## Library carpet bids re-opened at Commission meeting today

Deaf Smith County Commissioners this morning opened bids a second time to replace the county library's carpet, which after more than 20 years has begun to unravel in places.

New specifications will define eligible bids as those for woven carpet carrying the industry standard 1()-year warranty.

The original specifications called for, among other details, a 20-year warranty and sewn seams throughout the 1,000-square-foot library.

Commissioners originally budgeted the job at \$20,000.

Only one bid for two different grades of carpet was offered from an out-of-town dealer. The bids from Witt Builders Supply of Amarillo were each thousands of dollars in excess of the court's cost estimate. Neither of two local carpet companies bid the job.

One local dealer said the specifications, as written by County Librarian Rebecca Walls, foreclosed possibility of his participation.

Jerry Poarch of Poarch's Furniture and Carpet in Hereford said he Last month, the McDonald's and neither sold the specified carpet, nor could he meet the 20-year warranty

Jury Seated in DWI Case That Could Be Precedent Setting

CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas (AP) - A drunken-driving case could become precedent for deciding when a fetus is legally declared human in Texas. Frank Flores Cuellar is charged with intoxication manslaughter. He's being tried for the death of a child delivered by Caesarean section just hours after a traffic accident.

Defense attorney Anne Marshall argues that her client cannot be convicted because Krystal Zuniga was a fetus, not a human, at the time that Cuellar slammed his Chevrolet Blazer into another car on June 15.

Testimony was scheduled to begin today before a jury of six men and six women.

The mother, Jeannie Coronado, was 7 months pregnant at the time of the accident. The baby, weighing just 4 pounds, survived birth but suffered extensive brain damage and died 44 hours later.

Fort Worth Girl Undergoes Surgery At Duke; Full Recovery Expected DALLAS (AP) - Doctors expect 10-year-old Rachel Stout to recover fully from colon-removal surgery that followed her parents' monthlong battle against child welfare officials and doctors who recommended the

. Rachel was resting comfortably in good condition Monday at Duke University Medical Center after the procedure that doctors said was necessary to save her lifé from severe ulcerative colitis.

Rachel's parents, Steve and Patricia Stout, denied through their attorney Monday that the actions of Texas Child Protective Services prompted their eventual decision to allow the surgery.

But attorney Larry Friedman said the Stouts may yet suc CPS for trying to force the procedure. The Stouts allege that CPS actions hindered their

ability to seek alternative treatments for the girl. "They didn't have the opportunity to avail themselves of all the possibilities," Friedman said. "Their civil rights were definitely violated."



## MAP gives homeowners way to obtain insurance coverage

AUSTIN (AP) - Homeowners who've had trouble getting insurance and live in areas of the state designated as "underserved" will have a new way to help get coverage beginning today.

The Market Assistance Program (MAP) will use a computer bulletin board to match consumers who have been turned down for coverage by at least two licensed companies with other insurers that might want to write their policies.

Insurer participation in the plan, which will be phased in through early. next year, is voluntary.

The Texas Department of Insurance on Monday announced that insurers covering about 80 percent of the homeowner market in Texas have agreed to participate in the program.

"I am pleased with the reaction so will sign up as the program becomes better known," said Texas Insurance Commissioner Elton Bomer. "Through their voluntary participa-

Insurers initially were upset with a determination by the Insurance Department that nearly 30 percent of the state be designated as underserved for homeowner coverage. They claimed if that were the case, there would be a crisis situation deserving of attention by regulators and lawmakers.

Industry spokesman Jerry Johns, of the Southwestern Insurance Information Service, said insurers were prepared to move forward.







## Beebe stars off bench for Pack

**By ARNIE STAPLETON** AP Sports Writer GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) - Don

Beebe never had a bigger game, and it couldn't have come at a better time for the Green Bay Packers.

The 32-year-old receiver stepped in for the injured Robert Brooks and caught 11 passes for a career-best 220 yards as Green Bay beat San Francisco 23-20 in overtime Monday night before a record crowd of 60,716 at Lambeau Field.

