maximum 275 years - a minimum of 55 years - for sexually molesting eight boys in Alamogordo more than 20 years ago.

Sitting at the defendants table in the Otero County Courthouse, Holley showed no emotion as Judge Robert M. Doughty II pronounced sentence.

Sitting in the audience, five of Holley's victims remained equally silent, though a few released sighs.

"We're relieved," victim Mark Sanchez said outside court afterward.

Most victims left without commenting, but some had wept openly while testifying during the sentencing hearing.

During his testimony, Sanchez called Holley a "predator." Sanchez had been molested by Holley along with his brother, Gary Michael Sanchez.

"It was definitely a fair sentence," said Mark Sanchez. "I hope this will send a message to the pedophiles of the world that this cannot continue."

Holley, 65, pleaded guilty March 23 to eight molestation counts, including charges of sexual assault, sodomy and aggravated sodomy, primarily involving oral and anal sex.

Each carried its own penalty. The judge sentenced Holley to 10-50 years on each of five counts of aggravated sodomy, 2-10 years on each of two counts of sodomy and 1-5 years on a single count of sexual assault.

The judge said in sentencing Holley that he would urge state Corrections Department officials to seek treatment for him.

The offenses, involving boys ranging in age from 10 to 13, occurred between 1972-74 while Holley served at St. Jude Mission Church in Alamogordo, which at that time was part of the Diocese of El Paso, Texas.

Holley was arrested Jan. 29 in Maryland on a New Mexico warrant while undergoing treatment St.

## Motorists urged to drive carefully

School is out, which signals a lot of outdoor fun for children.

For drivers it should necessitate a change in driving habits.

"With warmer weather and longer days, children play outside from early morning to late at night. Since there will be many more children outside during the summer, drivers must remain alert and ready for almost anything," said Trooper Wayne Beighle, public information officer for the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Children, Beighle said, do not think like adults and do not reason as adults. They lack experience with traffic and also have limited perceptual skills; consequently, they are unable to accurately judge the speed and distance of vehicles.

Drivers, therefore, have the responsibility to watch out for children at play.

"The key to avoid hitting a pedestrian is leaving yourself plenty of time and space for proper reaction. Scanning from curb to curb, well ahead of your vehicle, will afford a driver the necessary time and space," Beighle said.

After sentencing, Holley left quietly as he was taken into custody by Otero County authorities, who will hold Holley until he can be transferred to a state prison.

McDowell said Holley won't be the only one hurt by the sentence.

# Credit cards entice too many students

WACO, Texas (AP) - As a college freshman, Laurie Williams, 20, was bombarded with letters and calls from companies asking her to sign up for credit cards. Now, they are calling her for a different reason - to collect money.

Williams, who moved to Waco from Indianapolis to attend Baylor University, said her father gave her a credit card for emergencies. But holding out for emergencies lasted only for a few months.

After she made her first "frivolous" purchase, she was hooked. She now owns eight credit cards and owes hundreds of dollars to creditors.

"They just give you all of this money," said the sophomore. "The monthly payments look so small and before you know it, you are up to your ears in debt."

Williams is among the many college students each year who are enticed into getting credit cards they cannot afford.

Kathy Gardner, a counselor at the Consumer Credit Counseling Service of Greater Waco, a non-profit organization, said college students often see credit as "free money."

"A lot of times, you get these credit cards with a \$2,000 limit and the mentality is somebody just gave me a \$2,000 gift," she said. "Many of these students don't even have part-time jobs."

Cathy Lambrechts, a specialist in external communications at Deau Whitter, the parent company of Discover in Riverwoods, Ill., said the company actively recruits college juniors and seniors because there is a high probability that they will be gainfully employed, stable wage earners.

"We offer \$1,000 credit lines to students who are 18 years old or

older, do not have negative credit histories and show some form of income," she said.

They advertise to students with posters, promotional tables and letters sent to home and school addresses. However, they don't track the percentage of students who sign up, she said.

If students know how to manage credit, credit cards can be a useful part of growing up, said Susan Tiffany, editor of Everybody's Money, a quarterly journal published by the Credit Union National Association in Madison, Wis.

"It is a good idea for students to cut their teeth on credit cards in college because they need experience in dealing with credit," she said. "It also gives them an opportunity to learn how to manage credit while dealing with small amounts of money."

Tiffany said most students qualify for credit cards by getting their parents to co-sign for them or by getting a card that is backed by money in a savings account.

Credit card companies also call college campuses to make sure students are enrolled full time, said Kay Eubank, a records maintenance coordinator at the Baylor University

registrar's office.

"The office of academic records receives hundreds of calls each year from banks inquiring about the enrollment status of students," she said. "Some credit institutions now require students to bring their applications by our office so we can stamp them with the school seal."

However, many companies are not as careful. Williams said companies have given her credit cards without much inquiry into her financial history. They usually wanted to know how much money she had in her bank account or if she received money from her parents, but they rarely asked if she had a job, she said.

If they had asked, they would have found that she doesn't have a job because she is taking too many college hours to work.

For this reason, many credit card companies have changed the way they target college students, said Julie Pulliam, manager of public relations for Equifax, a credit reporting company in Atlanta, Ga.

She said pre-approved credit cards for college students are not as popular as they were in the 1980s. Companies may identify students as a good target, but they will send them extensive applications to make an

educated decision on whether to extend them credit.

"Banks that were marketing students found they had higher delinquency rates because they don't have a credit history and it is hard to tell what their performance is going to be," she said.

College students who can't pay back their creditors are running the risk of ruining their credit ratings for the next seven years.

Credit ratings may not seem important to them now, but they will be after the students graduate and start looking for mortgages on homes and someone to finance car loans, said Gardner of the Consumer Credit Counseling Service of Greater Waco.

However, help is available for students who want it. There are credit counseling companies that are free, such as Consumer Credit Counseling Services of Greater Waco, and others that charge nominal fees.

Gardner said she recommends a debt management plan to college students in credit trouble because it lets them make one payment each month to the company, which in turn sends payments to creditors.

"The important thing is that they close out credit cards, don't get any new credit cards and learn how to live off of cash," she said.

Roger Travers, a credit counselor at Credit Services of Waco, said the first thing he does is make college students cut up their credit cards.

Then, depending on the creditor, they may be able to freeze or reduce the interest on each credit card and establish a payment plan in which clients make payments directly to credit card companies.

Dallas resident Kecia White, a sales tax auditor for the state comptroller's office, is a good example of what happens to college graduates who don't get help. She has worked 60 to 80 hours a week for 2-1/2 years to pay off 12 credit cards and she still has a long way to go.

"After I graduated from college, I was \$8,000 in debt," she said. "I was making more money, but I also had more expenses such as a new car, a new apartment and college loans."

The saddest part of White's credit card spree is that she has nothing to show for the thousands of dollars that she spent impulsively on clothes and cash advances.

But she has learned her lesson. Her new motto for credit cards is "Just say no."

A good one for college students not ready to take on the responsibilities of credit cards.

## Tips on using credit cards

WACO, Texas (AP) - Kathy Gardner, a counselor at the Consumer Credit Counseling Service of Greater Waco, a non-profit organization, and other credit experts offer these tips to college students about handling the responsibilities of credit cards:

-- Cap the limit on credit cards. Instead of a \$2,000 limit, request a \$400 dollar limit.

