The strike was called late Sunday night after members of the union voted 227-74 in favor of rejecting a new contract offered the guards by Mason & Hanger Corp., which operates the plant.

Pantex spokeswoman Vanesa Hamilton said the corporation already has offered the International Guards Union of America Local 38 the best possible proposal.

She said Monday there is nothing else to offer and that Mason & Hanger have no plans to restart negotiations.

City receives \$72,608 check on sales taxes

The City of Hereford has been sent a check for \$72,608 as its rebate on the 1.5 percent city sales tax. This payment includes sales taxes collected in January and reported by businesses filing monthly returns in February.

The tax rebate payment was 13.4 percent smaller than last month's The city has received check. \$249,881 for the three checks issued for 1997, a 4.3 percent loss over the same time a year ago.

Deaf Smith County is receiving a check for \$26,419 on its half-cent sales tax. This compares to \$33,552 last month, or a 21.2 percent drop. The year-to-date total is \$85,737 a drop of 9.8 percent over the same period a year ago.

Amarillo's check on a 2 percent tax amounted to \$2,785,561, or an increase of 8.6 per cent over last month. The year-to-date total is almost \$9.8 million, up 1.09 percent. Lubbock's monthly check on a 1.125 percent tax was \$1,774,672

Bank robberies in North Texas at steady climb

DALLAS (AP) - It's time to initiate a high-tech war against the brazen robbers and sophisticated con artists who are preying on Texas banks, federal authorities and bank officials say.

Bank representatives, FBI agents and federal prosecutors met Monday to discuss plans to upgrade equipment, create a computer database and re-evaluate security procedures.

Since the beginning of this year, the FBI reports there's been 52 bank robberies in North Texas - one every day and a half. That pace is almost three times ahead of last year at this time.

The regions surrounding Houston and San Antonio also have reported big jumps in robberies since the year began.

In addition to robberies, bank representatives and FBI officials said they were concerned about a 53 percent jump in check fraud losses in Dallas since 1995.


Roy C. Urrutia has been named by Energas as the manager of public affairs for the Amarillo-Hereford-Pampa area.

U.S. Attorney Paul Coggins said 10 North Texas law enforcement agencies are building a database that will allow them to track criminals more effectively across county lines.

We're not here to protect a building or a pile of cash, we're here to protect the people," Coggins said. "Bank robberies can have a high cost in human life and check fraud costs us all in the form of higher prices."

The database will be used to sort robberies and check fraud cases by the suspects' characteristics and their method of operation. Prosecutors hope this will help link suspects to unsolved cases.

"These guys skip across county lines so that we can't track their (modus operandi)," Coggins said. "And if they get caught, we usually are only able to prosecute them for one or two crimes. This should help minimize that."

The bankers also received advice from FBI agents about security. They encouraged banks to buy top-of-the--line equipment and make sure it works.

"We have to make sure that when these people are in banks that we secure what we need to track them down later," said Jim Adams, assistant agent in charge of the Dallas FBI office.

Coggins said he has heard from more than one frustrated prosecutor about a bank security camera tape so blurry that it was unusable as evidence.

'Those kinds of mistakes allow robbers to slip through the cracks,' he said

Agents stressed that the rise in check fraud indicates that it has become a big business.







STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -Trapped along the baseline by two Stanford defenders, Rene Hanebutt dribbled the ball out of bounds off her foot and clasped her hands to her head in despair.

That play epitomized Texas Tech's frustration Monday night during a 67-45 loss to the Lady Cardinal in the second round of the West Regionals. And it was a feeling common to all visitors at Maples Pavilion this season.

Even with All-American Kate Starbird struggling through her worst game of the season, Stanford had little trouble reaching the round of 16 for the 10th consecutive year.

Olympia Scott scored 19 points and volleyball defector Kristin Folkl added 11 as Stanford overcame unusually bad outside shooting by dominating inside to defeat 396 Texas Tech.

Stanford (32-1), which opened with a 27-9 run and led by at least nine points the rest of the way, tied a school record with its 23rd straight win and extended the nation's longest home winning streak to 47 games.

"This is a very good game for us, because we had to do things we normally don't do," said Stanford coach Tara VanDerveer. "Our

Her finished was three spots higher than teammate Emily Hafliger, who took fifth at 99-0.



Notre Dame rides St. Patrick Dav pride to upset of third-seeded Texas

AUSTIN (AP) - Beth Morgan scored 29 points, including six free throws in the final two minutes, to lift Notre Dame to an 86-83 victory over Texas in the second round of the NCAA East Regional on Monday night.

Katryna Gaither also scored 29 points as the Irish women's team reached the Round of 16 for the first time. Notre Dame (29-6) will face left. Alabama (26-6) Saturday in Columbia, S.C.

"That's the kind of position you want to be in," said Morgan, the school's all-time leading career scorer. "You're either going home or going home with a victory."

Texas' Danielle Viglione hit five 3-pointers and led the Longhorns (22-8) with 19 points.

"That was one of the most exciting games I've coached since I've been at Notre Dame," said Irish Coach Muffet McGraw in her 15th season at Notre Dame.

