## Study says recovery from alcoholism takes 5 years

Of the 129 inner-city youth who eventually became alcohol abusers, 37 percent had achieved
sobriety for three or more years by the time the study ended, when they were 60 .
Of the 52 college-educated men who eventually became alcohol
abusers, only 19 percent achieved abusers, only 19 percent achieved
sobriety of three years or longer by study's end, when they were
70 .

One-quarter of the inner-cit abusers were dead by age 60 , an 15 percent of the college-educate abusers were dead by that age.

## Gingrich lays out political strategy

Americand Washington" - with the GOP on the side of America. "We are working toward common sense solutions that are outside the
mainstream only to those in Washing"on," Gingrich wrote as part of a "strategic plan", he recently and congressional aides. and congressional aides.
Other election-year themes

emphasizing "the failing Clinton economy" and seeking to raise
doubts about the president's

integrity who can provide real,

In Gingrich's model, lawmakers are urged todepict themselves not as "purely political leaders" but as "community leaders who do politits for most Americans, politits is a

## Chinese spy satellite disappears from radar

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo.
AP) - Fears that part of a Chinese (AP) - Fears that part of a CChinese spy satellite falling from space would creens disappeared harmlessly over he south Atlantic.
In fact, Air Force trackers here aren't even sure whether the 2 -ton
capsule survived re-entry into Earth's atmosphere when its $17,000 \mathrm{mph}$ free fall ended late Monday night.
"If it survived re-entry, it should
