## Texas Republicans hope to take control of legislative chamber

 AUSTIN (AP) - They've go targets, they've got candidates, they've got a slogan. What remains to be seen iswhether Texas Republicans have the votes todo somemething they ve never of a chamber in the Texas Legisla ture. Last spring, Republicans looked
at the 150 -member House and about " 76 in '96" - the te and talke of seats needed to control that chamber.

They looked at the 31-member Senate, where they already hold 14
seats, and talked about the two ceas, and naiked about the two
victories needed to take charge there. They recruited candidates to
challenge Democratic incumbents and run in open districts. They attacked Democratic legislative leaders over taxes, spending and, well, longtime Democratic control. But with President Clinton and Bob Dole running a close race, the "I've been saying I hope we get majority. But I think a gain of five to six would be terrific in the House or us. In the state Senate, I would hope we would win at least one,"
said state GOP Chairman Tom Pauken.
In presidential race, we have got to be presidential race, we have got to be
realistic about our prospects. I think Sen. (Phil) Gramm's strong showing
will helpour down-ballot cand will helpourdown-ballot candidates. turnout - that's the critical ingredient," Pauken said.
State Democratic leaders voice "I'm thinking about a program called '98 in '98,"' said Bill White, Democratic Party chairman, as he
eyed the Texas House lineup eyed the Texas House, White said Texas voters are turned
off to the socially conservative off to the socially conservative
agenda pushed by some Republican agenda pushed by some Repubican
candidates, and he said Clinton won't candidates, and he said Clinton won't