-- Keep credit card balances to a minimum. Remember that you will have other obligations after you graduate such as college loans, car payments and other expenses.

-- Make credit card payments on time or risk ruining your credit rating.

-- If it is too hard to pay creditors,

get credit consumer counseling.

-- Be careful about canceling credit cards because credit reports only state that the account was closed. They don't say if they were canceled by you or the credit card company.

-- When selecting credit cards, ask about rates and fees because good bargains are available.

-- Even with grace periods, be prompt about paying your bills.

-- All credit card users should make the distinction of whether they are using their credit cards for convenience or for credit. Credit for convenience should be paid back as soon as possible. Credit for items such as cars and homes are long-term.

## Amarillo boy second best speller in U.S.

WASHINGTON (AP) - They lobbed a softball toward Geoff Hooper in the 66th National Spelling Bee and he knocked it out of the park with a grin: "k-a-m-i-k-a-z-e."

Spell "kamikaze" - that's all it takes to be named the nation's top young speller. But first get through "malaxage," "isonomy," "mutinously," "slalom," "tragedian," "oleander," "ankh," "anorak," "neutercane," "empyrean," "isopleth," "pharisaical," "caparison," "stupefacient" and "enchilada."

Geoff, 14, aced all those words during two grueling days of the World Series of spelling. He emerged as champion Thursday after 15 rounds that eliminated 234 youngsters.

After his last competitor, David Urban, 13, of Amarillo, Texas, misspelled "renascent," all Geoff needed for victory was one correct spelling. When the pronouncer said "kamikaze," the 963rd word of the bee, Geoff smiled broadly. He knew he had won.

"I guess there wasn't much pressure on me then," Geoff said afterward, holding a trophy in his lap. But if luck helped, studying an hour a day beforehand didn't hurt.

"I did not flat-out guess any of my words," said Geoff, who plans to put his \$5,000 prize in the bank when he gets home to Arlington, Tenn.

David, who had never heard the word "renascent" before, wished he could have changed words with Geoff. But he wasn't bitter. He won \$4,000 and topped his performance last year, when he finished 66th in the bee.

"I'm excited," David said. "I didn't expect to get in the top 20."

The crowd's favorite by far was the youngest speller, 9-year-old Wendy Guey of Palm Beach Gardens, Fla. After sounding her way through "symbiosis" and "carcinolytic," she faltered in the 11th round over "meiosis."

Ali Soleimani, 13, of Olathe, Kan., also dropped out in the 11th round, missing "glosseme." That narrowed the field to three - Geoff, David, and Yuni Kim, 12, a seventh-grader from Pottsville, Pa.

All three spelled their words correctly through two tense rounds.

But in the 14th round, Yuni was mystified by the word "apotheosize." She turned away from the audience, stared at her feet a few seconds, then spelled it

"a-p-o-t-h-e-i-z-e." Disappointed, she quickly turned and marched off the stage, leaving the two boys to duel it out.

The 66th annual national bee began Wednesday with 131 girls and 104 boys from 49 states, the Virgin Islands, Guam, Mexico, Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia and even Germany, where one girl's father is in the U.S. military. The youngsters, ages 9 through 15, won contests sponsored by their local newspapers to advance to the national meet, sponsored by Scripps Howard Newspapers.


**CLOSING COSTS**

When deciding how much money is needed to buy a new home, buyers should consider all the funds needed for the settlement table. Buyers usually figure how much of a down payment will be needed, but they forget the additional fees. Another reality is reflected in House Democratic resistance to the PAC donation ban the Senate voted to impose. Should it be reversed in court, there's a fallback to a \$1,000 contribution ceiling, with total PAC contributions held to no more than 20 percent of a candidate's total.

That won't make it in the House, where PAC contributions accounted for nearly half the average campaign war chest of the Democrats elected in 1992. Those donations tend to go to incumbents, and Democrats have most of them.

There's no disagreement on the high cost of congressional campaigns, and not much on the desirability of doing something about it. A 1974 reform law would have, but the Supreme Court ruled two years later that the spending limits the measure set for House and Senate campaigns violated the First Amendment guarantee of free speech. The court ruled that contributions could be limited.

That's a feature of President Clinton's campaign reform bill, a new edition of the one George Bush vetoed last time.

Republican leaders oppose congressional campaign subsidies, the ceilings and other provisions they claim would amount to incumbent protection, favoring the Democrats. The GOP version of reform would emphasize cost and contribution controls, with cut-rate TV and special mailings to boost challengers.

With divisions inside as well as between the two parties, the reform debate resumes Monday, no end in sight. It is a window on the way things work, or sometimes don't work.

With the Senate debating campaign finance reform, Democrat Hollings said votes keep getting set and delayed because of schedule conflicts with the fund-raising receptions that are a Washington fixture.

# Campaign reform

WASHINGTON (AP) - When Congress deals with campaign spending laws and limits, everybody is an expert, with not a novice in the house.

Or the Senate. It is an exercise in self-reform, by politicians accustomed to writing laws that deal with other people's pursuits, not their own. That is one of the reasons change comes hard, and slowly.

"We have dithered for 20 years as campaign costs have gone up, up and away," complained Sen. Ernest F. Hollings, D-S.C., advocating a constitutional amendment that would limit that spending by law.

That's not likely to happen. A majority agreed with him, but only on a resolution saying that would be a good idea, not on a real amendment, which takes two-thirds approval. Show-and-tell votes are frequent on campaign reform legislation.

The Senate has spent most of a week on the bill, there still are scores of amendments, and there may be a Republican filibuster. To beat one, Democrats will have to line up Republican votes, and may need as many as five.

They're trying. But to get those votes, they agreed to terms that conflict with the demands of House Democrats, who want less stringent limits than the Senate measure provides.

The dispute involves restrictions on the contributions of political action committees, the corporate, labor and interest group campaign funds that mushroomed as an unintended byproduct of campaign reform 20 years ago. That law put strict limits on individual contributions to congressional candidate, so organizations pooled their resources and kept giving.

That reflects one of the realities of campaign finance reform. "The money is going to follow power and somehow get in there," observed





## Abilene Reporter-News on party hosts:

A toast may not be in order, but we'd still urge three cheers for the Texas Supreme Court.

No, Mothers Against Drunk Driving didn't like it, and they've reacted as expected. But the Texas Supreme Court ruled hosts of parties are not responsible for guests who might subsequently injure themselves or others through drinking.

In a 6-2 decision, the court ruled drinkers are the only guilty parties in such instances.

Expect to hear lots of howling about it. In this age of irresponsibility, there's a pathetic trend under way that calls for shifting blame haphazardly.

Had the court decision gone the other way, it could've had disastrous

effects, whether for the neighbor throwing a simple hot dog party next door or the charitable organization holding a fund-raiser at which beer and wine happen to be served.

MADD and other groups rightly concerned with drinking - indeed, all of us - must be more responsible in battling alcohol abuse. That means stiff fines for drunken driving and public intoxication, more emphasis on the dangers of alcoholism through educational programs in our schools, more civic programs stressing the need for designated drivers (why just New Year's Eve?) and, finally, more intelligent, more restrained advertising campaigns by beer and wine companies.

