So two years ago the State of Texas adopted a radical vast majority of responsible businesses audit their own operations and concentrate enforcement efforts on the eally bad offenders.
The key to making this system work is that the Texas law assumes most businesses are acting in good faith, want
to comply with the law and shouldn't be penalized for taking steps on their own initiative to see that they do. Case in point: A Houston-based manufacturer wanted to conduct an audit of it own compliance efforts, but was reluctant to do so for fear that if it found violations the information could result in legal proceedings and fines. Because it is a small company with fewer than 50 employ es, committing resources to an audit was difficult- until

"The heavy rains caused
downstream flooding around Uvalde,
Medina and Bexar counties," Pena