"I've had four touchdowns in a game and I've had 10 catches," said Beebe, who played in four Super Bowls with Buffalo. "But. considering how this came out, I'd have to say this was my best game.'

Beebe, whose 220 yards were the third-highest in the Packers' 76-year history, had a 13-yard catch that helped set up Chris Jacke's 53-yard field goal, the longest overtime kick in NFL

He also had a controversial 59-yard catch for a touchdown that sparked the Packers' comeback from a 17-6 deficit in the third period.

Brooks, Brett Favre's favorite receiver and Green Bay's best deep threat, was lost for the season with a knee injury on the Packers' first offensive play. He landed awkwardly when 49ers cornerback Tyronne Drakeford pulled him down.

"It's a shame," said coach Mike Holmgren, who said Brooks would undergo surgery this week.

This was a game between two of the NFL's best teams that lived up to its billing as the 49ers tried to reverse a 27-17 playoff loss last scason.

For most of the game, it looked like San Francisco would win. Led by Dana Stubblefield, Lee Woodall and Marquez Pope, the 49ers (4-2) dominated on defense. limiting Green Bay to 68 yards rushing and forcing Favre to pass a team-record 61 times. He

-- Don't use abbreviations. It's tempting to abbreviate and save money if ads are billed by the line. Brand ads are billed by the word, so spell them out so readers won't be confused trying to figure out abbreviations.

-- Don't be misleading. Think accurate and factual when you write. Be sure to include a phone number and the best times to reach you.

## Women give less money to politics, but give more time

By RONDA TEMPLETON San Antonio Express-News SAN ANTONIO - If money talks, lot of women are whispering when

it comes to politics. Political activists say more women are contributing to campaigns, but their pockets aren't nearly as deep as

their male counterparts'. Hard data is difficult to come by, but professional money-gatherers say women don't give as often, or as much, as men.

Yet by some estimates, women outnumber men 10-to-1 in the army of volunteers that provides "sweat labor" - block-walking, envelope-stuffing and the like.

While men write big checks and accept public kudos, women toil behind the scenes in less glamorous

Marjorie Margolies-Mezvinsky, president of the Women's Campaign Fund and a former Pennsylvania congresswoman, described her fundraising efforts this way: "A handful of people came through for me, saying: 'I will raise \$25,000 for you.'

"Not one was a woman." And, she noted, household income

is not always the telling factor. Solicit a financially healthy couple 'and get the man on the phone and he'll give you \$1,000. The woman will give you \$100 or \$200," she explained.

Political experts predict the money gap will keep women candidates from achieving their goal: political parity with men on the local, state and national levels.

To combat the dilemma, organizations that raise funds for female candidates are springing up in the form of political action committees,

The prototype for such groups is EMILY's List, which stands for "Early Money Is Like Yeast it makes the dough rise."

The Democratic abortion-rights group this election cycle has raised more than \$9 million, six times what donated to women candidates during the 1990 campaign.

We've found that men can tap into the \$1,000 donor crowd a lot casier than women can," said EMILY's List founder Ellen Malcolm. "So women rely on direct more." mail, which is very expensive.

Margolics-Mczvinsky agreed, saying a few fund-raisers are "trying to go down to the local level to make sure we have a farm team."

She estimated the Women's Campaign Fund will dole out \$1.5 million to pro-choice Republican and Democrat candidates this year, stressing that money is key to unlocking the boys' club of politics.

Margolics-Mezvinsky noted that women were annoyed because President Clinton's male backers took center stage the night of his presidential victory.

"In order to get up on that stage, you had to have raised a quarter-of-amillion dollars," she said. "The

women. Women most often contribute to candidates who strike an emotional chord on issues related to housing,

Campaign veterans agree: Politicians' war rooms are full of women dedicated to envelope-stuffing, telephone soliciting, block-walking and vote-gathering.

Women "see the open spot, we see the weakness, and we squeeze ourselves into that spot," Vaught said. "We're used to taking care of the house, taking care of the job. taking care of the laundry.

"I have cleaned toilets in political campaigns, and that's something I would barely do at home."