Frankly, there are enough villains in this blurry scenario without inventing a few more.

The (McAllen) Monitor on the compromise school-finance plan: One doesn't have to be a genius to recognize one unfortunate side effect of the complicated plan: an army of bureaucrats will be required to check on compliance by each district.

And despite proud boasts of state legislators about no new taxes, almost every Valley district, as well as a majority of other districts in the state, will be looking at substantial tax increases if they want to have the same amount to spend per student as they did this year ...

In many cases, it won't be possible for Valley districts to maintain the same funding without an increase so big it would likely cause tax revolts among property owners. So, those districts will have to search for other money-saving measures such as cutbacks in programs or reductions in administrative staff, which in some cases may not be all that undesirable.

If the court accepts this flawed financing plan - and that is questionable - it's almost certain numerous Valley districts would join others all across the state in challenging its constitutionality. A plan that causes massive tax increases in poor districts and allows richer districts to either raise their rates by one to four cents or even decrease them almost assuredly will flunk the equity test.

El Paso Herald-Post on crime and guns: The shooting death of 16-year-old exchange student Yoshihiro Hattori was not just a tragedy for two families, one American, one Japanese. For Americans, it should provoke a tough self-examination.

The acquittal of Rodney Pearis on manslaughter charges ... closes the legal case. But court proceedings aren't the whole story. More stubborn is the culture of crime, fear and reliance on guns that prompted Pearis to respond as he did to a stranger at his door ...

Sen. Daniel Patrick Moynihan wrote recently that Americans live with so much deviant, antisocial behavior that we have adjusted by "defining deviancy down" - learning to tolerate uncivilized levels of violence. What national shame will it take to change us from a people so afraid of crime that we would shoot first and ask questions later?

## Pippen's late trey finishes off Knicks

CHICAGO (AP) - The fourth quarter is supposed to be Michael Jordan's time, not Scottie Pippen's. So when Friday night's Chicago Bulls-New York Knicks game got down to the final two minutes, everyone watched to see if Michael would do his thing. He didn't have to. Scottie did. Pippen nailed a 3-pointer with one second left on the shot clock with 1:01 to play to put Chicago ahead

90-82. The Knicks never recovered and were knocked out of the playoffs 96-88 in Game 6 of the Eastern Conference final.

"Scottie stepped up big and had a terrific series after being labeled a pussyfooter out there," said Bulls coach Phil Jackson.

The Bulls advanced to the NBA Finals for the third year in a row and will look to become the first team to win three consecutive championships since the Boston Celtics in 1966.

Their opponent will be determined

today when the Phoenix Suns and Seattle SuperSonics play Game 7 of the Western Conference final.

"We can't look back, we have two rings and we're looking to achieve another," Pippen said.

Pippen took over for an exhausted Jordan in the fourth quarter, scoring 7 of his 24 points. Jordan, under the strain of the publication of a book alleging he lost huge sums of money gambling on golf, had 25 points, but 17 came in the first half. Jordan made only four free throws in the final

quarter - when he usually takes over a game.

Jordan still wasn't talking to the press after the game. He issued a statement before the game admitting he had made bets playing golf but calling the alleged amounts preposterous.

"I think there was a tremendous strain on Michael with all the controversy," said Jackson. "He just put it behind him and played hard."

Patrick Ewing led the Knicks with 26 points. Although they went kept the score close down to the end, they never regained a lead they held at 10-7 before the Bulls went on an 11-0 run.

## A&M, LSU advance in CWS

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) - Louisiana State coach Skip Bertman says the team with pitching and timely hitting is going to win the College World Series.

Top-seeded Texas A&M and Bertman's own Tigers had just that in Friday's first-round games of Bracket One at the NCAA's national baseball championships.

A&M used the five-hit pitching of Jeff Granger and Brian Thomas' 15th homer of the season leading off the

sixth to sideline eighth-seeded Kansas 5-1. Then fifth-seeded LSU used a three-hitter by Mike Siroka and two homers with five RBIs by Jim Greely to topple fourth-seeded Long Beach State 7-1.

LSU (50-16-1) moves to the second round to meet A&M (53-9) in a 6:36 p.m. CDT game Sunday. Long Beach State (43-18) meets Kansas (45-17) in an elimination game at 3:06 p.m. Sunday.

Granger, a first-round draft pick Thursday and a first-team All-American on just about

anybody's list, improved to 15-3 with his dominance of Kansas over eight innings. Chris Clemons pitched a scoreless ninth.

"The whole story was Granger after the second inning," Kansas coach Dave Bingham said. "We felt we had to get to him early. He gave us a chance and we missed."

Kansas loaded the bases in the second but came out without a run when Dan Rude bounced into a inning-ending double play.

The score was 1-1 when Thomas homered over the right-center field fence.

"I thought the home run relaxed the team," Thomas said. "It was a fastball up and I got it out."

Bingham said his starter, Chris Corn (9-4) knew how to pitch Thomas but let one pitch get away.

Rob Trimble also singled three times and drove in two runs for the Aggies, who are in their first CWS since 1964. Kansas is in its first CWS.

Brown beat the Yankees for the eighth straight time Friday night, giving the Texas pitcher a 10-1 career record against New York. That's the best winning percentage against the Yankees (.909) of any pitcher with 10 or more victories.

# Manuel's drive has helped Bellaire remain one of Texas' top programs

HOUSTON (AP) - It's never enough for Bellaire's Rocky Manuel. Tell Manuel that three players made an area postseason all-star team, and he'll want to know why three or four others didn't. Let Manuel know his baseball team is ranked No. 2 in the state, and he wants to know why the Cards aren't No. 1. In the nation.

Tell him about a good player on another team, and he'll spend a good 15 minutes talking about how the guy couldn't play at Bellaire for this reason or that. Or about how much better his player is.

Ask Manuel about his baseball program, and he'll simply say that Bellaire is "the Notre Dame of high school baseball."

And he believes every word of it. "Over the last three years, we've won more games than anyone in the state of Texas," said Manuel, who has guided the Cardinals to an 87-12 record in three years at the school. "At Bellaire, we're kind of a victim of our own success sometimes. We're expected to win every game. There's a lot of pressure on and off the field on our players."

"People were saying that we were having a bad year this year, but we're 29-4."

Manuel talks about Bellaire baseball with almost evangelical passion. The eyes burn from the perpetually sunnied face. Even the Cardinals' berth in the Region III final against 26-4 Alvin Thursday at the Astrodome is not enough.

"We expect to win the state championship," Manuel said. "We

expect that every year. If we do fall a little short, then we're still pretty far up there."

The Cards are the closest they've been since 1986, when a Ray Knoblauch-coached team knocked off Westwood 7-4 for the Class 5A title. The victory was one of Knoblauch's 596 career wins and one of four state championships - numbers that cemented Bellaire's position as a national power.

And the Cards have kept rolling since, advancing to the regional semifinals every year.

