Twenty-six patients had both angioscopy and patients had both angioscopy and intravascular ultrasound performed intravascular ultrasound performed on the same lesion. Of the three techniques, only the angioscope identified thrombus and plaque uptures. "We found that thrombus and plaque rupture, which cannot be picked upon an angiogram, were the only predictors of bad outcomes," only predictors of bad outcomes," said Smalling.
