Celebrations mark new life of Hong Kong under China after 156-year colonial rule

HONG KONG (AP) - Starting briskly, Hong Kong launched its new life as part of China today with pageantry and purpose, inaugurating a new leader, a new legislature, even a new symphony of its very own.

Chinese authorities responded tolerantly to early challenges, with police halting downtown traffic for a peaceful march by about 3,000 pro-democracy activists.

Newly sworn-in lawmakers worked through the night to ratify bills they approved earlier, including one that would allow police to ban such demonstrations. Then they emerged into Hong Kong's foggy, rain-soaked first dawn under Chinese rule.

Ten hours after the handover, in the same building, new Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa and Chinese President Jiang Zemin joined a mostly Chinese crowd of dignitarics future. at an elaborate celebration of the territory's new identity.

"Today is a momentous day for China. Today is a joyous day for all Chinese people," Tung said. He promised to forge a future of economic prosperity and continued rule of law.

The morning-after celebration featured a 20-minute symphony the "one country, two systems" called "Heaven, Earth, Mankind," written just for the handover.

Jiang seemed buoyant and unaffected by the late hours he kept economic reforms in the 1980s, while swearing-in the Beijing-backed devised "one country, two systems"


Marshal urges fireworks caution catching fire from rockets, firecrack





New postage rate expected in spring with one-cent rise

WASHINGTON (AP) - The post office is going to ask Americans to fork over another penny to mail a letter, possibly by spring.

The Postal Service Board of Governors voted today to seek an increase to 33 cents in the price of a first-class stamp. The current 32 cent rate took effect in Jan. 1, 1995.

And in a rare move to cut prices the board also proposed a new 30-cent rate for bill payments and other transactions using reply envelopes that can be handled easily by automated machinery.

For a person who mailed 300 letters a year, a penny increase in stamp prices would raise annual postage costs by \$3.

"Today a penny doesn't go very far. But a penny per stamp is all we need. It is just enough to safeguard universal mail service for the United States, a vital national interest. And it is just enough to offset high costs in 1998 and 1999 and carry this organization successfully into the year 2000," said Tirso Del Junco, chairman of the agency's governing board.

This is just the first step in a complex process that can take nearly a year before any increase actually takes effect. The board said any new rate would not take effect before May 1998.

Each penny increase means nearly \$1 billion more annually for an agency that, while it made record profits in the last two years, faces declining revenues and rising costs in coming years.

Besides first-class mail, increases are also likely for other classes of mail - including magazines and catalogs, parcels and those items that the post office doesn't like to call junk mail.

The decision to seek an increase comes amid concern that asking for too steep a rise would reduce business already being lost to fax machines, the Internet and high-speed delivery services.

Managers also have to plan ahead. Forecasts call for the postal service

to make a profit this year but then to fall into the red as salaries and other costs increase.

In 1994, when the post office last sought an increase, a coalition of major mailers supported the agency. This time it could be more contentious. Already questions are being raised by organizations that raise funds for charity by mail and a coalition of businesses that mail bills, magazines and other high-volume mailers.

Under the complex system for raising rates, any increase proposed now could not take effect until at least next spring.

Millions of stamps with the letter "H" instead of a price have already been printed for use at whatever the new rate turns out to be.

Any increase the Postal Service proposes has to go before the independent Postal Rate Commission which can, and sometimes does, come up with a different answer. The commission has 10 months to study the case, during which it holds hearings and listens to competitors, businesses and others who want to comment on the proposed rate.

Then it issues its own recommendation which the post office can accept, ask for reconsideration or overrule if the governors vote unanimously.

Postmaster General Marvin Runyon has complained about the long delays in this process and asked for a simpler procedure. A House committee is considering changes in the rate-making process as well as other changes for the postal service.

For many years after its 1971 independence, the Postal Service operated on an approximate three-year cycle, making money one year, breaking even the second and losing money the third year followed by a rate increase and a return to profit. The agency no longer receives any tax subsidy to operate.

Under Runyon, rate increases have come less often and in the last two years the post office reported profits of more than \$1 billion each year, using the funds to reduce outstanding debt in addition to operations.






UT sets sights on building largest college grid stadium

AUSTIN (AP) - The Eyes of Texas are upon the biggest football stadium in all the land.

The University of Texas, already preparing to expand the Big 12 Conference's largest football stadium, is setting its sights on a 115,500-seat arena with 200 luxury boxes.

A college football stadium that size would be the nation's largest.

It also would cost far more than the nearly \$92 million in **Royal-Memorial Stadium renovations** and other UT athletics projects now under way.

In a story published Monday by the Austin American-Statesman, UT athletics officials said the dream, outlined in a stadium master plan, is merely a vision for the future. The package doesn't even have a price tag

"We haven't put pencil to paper," said Doug Messer, senior associate thletics director in charge of finances.

