officials enacted Wednesday when they went to Stage 2 of the city's
emergency water demand-reduction emergency water demand-reduction
plan. The goal is to cut water use by plan. The goal is to cut water use by
15 percent. redouble their efforts to ritizens to
water use as a community" water use as a community," said Cit Manager Larry D. Gilley.
"We have very serious drough conditions developing that will pose major risks to the San Marcos River
and to the endangered species and to the endangered species
protected by federal law." In addition to the ban on unsolicit-
ed water, Stage 2 guidelines prohibi
residents to voluntarily reduce indoor
water use. Also prohibited is the water use. Also prohibited is the
aesthetice use of indoor or outdoor
water except with recycled water. water except with recycled water.
Fines for violations range from $\$ 50$ to $\$ 200$.
Earlier this week, the San Marcos Earlier this week, the San Marcos
City Council voted to pursue an agreement with the
Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority to jointly construct a water treatment
plant that would draw water from the plant that would draw water from the
Guadalupe River and Canyon Lake. The city currently relies on the Edwards Aquifer as its sole source of
water. Voters approved an $\$ 8.5$ million bond packagein 1990 to help
fund the plant. fund the plant.

 Survivors of bombing of Japan recall efforts during Florida reunionBy DENIS M. SEARLES
Associated Press Writer DENVER (AP) . After the Pacific fleet at Peearl Harbor, bad news seemed to follow bad news.

Fla., for their annual reunion and to toast the memory of departed comrades.