Along the way, controversy and magnificence have touched Manuel and the Cards. There was the one-year probation in 1991 for a violation of off-season-workout rules. Last year, Baseball America tabbed the Cards as the top team in the nation in a preseason poll. But the year ended on a sour note when Manuel was ejected from Bellaire's 7-5 loss to Alvin in the regional semifinals - an ejection that contributed to a five-game suspension this year for the volatile coach.

But Manuel just keeps plugging along, doing things his way. And that way has been successful from day one. Bellaire practices are meticulously organized events. No goofing off. No aimless wandering or shooting the breeze. At Bellaire, the practice field is just another classroom, Manuel says.

"As far as we're concerned, we run the best high school practice in the country," Manuel said. "We win a lot of games in practice, and when they get out on the field, all they're expected to do is what they do in practice."

And Manuel credits the players for the success.

"Most of my players are in college prep (courses), so when they get out on the field, where with some schools you have to do something three or four times before the players pick it up, at Bellaire, it's just one or two times," he said. "You can get a lot of quality work done on the field if you don't have to repeatedly go over what you want to get done. You can move a lot quicker."

"Really, the baseball field becomes an accelerated classroom. We can do a lot of different things that a lot of people can't do. I'm talking about subtle things that people never realize. But we get that done at Bellaire High School because the players are so smart."

And good. The Cardinals have three players hitting over .400 (Jason Schreiber, Taylor Holladay and Drew Guerra) and three more over .300 (MacGregor Byers, Travis Erard and Mike Tucker). And Bellaire has a potent one-two combination of Schreiber (13-0, 0.80 ERA) and Holladay (9-1, 1.09) on the mound.

Imagine how good the Cards would be if they still had senior David Paris (8-0 last year), who was lost for the year when he hyperextended an elbow and had surgery to replace a tendon with one from his ankle.

"Paris was a big loss, but Schreiber was having a big year from day one," Manuel said. "He was our No. 1 pitcher going into this year, and Paris was our No. 2. When he went down, Holladay stepped up from the No. 3 spot to the No. 2."

"Holladay has just had a super year

for us and has taken a lot of pressure off Schreiber. Schreiber would pitch every game if you let him. With Holladay stepping in there and contributing heavily this year, it has really eased the fact that we lost Paris halfway through the year."

"We're starting three three-year seniors, and they've just done some unbelievable things this year. We're talking about Schreiber and, of course, Byers, and there's nobody better than him at what he does. And then there's (Mike) Burris, a guy we consider the best catcher in high school. He works so hard on his catching that sometimes his hitting suffers."

The Cardinals sometimes feel the pressure of being one of the top teams in the state. Other teams can steal a win here or there because the opposing team is flat, but not so for the Cardinals, said Schreiber. He feels Bellaire is the big game on the schedule for most teams.

"It's a lot of fun," Schreiber said. "Everybody comes out and tries to beat us. They throw their best pitcher, and everybody seems to really go after it. They don't save much for another team. They're really high for us."

"I like it. It's a lot of fun." Manuel also welcomes the pressure, saying that's the way it should be at Bellaire.

"Last year, we opened up at No. 1 in the nation," he said. "This year, we opened up at No. 2 in the state, so there was a little less pressure this year, even though we've gone farther this year than we did last year. But we still have work to do."

"The kids have worked hard, and hard work pays off."

# UT's Kieschnick followed right path

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) - Call it looking out for her son's financial interests. Or maybe it was only a mother's instinct.

Brooks Kieschnick, ace pitcher and designated hitter extraordinaire for the University of Texas, was in his second year of high school football at Corpus Christi Carroll when he suffered a pinched nerve in his neck that changed his life.

The damaged nerves were too close to his rotator cuff, and Karen LaBarbera saw to it that her son would never risk his future again, at least not on a football field.

"I didn't play football my senior year in high school," said Kieschnick, taken by the Chicago Cubs with the 10th pick in baseball's amateur draft Thursday. "The decision was made for me because I couldn't get

a release to play football after my injury."

"I think my mom talked to the folks at school and made sure I couldn't get a waiver because she wanted me focusing on baseball."

Mom is mum on the subject. But others privately thank her, including Texas coach Cliff Gustafson.

Gustafson, who has coached Boston Red Sox ace Roger Clemens and Houston Astros hurler Greg Swindell, says he has never seen the likes of Kieschnick, 6-foot-4 and 230 pounds.

"The thing that sets him apart from the other players that have come through this program is that he has been our No. 1 pitcher, our No. 1 hitter and our No. 1 power hitter," Gustafson said. "You put all that together and that makes him pretty unique."

Kieschnick, a junior, is the main

reason Texas is headed to a record-extending 27th College World Series, Gustafson said.

Kieschnick won the Dick Hower Award from the American Baseball Coaches Association as the nation's top amateur player in 1992 and he is a favorite to repeat.

He was named Baseball America's college player of the year Thursday and received the same honor from Collegiate Baseball.

"He's the guy that makes us go," said Gustafson, who will be coaching in his 17th College World Series when Texas takes on Oklahoma State Saturday.

Although Kieschnick's football days are long gone, he maintains a middle linebacker's mentality while blasting shot after shot into the bleachers or whipping 90 mph fastballs by batters.

"It's controlled chaos," he said. "I play the game with a tough mental approach. I have been called hardheaded and some say I get too excited and too emotional. But that's how I will always play the game."

Opposing pitchers consistently throw inside on Kieschnick. And in a Texas victory against top-ranked arch-rival Texas A&M in the Southwest Conference tournament, the Aggies threw at him.

Kieschnick lost it when A&M pitcher Kelly Wunsch drilled him with a fastball. He slung his bat with such rage that it flew through the on-deck circle and into the Longhorns' dugout, nearly taking out the legs of teammate Braxton Hickman.

He took a few steps toward the mound, and Gustafson, who normally strolls out on the field at a snail's pace for a pitching change, ran after his star player.

Kieschnick was ready to throw blows, but under college rules a player is suspended for at least one

game for fighting and Texas couldn't afford to lose him.

"We have to constantly guard against him getting too fired up and getting thrown out," Gustafson said. "He has handled it pretty well, considering he has been a target that pitchers have been throwing at all year."

"It's football-like intensity," says Texas outfielder Peter Gardere, who also served as the Longhorns' four-year starting quarterback.

"Whenever he goes out to the mound or steps up to hit, it's like the look you see in a linebacker's eyes. He wants to take control of the game whenever he is in there."

Kieschnick, who is batting .376 with 19 home runs and 80 RBIs, owns school records for career home runs (43), career extra base hits (116) and career slugging percentage (.683).

From the mound, he is 15-3 this year with three saves and a 3.09 ERA. If he weren't leaving Texas for the major leagues after this year, he likely would have caught Swindell and former Longhorns ace Kirk Dressendorfer in career pitching appearances.

But Kieschnick may soon have seen the last of the mound, too. Pro scouts say his hitting is his ticket to fame and fortune.

"I see him advancing to the majors in really a short period of time and becoming one of the premier power hitters in the major leagues," Gustafson said.

"We got beat by a great, great team," said coach Pat Riley. "Scottie was simply an all-star. He played as well as I've seen him. We just didn't have an answer to him."

But Riley and the rest of the Knicks couldn't hide their disappointment.

"Our players were so committed, we believed we could win a championship," said Riley. "The misery and disappointment they will feel for a while will be overwhelming. We had a great season, we won 60 games but as we went up in class, we didn't have enough."

