Changes in food labeling should benefit consumers

Manufacturers of products
marketed as "fresh" leamed last month that the U.S. Food and Drug food labeling.
By November, the FDA will propose sweeping regulations that food labeling in 20 years claims using such terms as "light," "lite," "reduced, "low-fat" o have to start backing them up when the FDA rules become final, likely by November 1992 .
The new regulati
The new regulations, mandated by Act of 1990 , should benefit consumers the most, said Dr. Mary Kinney Bielamowicz, nutritionist with tha The new law requires that virtually all packaged foods contain nutrition information on the labels.

murderers whoare not executed to serve as least 30 years in prison before they could be considered for parole.

Thomas said the "business end" of the female honey bee has three parts: a hat allows the venom to flow into the victim; and two barbs that are hinged long the shaft's length. The sac pumps like a minuscule heart, about the size of a straight pin
head. As venom flows, muscles attached to the stinger alternately contract, digging the shaft deeper into Those muscles also are $\quad$ mact to the honey bee's intestines. So when a honey bee forcefully frees herself from the sting, the action rips away part of her body.
"Insects have boveins for blood," openly in the cavity. If you break an insect's body, it bleeds." As the bee's agony ends, the
victim's misery begins. The bee-less venom sac continues
to pump poison, taking some 10
minutes to empty if not removed. minutes to empty if not removed. (Don't tweeze it out, Thomas

Venom causes either a local or systemic reaction in the victim. That's because it is make of acids (which cause pain) and complex
proteins, to which some people are
allergic.
Most of us -- about 99.6 percent. Most of us -- about 99.6 percenc,
according to Thomas -- have a local reaction: pain and swelling. have a systemic allergy that requires nedical treatment, he said. "Allergic reactions differ for the stings of bees and, say, wasps, proteins," Thomas noted. "It's rare to be allergic to both. It makes as much sense to say that because you allergic to milk."
Systemic reactions to bee stings cause tingling on the palms, soles,
lips and tongue. The throat may

## MINDING YOUR OWN BUSINESS

Keeping Your Dollars
here was a time when I preferred playing softball to eating. For several years, I led our fast-pitch team in bearned as a hitter was to keep my eye on the ball. In the world of fast-pitch softball, if you look away after the pitcher has started his wind-up. you're an easy out.

In the world of small business, the same principle applies. You must stay alert so that you can take your best swing in any situation.

This is especially true in the area of keeping and managing the dollars you've earned. We frequently counse business owners and managers whose businesses are profitable. However, they often complain that there is never enough cash. The money came in during the month, but now it's gone.

The first step in getting a handle on where the money
is to examine your expenses. Cost control keeps your
dollars working for you, but it is only one part of a good fiscal management policy

Financial management is a process that uses the num bers generated by the businesses for making business decisions. These numbers come from accounting records and financia statements. Good recordkeeping is a prerequisite to good finan cial mat
Keep Your Eye on the Ball
Evenif you have good records and financial statements, it is hard to stay alert. Cost control is an expecially difficult area for the small business owner.

The most common reason that costs rise is that we relax and look away. We let up in financial management to pay some attention to our marketing program. We take our eye off the costball -- strike one.

Costs have a way of growing unnoticed. Several years ago, I worked as an independent consultant for a small business. The owner was concerned because money was shon. The company was growing, but there was very little available cash after the monthly bills were paid.

A close examination of the records showed that several costshad risen for no apparent reason. Janitorial expenses had dout of sight. Within a arly her and a out of sight. Within a week, the owner and I chopped nearly $\$ 3,000$ from the monthly operating budge

The expenses had grown unnoticed. The janitorial service company had proposed cleaning more often and the
wner had agreed. It was neither needed nor justified, so we educed the level of service.

Next, we reduced the use of supplies. The employees pitched in when they realized it was their potential raises they were wasting.