Maria Berriozabal, a five-term San Antonio city council woman and one of the first Hispanic females to mount a serious big-city mayoral campaign, said women's issues - housing, education, children and family - are not the glamour issues that generate big bucks.

"Whether we like it or not, it's still a male-dominated world and there's still a good ol' boy system,' Berriozabal said.

Fund-raising is particularly difficult for Hispanic and black women, she said. The women who supported her campaigns sacrificed to donate a dollar, \$10 or \$25. Some dipped into their savings to give.

"It was a lot of small contributions from bingo, from raffles, from T-shirts and pins," she said. "Women will give if they know their

dollar is going to count." And even if they don't hand over large amounts, Berriozabal said, women are far more generous with their time than are men.

"To me, that's so important," she said. "Women are the ones that are the life-blood of a campaign. When women find an attractive candidate.

they're going to do their all." Two-term City Councilwoman

"I say time is more valuable than Perez Ferguson said female money," Burke said, "Women can volunteer their hearts."







## Citation against student dismissed, district defends tickets for swearing

AZLE, Texas (AP) - An Azle High School nimh-grader charged with two counts of disorderly conduct had one of the tickets dropped by a judge Monday night because of a technicali-

Municipal Judge Wynette Parchman ruled that a ticket issued to 14-year-old student Chris Gordon for calling another student a "fat cow" was invalid because it wasn't signed by a complainant, the girl who was the target of the boy's alleged

The judge left intact, at least for now, a second ticket against Gordon for allegedly using profanity during a flag football game.

American Civil Liberties Union attorney Craig Watkins asked that the second ticket also be dropped because it doesn't specify what words Gordon used. Parchman said she would rule on the ticket Oct. 28.

The student said Monday night that the whole incident has aggravated

because this is always on my mind."

The boy's mother, Phyllis Gordon, Santo Forte has said. said the school went too far in issuing the citations. They're among hundreds of tickets that have been issued, with the blessing of school officials, for a variety of offenses.

Monday's pre-trial hearing, just for Azle students, was packed. Most of the students pleaded guilty.

"This is serious - he's been charged with a criminal offense," Mrs. Gordon said. "This is absurd and it's not going to hold up in court. That's what happened tonight." "They didn't even do any of the

things schools normally do when a child gets in trouble ... They didn't ask for a parent conference, they didn't even paddle him," she said.

Azle police, in the past two years, have issued 540 citations to high school and junior high school students for a variety of offenses, including 139 for offensive language. "If you come to my school and

AUSTIN - Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock wants tougher rules of conduct for those who oversee Texas' nursing homes and he wants

the rules adopted right away. In a letter to the Texas Board of Nursing Facility Administrators, Bullock pushed the agency to adopt the rules at its Oct. 18 meeting. It normally would take months to overhaul the agency's regulations.

Proposed rules would require nursing home administrators to keep a sufficient number of trained workers on duty, protect residents from harm and ensure that residents have proper medical treatment and

Mike Hailey, press secretary to Bullock, told the Austin American-Statesman, "The residents of some of the facilities have waited long enough for an assurance that standards are going to improve."

Attorney General Dan Morales said the tougher nursing home independent agency is given power suggested his office would be the new set of rules.

Problems at nursing homes came to light and drew state officials' attention last month when the American-Statesman published a report on its months-long investigation of the Texas Home of Nursing Home Administrators.

The American-Statesman found

pervasive problems in the board's regulation of the state's 2,700 nursing home administrators. The newspaper discovered staff short-ages, sloppy record-keeping and failure to follow through on disciplinary action proposed by the agency's own members.

#### Tax Abatements Hurt Education

Meanwhile, Bullock called for an end to school property tax abatements, which cost public schools about \$143 million in funding last year, according to a study released by the Scnate Economic Development Committee.

While speaking last week to the Association of Texas Colleges and Universities, Bullock said it's wrong for some businesses to ask for property tax abatements while calling for a better-educated work

"The very idea of industry coming in to Texas and saying they want tax breaks before they will locate in Hillsboro, Houston and Dallas is beyond my comprehension.