For a while it didn't seem as if the Bulls had enough.

Although they were ahead at halftime, the Knicks had a 25-7 rebounding edge.

"It was a sad comment on our efforts on the boards," said Jackson. "Horace (Grant) had two rebounds and was our leading rebounder."

Grant stepped it up in the second half and finished with 11 rebounds and the Bulls cut the margin to 46-25 by the end of the game.

"Heart and determination was how we overcame the rebounding edge," said Grant. "But I'm glad to see all the Knicks leaving, the entire crew including Patrick, Riley and everybody."



# Ryan's farewell season is going all wrong

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) - Nolan Ryan's last season as a baseball player was not supposed to be this way.

It was supposed to be a series of sentimental farewells at Fenway Park and Yankee Stadium; it was supposed to be a season of near no-hitters and possibly an eighth no-no wonder of the baseball world; it was supposed to be spiced by another 200 strikeouts and 15 to 18 victories.

And, finally, it was supposed to be capped by Ryan's appearance in only the second World Series of his 27-year career.

Where have the baseball gods gone? They certainly aren't at Arlington Stadium or Alvin, Texas.

Ryan has been injured this season running to first base on a muddy field, and trying to catch a runner in a rundown between third and home.

Nolan got off one disabled list following arthroscopic knee surgery

to go back on it with a pulled hip muscle.

He even got hurt while he was on the DL down at the ranch. He was doing nothing more strenuous than driving a boat while his kids water skied. The only problem was Nolan slipped on the dock and sliced his left foot on a water ski fin. Maybe we could have understood if Nolan had a bull step on his foot. But a water ski?

It's not supposed to be this way. Ryan joked it looked like a black

cloud was following him around.

Did you ask about his arm? Well, his golden right arm which made him the major leagues all-time strikeout king is just fine, thank you. The last time he pitched he was in the mid-90s and never felt better.

If only Nolan's knee, hip, and foot could get well we'd be treated by the spectacle of a Ryan performance some 15 more times. The amazing cannon attached to his 46-year-old body still has no flaws in it.

So you think you're getting

cheated in this season of Ryan's farewell. What about Nolan?

Ryan is as frustrated as he has even been in his career. One of the reasons is that he wanted you, the fan, to see him at his finest.

When he announced his desire to pitch one more year, he said he made the decision in February to give fans a chance to buy tickets to see him. The Rangers season closer against Kansas City is almost a sellout as fans rushed to buy tickets for his last game.

Another reason is the salary Ryan is drawing. He's getting \$3.75 million and that boils down to some \$20,000 for every game of the regular season.

Ryan comes from ranch country where you give a good, hard effort for

a good day's pay.

It grinds on Ryan that he's being paid to do nothing.

Ryan is finally being paid what he's worth but he can't get out and sweat for it. It goes against his upbringing and ranch work ethic.

Quit? Not unless they carry him out on a stretcher. Ryan has vowed to give it another all-out try probably sometime in July.

As Texas general manager Tom Grieve put it, "Nolan's never quit at anything in his life."

Nolan has to come back or we all have been cheated of watching him for one last time.

It's not supposed to be this way. Nolan is just the kind of guy who can do something about it. Lookout black cloud.

## Panhandle man pitched in Major Leagues with Brooklyn Dodgers during 1949 season

PANHANDLE, Texas (AP) - On a glorious sunny afternoon in mid-April of 1949, Bob Austin walked from the dugout to the pitcher's mound at Ebbets Field.

Austin hurled five innings for the Dodgers against the Boston Braves, allowing just one hit and one run. He earned a victory in his first Major League start and, at age 25, was considered to possess one of the best arms in the game.

It sounds like something straight out of the movies: a midwestern kid makes good in the biggest of the big league cities with just his youthful exuberance and a rocket-like fastball.

But Austin's story doesn't have the typical Hollywood ending. Instead of becoming a star, having to overcome a potentially career-ending injury to pitch one last time and striking out the final batter of the game as Grace Kelly runs to embrace him on the mound and his teammates carry him off the field, Bob Austin had to settle for reality.

When he went to Brooklyn, after three seasons with the Fort Worth Cats - one of the Dodgers minor league clubs - Austin knew he probably wouldn't last. His trouble had started during the 1948 season in Fort Worth. In his first seven starts, the six-foot right-hander threw four straight complete games and had a 5-0 mark. He was burning up the Texas League. By August, Austin was 17-5, on the fast track to the majors.

That's when he said he really started to notice the pain. Austin, the grandfather of Pampa Harvesters center fielder Gregg Moore, grew up in Foss, Okla., and now lives in Panhandle. He spends most of his time working on his garden there, but on a dreary afternoon, instead of trying to rescue his okra from the rain, Bob Austin has decided to spend a couple of hours remembering his playing days.

He leans back and takes a deep breath as he starts to recall that '48

season. "It'd be okay while I was pitching, but then it would really start hurting afterwards," Austin says in his deep, Southwestern drawl. "I guess it was what they now call a rotator cuff."

After graduating from high school in Foss at the age of 16, Austin decided to sign with the Amarillo Gold Sox for \$300 a month instead of attending the University of Oklahoma. He pitched in two games for the Gold Sox, a total of about eight innings, and decided it wasn't for him.

"When I signed with Amarillo, the manager said that I could try it and if I didn't like it, I could still attend OU as long as I hadn't thrown more than 45 innings," Austin remembers. "Well, it turned out that was a bunch of hokey."

So Austin spent the remainder of the '42 season with the Oklahoma City Natural Gassers, a semi-pro team. He served in the army from '43 to '45 and when he returned, Austin took his fastball to High Point, N.C. for a tryout in the Dodgers' organization. "There were hundreds of guys there," Austin recalls. "They'd call off a position and a couple of guys would go over and when they got to pitcher, there was a line of people from home plate to center field."

Needless to say there was some confusion. On the second day of camp, Austin saw his name on the cut list. "I hadn't even pitched yet," he remembers. "So I went into one of the pitching instructors' office and he said I could pitch the next day. I threw it well and they assigned me to a team in Newport News, Va., in the Piedmont League."

Austin went 11-9 his first year and Fort Worth bought his contract the following season, assigning him to the Three-I League in Danville, Ill. He was used solely as a reliever for the Cats in 1947, taking advantage of every chance he got and putting together an impressive streak of saves and wins. In '48, he finally became a starter in Fort Worth. That was the

season he found out his career was doomed.

In his powerful right shoulder, Austin said it felt like "something had slipped." He applied treatment (a kind of hot-rub) before every start and told his manager, Bobby Bragan, after a string of four straight shutouts, that he was hurting.

"After I pitched the four straight, I told him my arm was sore," Austin remembers. "He just laughed and said, 'Well, you better keep it sore.'"

"The next time I went out, my first pitch bounced before it reached the plate."

The Fort Worth Star-Telegram, in a 1949 article, named Austin as one of the finest pitchers on the team over the '48 and '49 seasons. Other hurlers named to this "all-star team" included Carl Erskine, who went on to win 122 games over 12 seasons with the Dodgers in Brooklyn and Los Angeles and John Van Cuyk, also a major leaguer for several seasons.