Finally, we analyzed the telephone bills. The owne had been guilty of making lengthy, primetime, long-distance alls. We found ways to cut his telephone time by 80 percent. As a result, he could spend more time solving other problems efore they becoame critical.
Pay What You Owe
Another area with which small businesses struggle is he payment of taxes. My philosophy here is to pay what you we, but not a penny more. Many business owners are guilty of letting deductions and write-offs slip through their fingers. If ou take your eye off the taxball, it's a sure strike two.

Unless you are a CPA or a tax specialist, you need to involve a professional in this area. Don't mess with the IRS Have someone who is a business tax specialist do your returns. et advice eariy. You cannot always accomplish tax eduction at the end of the year. Careful consideration of purchases, leases and expenditures at the beginning of the year can esult in considerable tax savings.

Don't strike out because you took your eye off the nancial ball. In the areas of cost control and tax reduction, Ben Franklin was right. A penny saved is a penny earned

"It's a very passionate story about a woman and her feelings for her amily, her children, her parents, her own life and her own mortality. People might turn it on because it's Jill Ireland, but I think the book's success is because of its originality. Kirk Douglas is recognized for his contributions to filmmaking on The American Film Institute Salutes Kirk Douglas, airing Thursday, May 23, on CBS.
"We have criteria that is for someone whose work has advanced the art of film and whose work has withstood the test of time," said the show's producer George Stevens Jr. "Over 45 years Kirk Dougla: has made 79 movies. A number of them are classics."
The actor was born Issur Danielovitch (later changed to Isidore ielovitch (later changed to isidore Demsky N Y. He wrestled profossionally dam, N.Y. He wrested professionally to support his studies at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts. Douglas made his Broadway debut in 1941, but World War II delayed his film debut until 1946, when he starred in The Strange Love of Martha Ivers. Three years later he emerged as a top-notch
star with his role in Chempion. star with his role in Champion.
In the 1950s, Douglas formed his own production company, which turned out quality movies such as Paths of Glory, Spartacus and Lonely Are the Brave. Still playing leading men in the 1970s, he began directing his films as well.
Following closely in Douglas' footsteps is his son Michael Douglas, who serves as host for the AFI salute. The father-son celebration made for a personal evening, Stevens said.
"Kirk was seated with his wife and his other three sons and his grandson, and so there was an element of generations to the evening," Stevens added.
Stevens' own involvement with the AFI spans generations. THE SHELTERING SKY: (1980; Starring Debra Winger and John Malkovich. If ever an "art film" was made for video, this is the one. The leisurely pace of The Sheltering Shy somehow is more acceptable on video. However, the sweeping grandeur of the desert of North Africa shrinks proportionally with the screen.
The film is Bernardo Bertolueci's (The Last Emperor) adaptation of Paul Bowles' classic, cult-favorite (semi-autobiographical) love story. Paul Bowles is an American composer, existentialist poet and novelist who, with his wife Jane, moved to Northern Africa in the 40s.
Filmed on location in the desert of North Africa, the film examines the disintegrating relationship between a married American couple who are lifelong travelers. Accompanied by a socialite friend, they journey to Tangier and the Sahara, where the ancient desert cultures transform the trio profoundly.
Debra Winger is Kit Moresby, a woman searching to rekindle the consuming love she and her husband once shared. John Malkovich is the strange and unresponsive husband; a oncepromising composer whose career is now stalled. George Tunner (Campbell Scott) is their friend - a man who aimlessly searches for amusement.
The real star, though, is the ancient culture of the desert, which inexorably transforms the three travelers under the spellbinding heat and light of the sheltering sky. This is a totally character-driven film, and the plot moves with such an excruciatingly slow pace that you will want to abandon it more than once. But, if you will be patient, not expect too much action, and remember that much of what is happening is from Paul and Jane Bowles' own life-experiences (he still lives in North Africa, Jane is now dead), you will be rewarded with a thought-piece held together with literate dialogue and brought to (semi) life by superb acting. Rated R for mature themes. Not for everyone, but still a good film for the thoughtful.
