## Death toll on the rise

KUWAIT (AP) - A number of suspects have been arrested in the bombing or two crowded seaside cafes in which 11 people died and 8 were injured, a security official said today
Authorities halted outgoing flights at guard boats patrolled Kuwait's territorial waters to try to seal all exits from the Persian Gulf country.
No one claimed responsibility for the Thursday bombings, the "A number of suspects have been arrested" said the security of ficial, who spoke only on condition he not be identified. "The two time bombs that ripped through the cafes were 25 kilograms ( 55 pounds) of TNT each, placed by terrorists on the grass under chairs
along the playgrounds of the cafes." Other officials said an unspeci suspects had been rounded unspecified number of Shilte Moslem Kuwait, including about 100,000 expatriate workers from Iran, Iraq and Lebanon.
Kuwait has been the target of terror attacks by Shittes who apparearold wr r against Iran. Iran is a Persian nation, not Arab, and is predominantly Shilte.