At the end of the listing of players, the story reads, "inclusion of Austin may surprise. In our opinion, however, before his arm went dead in August 1948, he was one of the truly great pitchers of the era."

Austin finished the '48 season with a 17-7 mark and a stunning 2.75 earned run average. Except for a couple of short stints, he was on the bench for the last month of the season. Still, at the Dodgers 1949 spring training camp in Vero Beach, Fla., Austin finally earned his spot on the opening-day roster.

"I could tell right away if I was going to pitch well," Austin recalls. "I threw three or four games at Vero Beach, Fla., (in spring training) where it felt pretty good so they brought me up."

In the game against the Braves, Austin says, he was on. "It was the first time I really let loose," he laughs. "I guess I was always saving a little bit for when it really counted and by the fifth inning, I was hurting."

Austin recalls the day with a smile. Before the game, he remembers, "I prayed a lot. I was nervous, but only until the first pitch." Austin reaches up to rub his shoulder, then shakes his head. "After that, it was just me and the hitter and Roy."

Campanella, the Dodgers' Hall-of-Fame catcher, was one of a team of stars backing up Austin in the field. Gilbert "Gil" Hodges was on first, Jack "Jackie" Robinson on second, Harold "Pee Wee" Reese was the shortstop and Edwin "Duke" Snider among the outfielders. The '49 Dodgers was a special team, National League champs, with a 95-57 mark.

They lost the fall classic in five games to the Yankees, but Bob Austin's sole April outing was ancient history by the time October rolled around.



## Texas melons great buy for the summer

Fresh Texas melons may be the wonder food of the long hot summer. They taste great. They're very low in sodium and contain no fat or cholesterol. And they are a significant source of folic acid, vitamins A and C and potassium.

"Shoppers will soon be seeing a thumping good crop of cantaloupes and watermelons at the market this summer," Agriculture Commissioner Rick Perry said. "Not only are these melons mouth-watering good, they offer impressive nutritional benefits as well."

Cantaloupes, planted in all nine growing areas of the state, are available March through November, with the peak harvesting period being from June to September.

Some consumers are already finding Texas cantaloupes in their supermarkets. Because of innovative planting methods begun used by many growers, this year's crop of cantaloupes will be of a higher quality in taste and appearance. In other words, they will be larger, sweeter and prettier.

Ready-to-eat cantaloupes should have a slightly golden under-color and netting which stand out prominently and covers the cantaloupe. Along with a smooth, slightly soft stem end, a ripe cantaloupe will have a distinctive, sweet aroma.

"Texas has always produced an abundant crop of watermelons," Perry said. "Because the melons are adapted to our climatic conditions, they are grown on more acres in the state than any other vegetable for the fresh market."

Available March through October, with June through August being the heaviest volume period, watermelons are already on their way to supermarkets from the Rio Grande Valley growing area.

The harvesting of the state's more than 44,000 acres of watermelons, will spread upward from the Rio Grande Valley to Coastal Bend, the Winter Garden, Central Texas and on into the Panhandle throughout the summer months, assuring that consumers will have fresh melons all summer long.

There are more than 25 varieties of watermelons, but the two major watermelon varieties produced in Texas are the Charleston Gray strains and Jubilee.

Uncut melons should be well shaped with full ends. The underside of the melon should be creamy in color where it touched the ground.





### Vacation video, photo tips

The photos and videos you take on vacation can make the memories of your trip last a lifetime.

To help make them great here are a few tips:

-Composition is one of the key elements in creating a picture. Watch the background--make sure trees, wires, poles, etc., aren't "growing" out of your subject's head. Try to have an object, a branch, rock formation, etc. in the foreground to give depth and scale. Remember that off-center subjects can look more realistic than perfectly centered ones.  
 -The best time of day to take available light photos is in the early

morning and late afternoon. You'll get more color saturation as well as dramatic shadows.

-Your videos will look more professional if you avoid excessive zooming and panning. Also, remember to start your panning before you begin to record and to continue panning after you stop recording. This will avoid shaky starts and stops.

-Always carry your camera in a study case to protect it against the elements and shock. Never leave it in a closed car--the heat can actually melt videotapes.



# MINDING YOUR OWN BUSINESS

## FORESERVICE

The ink was barely dry on the "afterservice" column, when the idea for this column materialized. The topic came up in a casual conversation during a break in a "Coexisting with Wal-Mart" workshop I presented.

Pat Reed planted the seed that sprouted into his idea. Reed is the Director of Operations for a buying group that provides services to retail appliance dealers in Missouri, Arkansas, Tennessee and Mississippi. He and I were discussing the importance of providing service after the sale.

After agreeing there was a shortage of afterservice, Reed offered some additional insight. "Not only is there a limited supply of service after the sale, but there is also a shortage of service before the

sale," Reed said. He added that smaller businesses can make up ground on the discounters and specialty chains by providing service before the sale. And that is how I got a brand new word for service before the sale - "foreservice."

### Afterservice and foreservice

For the benefit of you readers who may have missed the afterservice column, let me take just a moment to bring you up to date. A few weeks ago I wrote a column on service after the sale, and in that article coined the term afterservice to describe the concept. The central point was to follow-up after the sale to increase your customer's level of satisfaction.

What Reed was suggesting was that service before the sale was equally important and also in short supply. I pondered that thought as I drove home from the workshop.

Here are some tips Reed and I came up with that may help you increase your customer's level of confidence and satisfaction before the sale. Use them to turn potential buyers into satisfied customers.

### Foreservice tips

- 1) **Get to know every customer.** Take time to learn their names and to find their interests. Customers like to do business with people they know - particularly the owner of the business. Ask questions to determine needs and qualify prospects. Don't underestimate the power of the personal touch.
- 2) **Don't promise more than you can deliver.** You may make the sale this time, but you will probably lose the customer. The best approach is to "under-promise and over-deliver." Remember your

reputation and integrity are on the line every time.

3) **Be knowledgeable of your products and services.** You and every employee should gain product knowledge every day. One of the ways to gain new customers is to "out-know" your competition. People are willing to pay more for knowledge and information. Many of the mass merchandisers and specialty chains are weak in this area. Take advantage of their weaknesses by making product knowledge your strength.

4) **Stress the benefits of your products and services.** All customers want the following benefits: more time, more money, less aggravation and enhanced feelings of self worth. Pointing out the advantages you offer clearly and concisely is good foreservice.

5) **Don't forget to be courteous.** Even if you can't fill every need, a friendly, courteous manner will bring the customers back again and again. Good foreservice includes a friendly greeting, a warm smile and calling the customer by name, if you can.


6) **Foreservice also includes:** Adjusting your store hours to meet your customer's preferences, creating cheerful and appealing displays of merchandise, and making it easy for customer's to contact you with 24-hour hot lines or toll-free phone numbers.







Q: The inside skin of my dishwasher peeled and left a bare spot down to the metal. Can it be repaired?

A: Frigidaire does make available a porcelain repair kit which can be used on the inner surface of your dishwasher and should repair your peeling liner. The porcelain repair kit is Frigidaire part No. 8950102. It costs about \$35 through your nearest authorized Frigidaire parts distributor.