Notre Dame's previous best tournament effort was a year ago when the Irish lost to Texas Tech in the second round.

Notre Dame punished the

Longhorns inside in the first half behind Gaither and Rosanne Bohmann, who was perfect from the field to score 16.

The Irish extended a 42-40 halftime lead to nine before Texas rallied to lead 79-74 by stacking its. defense inside to surround Gaither and Bohmann. But Notre Dame regained the lead with consecutive 3-pointers by Sheila McMillen and Morgan, making it 80-79 with 2:20

Morgan's free throws the rest of the way held off the Longhorns. who had a chance to take the lead, taking possession with 19.5 seconds left. But Morgan rebounded a missed shot and was fouled with 9.9 seconds remaining.

She made both free throws, and a desperation 3-point attempt by reserve Kim Lummus was partially blocked by Gaither, and time expired as Morgan gained possession.

"We did a good job early on Gaither and then we just didn't pay enough attention," said Texas Coach Jody Conradt. "You can't afford not to be attentive all the time to where she and Morgan are. Texas used a 15-6 run - including

three straight field goals by freshman center Carla Littleton - to get back in the game. Viglione hit a 3pointer with 11:51 left to tie the game 60-60.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) -Elvis Grbac just couldn't quite get used to California.


So the Cleveland native is happy to be back home in the Midwest after signing a five-year contract Monday with the Kansas City Chiefs.



First of 'plentiful' bluebonnets may start blooming in few days

WACO, Texas - Days of gray rainy skies earlier this year will soon mean miles of brilliant blue roadsides when bluebonnets explode into bloom.

After a pathetic showing during the drought of 1996, the Texas state flower is expected to burst into bloom

along Texas roads in a week or two. "It'll look great," said Doug Andrews, McLennan County extension agent. "With all the moisture we've had, it should be pretty good."

Helen Havelka, a Texas Depart-. ment of Transportation spokeswoman, said the bluebonnets are "plentiful" this year and may start blooming within a few days. "We're kind of excited about this

year," Ms. Havelka said.

Of course, the prolific rainfall may also excite the growth of weeds, Andrews said.

But bluebonnets should remain in clear view in most areas, he added. There's a lot of seed out there

and it appears the bluebonnet season is going to be nice," Andrews said.

Already bluebonnets are showing their true colors on Highway 84 West near Loop 340, Ms. Havelka said.

"It looks like we'll have a lot of them in our district," Ms. Havelka said. McLennan County's Department of Transportation district includes seven other area counties.

Central Texas gardeners should be pleased as well, say local nursery owners.

"It should be a pretty good showing this year," said Steve Pierce, co-owner of Gardens by Genesis Nursery.

For first-time planting, bluebonnet seeds are sowed in the fall and the blooms appear the following spring, Pierce said.

After that, the flowers "keep coming back year after year," he said.

However, Ms. Havelka said, the Department of Transportation's (bluebonnet) line is the same number used for highway conditions, so information on bluebonnets will not be available in the event of emergency road conditions.

Two Central Texas towns will hold bluebonnet festivals this season:

On March 22, downtown Lorena will host a bluebonnet festival from 10, a.m. to 4 p.m., where Central Texas vendors will sell their arts and crafts.

-On April 12, the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers will host the Lake Whitney Bluebonnet Festival from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Lofers Bend Day Use Park.

Activities include an Environmental and Heritage Fair, a children's fishing tournament, food, games, door prizes, a 5K run, a one-mile fun run and a volleyball tournament.



* Walk at a pace that allows you to breath comfortably as you walk.

*Pay careful attention to the shoes you choose. Wear supportive shoes and walk on a grass or cushioned surface is possible.

*Avoid walking in extreme heat or cold.

Swimmers with arthritis should remember to swim only with a lifeguard present. "Warming up and cooling down are an important part of any exercise," Ms. Backus said. "When swimming, start at a slower pace and then work up to a faster HRMC, 364-2141, ext. 243. pace, slowing down again as you near the end of your exercise.

Those who swim in cool water should finish their exercise with a warm shower or bath.

Water exercise can be beneficial for those with arthritis. "If possible, wear water shoes to help prevent falls on wet, slippery surfaces," she said. "Sometimes a flotation device is helpful to maintain buoyancy if the hops and knees are painful. Adjust the pace of your exercise so that you



Bicycling, either on a stationary or outside bike, can be helpful. "Pedal with the ball of your foot, and be sure that the seat is adjusted so that the knee is comfortably straight at the bottom of the stroke," she said. Forty-three years after its debut, Ford Motor Co. is grounding the Thunderbird, but says it will return again as a smaller, sportier coupe in a few years.

Ford confirmed Monday it will cease production of the T-Bird and its structural sibling, the Mercury Cougar, along with the Ford Probe coupe and Ford Aerostar minivan at the end of the 1997 model year.

Declining sales were blamed for the cuts, which will force about 2,500 people out of work.

Customer preferences are changing and we must provide the products our customers want and value," said Jac Nasser, president of Ford's automotive operations.