The kit contains a tube of RTV compound and instructions. Basically, you clean the area to be repaired using a file or emery cloth, then smooth on the compound. It may take several coats to build up the surface to the original height. Let the compound dry for 24 hours before using the machine.

## Clive James' 'Fame' series a 250-character soap opera



Stars in the heavens: Monday on most PBS affiliates, "Clive James' Fame in the 20th Century" begins its run over four consecutive nights. The eight-hour series recalls personalities such as John F. Kennedy (left), Mary Pickford and Elvis Presley to examine how the nature of fame has changed with the rise of the media.

Krystle and Alexis trade insults. Madonna struts her stuff. Ah-nuld mows down adversaries as "The Terminator." This is a documentary?

Ummm ... not exactly, according to Clive James, the host of "Clive James' Fame in the 20th Century." The eight-part series begins airing this week on many PBS affiliates. Stations have the option of carrying "Fame" either in two-hour chunks over four consecutive nights starting Monday, June 7, or in eight weekly one-hour installments beginning next week. (Check local listings.)

James is speaking from Cairo, Egypt, where he is filming another in his popular "Postcards" public-TV travel series. "I'm covered with dust just now," he says, "and before you ask — yes, the bazaar is bizarre."

How exactly does one tackle a topic as expansive as this one? "With great difficulty, actually," he says, laughing. "This was very, very difficult to write, and I personally will never take on anything like this again." The first episode alone went through some 22 drafts before he was satisfied with it, he adds.


Happily, the sweat doesn't show, for the finished series is just as exhilarating and entertaining as it is (you may want to stop reading here) educational. In the first episode, James points out that the spread of information and education theoretically makes people less susceptible to the myths surrounding celebrities. Theoretically.

"After almost 100 years of compulsory education for all," he says, deadpan, "there are fully grown women who believe that this man is not dead." Cut to Elvis Presley in concert.

James confesses that he deliberately tried to keep the series breezy and image-driven. "There were two ways to approach

this, the other one straight-on and scholarly, which just made me SCREAM with boredom," he says melodramatically. "The challenge was to find a way to keep it moving while analyzing the various themes that arose. Putting the series in chronological order gave it forward motion, and I just addressed any themes as they came up."

One theme that recurs throughout, not

surprisingly, is the price one pays to be famous. James assesses professional celebrity Madonna as a person for whom "fame was the only reality." His take on the troubled Princess Diana, however, is far more poignant: "Those who become famous are up there for our use. The most they can hope for is to be used well, but used they always are. They are OUR dreams come true, not theirs."

Two years in the making, the BBC-produced series was an enormous success in Britain and the host's native Australia. He confesses that he "hasn't a clue" how the piece will fare in the States, where "documentary" is a four-letter word for many

# 'Route 66' is back on television

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Get out the road maps. "Route 66" is coming back to television with new stories and highways to update the show that zigzagged from Chicago to Los Angeles 30 years ago.

But its "wheels" are the same. The classic, gloriously shiny Corvette carrying stars James Wilder and Dan Cortese to adventure looks as alluring as ever.

The debut of the new "Route 66" is at 8 p.m. EDT Tuesday, June 8. Four episodes have been filmed for its summer tryout.

Its producers say the new NBC series is inspired by, but not a copycat of, the 1960-64 version.

"The original series was very serious, earnest, issues-oriented melodrama," in the TV tradition of the 1950s and '60s, says Harley Peyton. He is co-executive producer with Herbert Leonard, creator of the first "Route 66."

"That approach, by definition, is a little dated: the idea that two people driving across America would run into problems that needed solving every week," Peyton says.

"We wanted to make the show a little more free-form, a little more accurate depiction of what a road trip

would be," he said. And, importantly, "more comedic in nature," Peyton adds.

Both men believe that the series' heart and soul - the call of the road - remains as appealing now as it was three decades ago.

"It's a basic part of the American spirit to look for open space," Peyton says. And to seek yourself, Leonard adds.

"Young people have difficulty in finding a way to make a living, to build something, to have a future," Leonard says. "Getting a car, moving around the country, is one way of trying to find that way, finding who you are."

Among the show's new features: Nelson Riddle's jazz theme, a hit song in 1962, has been replaced by an original Warren Zevon pop song. The once-mighty Route 66 itself is also gone, decertified by the federal government in 1985.

In the premiere, young Pennsylvania steelworker Nick Lewis (Wilder) learns of the death of the father he never met, Buz Murdock.

He heads west to claim his inheritance, a perfectly preserved red-and-white Corvette. En route home, Nick picks up a hitchhiker and adventurer, Arthur Clark (Cortese) -

and takes a detour.

George Maharis played Murdock in the original "Route 66," with Martin Milner as his traveling buddy, Tod Stiles. (After Maharis left the show in 1963, Glenn Corbett stepped in as Linc Case for the final season.)

Buz was from a tough New York neighborhood; Tod had been born to wealth but found his fortune gone after his father's sudden death. Both young men were searching for a place to belong.

The Corvette, of course, was also a star - and even got a regular face lift. To please the carmaker sponsoring the show, writers had to come up with a way to destroy the car each year and replace it with the new model.

"We had heroic deaths," Leonard recalls, such as the time the Corvette vanished into a rock quarry after being used to pull a trapped child to safety.

Over the years, Peyton says, there have been attempts to create a road show in the tradition of "Route 66." When a production company raised the idea with him, he decided there was only one approach to take.

"I said it seems so much like 'Route 66,' and people have been trying to rip off 'Route 66,' let's not

pretend it isn't," the producer recalls.

He was only 6 years old when the original series aired, so Peyton pulled out old episodes of the show. Leonard, of course, knew all about its roots.

"It was about my life," he says. "I had a great wanderlust, and did a lot of traveling."

He also had a friendship similar to the one at the heart of "Route 66." Leonard was the cash-strapped kid, while his friend was well-to-do and attended private school.

"Route 66" allowed its characters to "test their values against the values of the people they came in contact with," he says.

Leonard is eager to see the new series match its predecessor in one respect: on-location filming across America.

The original "Route 66" sent writers ahead to develop plots for a specific area, such as an Oregon fishing community. Then the cast and crew would follow, "like running a little army," Leonard says.

"I think looking to and looking at America is really one of the major characters of the show," he says.

Although the new series' first episode puts its stars on the road, the others are bound more closely to Southern California. If the series is renewed, both Leonard and Peyton say they hope that will change.

"We are trying to fake America within a 100-mile radius of Los Angeles. I'm not sure it (the show) is worth doing if we're bound to L.A.," Peyton says.

viewers. That's why he takes great pains to emphasize that "Fame in the 20th Century" is not your garden-variety D-word.

"It's a soap opera with 250 stars," he says with obvious relish, "and sometimes it takes a war to write them out." The series was designed from the beginning to be aired in America, where James considers 20th-century fame to have started, on the newspaper presses of William Randolph Hearst. WQED in Pittsburgh signed on as a production associate on the basis of that concept alone, he points out.

James says he hopes American audiences will at least sample the series. "It's a painless review of 20th-century history through the people who made it," he concludes. "The people on the screen are the ones who made us what we are today."

# Television will never be the same

WASHINGTON (AP) - If manufacturers can work out all the bugs, Americans may see the next summer Olympics like they've never seen them before - on wide-screen, super-sharp television sets.

Three industry groups that have been competing for government approval of their high-definition TV systems announced Monday that henceforth they will work together to establish a new standard for the next generation of television.

This "grand alliance" should speed the advent of HDTV and avoid what were likely to be lengthy court battles had the Federal Communications Commission gone ahead with its plan to choose just one of the competing systems.

There were smiles all around at a news conference Monday.

"No one knows how soon (HDTV will be available)" said Joe Donahue, senior vice president of Thomson Consumer Electronics. "Before the

end of 1993 we'll have a good idea. ... In 1996, the summer Olympics will be in Atlanta. Wouldn't it be great to have commercial, high-definition broadcasting for 1996?"

Four systems have been developed by the three industry groups: General Instrument-Massachusetts Institute of Technology; Zenith-AT&T; and NBC-Thomson-Philips-David Sarnoff Research Center-Compression Labs Inc.

The groups Monday agreed to develop a single technology to be presented to the FCC next year.

The merger had been urged by the FCC's advisory committee on advanced television, chaired by attorney Richard Wiley, as the fastest way to get HDTV to market.

"It's great to see people working together to develop the best HDTV in the world," FCC Chairman James Quello said.

The advisory committee has been working for six years to get to this point. The process began with 14 groups proposing 23 concepts, Wiley said.

Through the years, the focus moved from analog to digital technology and only three consortia remained in the race. Over 16 months ending last February, each system was tested.

At the conclusion, none emerged as clearly superior to the others, leading the advisory committee to recommend an alliance that would incorporate the best of each and allow all the companies to enjoy patent revenues for their efforts.

Besides entertainment, HDTV is expected to find business and scientific uses. Intricate medical procedures, for example, could be demonstrated over HDTV with details not possible on today's TV.

Unlike the analog HDTV systems in Japan and elsewhere in the world, the digital technology of the system being built here offers more capacity for growth as all communications technologies make the transition to digital, the basis of today's computers.

Each of the U.S. consortia has invested millions of dollars in HDTV development. The testing process, primarily funded by the industry, cost another \$24 million.

More testing will be conducted on the hybrid system born of the merger. If it meets the advisory committee's expectations, the committee, which comprises the most powerful companies in television, will recommend that the FCC approve it. Then manufacturing can begin.

HDTV will require major investments in new equipment by TV stations and networks, as well as

costly new wide-screen, stereo sound sets for viewers. For the foreseeable future, programs will be simulcast, with broadcasters sending HDTV on one channel and traditional broadcasts signals on another.

HDTV sets are expected to initially cost \$1,000 to \$2,000 more than the highest priced wide-screen sets of today, but the costs are expected to drop considerably as more sets are manufactured.





## NCAA hardballers seek CWS crown

Fans of college baseball should get ready to hear the crack of the (aluminum) bat this week as both ESPN and CBS provide coverage of the 1993 College World Series.

ESPN reports from Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha, Neb., from Sunday, June 6, through Friday, June 11, for games 6-14. The CBS team, featuring Greg Gumble, Jim Kaat and Leslie Visser, presents the championship game on Saturday, June 12.

It may be difficult for any team to match the excitement level generated by last year's Pepperdine University team, which beat Cal State Fullerton in the final game to complete an undefeated run to its first NCAA Division I Baseball Championship.

The CWS' long and storied tradition began in 1947 when California beat a Yale team led by first baseman George Herbert Walker Bush two games to none to win college baseball's first championship series.

After a one-year stopover in Wichita, Kan., the CWS settled into Rosenblatt Stadium in 1950. That Nebraska debut saw Jim Ehler of Texas throw the first CWS no-hitter against Tufts as the Longhorns became the first team to successfully defend its CWS title.

Historically, teams from the South and West have dominated the series. In 1989, Wichita State became the first team outside of Arizona, California, Texas or Florida to win the CWS.



A: Star Trek: The Official Fan Club handles all three "Star Trek" series. Annual membership costs \$11.95 and includes a membership kit full of collectibles, a quarterly catalog of memorabilia and merchandise that can be purchased, plus a subscription to "The Official Star Trek Magazine" (published bimonthly). **Q: Where did Counselor Troi of "Star Trek: The Next Generation" learn to speak in such a precise manner? Do I detect an accent?**

A: Marina Sirtis, who plays Troi on the series, was born in London to Greek parents. However, she disguises her English inflection with an accent she developed for the role. "In the 24th century," she says, "geographic or nationalistic barriers are not so evident. The Earth as a planet is your country, your nationality. I didn't want anyone to be able to pin down my accent to any particular country, and being good at accents, the producers trusted me to come up with something appropriate."

**Q: I just saw "The Dark Half." I was waiting through the whole movie to see Stephen King in a cameo role. I didn't see him, but did I just miss him? And do you have an address where I could write to him?**

A: King didn't make a cameo in "The Dark Half." ## HEALTH CARE REFORM IS COMING

Rural hospitals have learned during the last few years that we must adjust to change or perish. The American health care system will probably undergo the biggest change in this century within the next few months. These changes will affect Americans who live in urban as well as those of us who live in rural areas.

Our goal—to provide the best health care possible for the people of Hereford and the area—will remain the same. But we may have to make radical changes in the way we do business. Cost containment for hospitals means three choices: cut staff, cut services, or freeze wages. None of these options are desirable. According to Dick Davidson, president of the American Hospital Association, "People are realizing that, far from bringing instant gratification, health care reform is likely to bring immediate pain."

There are two primary directions that reform could take:

- 1) a centralized health care system in which national health insurance would be administered and underwritten by the government or
- 2) a system that retains the parts of the health care system that are working and reforms those which are not.

Although no one knows for sure what final form those recommendations will take, experts predict that the reform package will have at least the following components: enacting insurance reform, encouraging managed care, expanding Medicaid to reach all living below the poverty line, and reforming the tort system (malpractice).

During the next few weeks, you will be bombarded with a flurry of complicated information about health care reform. This issue is so important that

Some coming changes might not be the kind we want. Please stay aware of what is


happening in the area of health care reform. We must be involved in the reform process, alerting our representatives in government when we have concerns and opinions.

And please let us at the Hospital know when you have questions or comments about Hospital services. We must have your input to make sure that we continue to provide the services you need and deserve.



Deaf Smith General Hospital had a record month in March, with every indicator showing growth over March of 1992.

In March 1993, DSGH had 161 patients compared to 118 in March 1992. Daily census was up to 31 from 18 a year ago. Outpatient visits jumped to 592 as compared to 435 in 1992. Emergency room visits were up to 748 for the month,

as compared to 571 in 1992. The higher numbers of patients caused a significant jump in the financial picture. Total Gross Patient Service Revenue for the month was \$1,099,415 compared to \$588,692 a year ago.

Several changes at the hospital in the last 12 to 18 months may account for the growth in patients. DSGH has refurbished patient rooms, added an occupation medicine program, and set up a long-range planning committee.

"The increased confidence of the community in our work is reflected in these numbers. Our staff at DSGH should be commended for their hard work, and continuing efforts to make DSGH a better hospital," Ron Rives said.