Austin Gleeson, a physics professor and chairman of the campus master plan committee, said he had heard various estimates - ranging from \$130 million to \$150 million.

He said it was his impression that the additional expansion would begin when the current projects are completed, in 1999. But athletics department officials said there is no formal timetable.

"Our children might not see this happen," Messer said. But he added, "I'm optimistic that, probably, we can.

At present, UT is focusing on a stadium expansion project that will seat up to 85,000. Royal-Memorial currently seats 75,512. The expanded

stadium will include 66 new luxury skyboxes. The UT Board of Regents has approved those projects.

Sports

The rest of the master plan expansion to 115,500 seats and other amenities - has been accepted in principle only.

"We certainly don't have the wherewithal ... to do that (now),' said DeLoss Dodds, UT athletics director.

The stadium expansion and other athletics projects have been a lightening rod on campus in recent nonths.

Some professors say sports already are overemphasized. They argue that the fund-raising priorities should be on academics.

"I call it the edifice complex," said Karl Galinsky, a classics professor who serves on the campus building committee.



Attorney seeks refund of pay-per-view fees

DALLAS (AP) - A Dallas attorney is trying to get a refund for all the pay-per-view customers who spent \$49.95 or more to watch Mike Tyson fight Evander Holyfield and instead saw Tyson bite Holyfield.

Lawyer Stephen J. Gugenheim filed a federal lawsuit Monday against Tyson and Don King Productions Inc. that he hopes will repay all the fight's pay-per-view buyers, with interest.

"The majority of the individuals who purchased the pay-per-view show from Don King Productions are upset," Gugenheim said. "They think they were scammed. There was supposed to be a fight and there wasn't a fight.'

In the third round of Saturday night's fight, Tyson chewed off a chunk of Holyfield's right ear, then bit into the left ear and was disqualified.

Gugenheim claims in the eight-page complaint that Tyson willfully and intentionally, knowing that it would result in his disqualification and thus the termination of the fight, bit Holyfield's ear again."

Ben Owens, another Dallas attorney, is listed as the lawsuit's plaintiff, but Gugenheim is asking for the case to be made a class-action so any of the estimated 2 million pay-per-view customers can try getting back their money.

At \$49.95 or \$59.95 per order, the lawsuit seeks actual damages of about \$100 million to \$120 million from Tyson and King Productions. Attorney's fees and interest could add to the total.

"The general consensus is that people were ripped off," Gugenheim said. "Neither Mike Tyson nor Don King Productions should get any



KIRKLAND, Wash. (AP) - Even though billionaire Paul G. Allen was out of the country, his people exercised his option for him - and bought the Seattle Seahawks as promised.

Allen also cut ticket prices Monday for the Kingdome's cheapest seats to \$10, lowest in the NFL.

Bob Whitsitt, president of the Football Northwest organization formed by Allen to manage his bid to buy the team, flourished his pen to sustained whoops, cheers and applause Monday from several dozen people at the club's headquarters in this Seattle suburb.

He was ready to sign two documents, a letter notifying Seahawks owner Ken Behring that Allen would go through with the \$200 million deal and a letter of intent between Football Northwest and King County to build a new stadium.

"And here we go," Whitsitt said, signing the papers. He expects approval by other NFL owners later this summer.

Under the new operation, Whitsitt will remain president of Football Northwest, the team owner. Allen will be chairman, with Bert Kolde as vice chairman.

Demolition of the Kingdome is scheduled to begin in January 2000, and completion of the new stadium is set for July 2002.

"We can't find a better owner than Paul Allen," said Gov. Gary Locke, who was present for the signing.

The governor said he would announce by the end of the week his seven appointees to a public stadium authority that is being formed to oversee construction and operation of the new gridiron complex.

Allen said he would purchase the team if voters approved a plan to build a \$425 million open-air football stadium and exhibition hall. They did so in a June 17 election.

The ticket-price change affects seats that previously cost \$33, \$28 and \$19 in the upper reaches of the third level, known as the Kingdome's "nosebleed" section. More than three-fourths are around the end zone facing the replay screen, and the rest are between the goal lines.

Cal Ripken, elected to play in his 15th All-Star game, was second with 2,571,985.

Completing the starting lineup for the AL team are Texas catcher Ivan Rodriguez (1,666,384), Tino Martinez (866,722), Baltimore second baseman Roberto Alomar (1,657,418), Seattle shortstop Alex Rodriguez (1,854,758), Mariners designated hitter Edgar Martinez (1,213,429), Cleveland outfielder David Justice (1,840,716) and Baltimore outfielder Brady Anderson (1,197,617).

Final NL totals will be released Tuesday. Reserves for the July 8 game at Jacobs Field in Cleveland will be announced Wednesday.





TV fiction most often portrays bad guys as business owners, corporate executives

in the gray flannel suit should be wearing prison stripes. The American businessman will steal your money, your company, your spouse. When he makes a killing, the bodies are real.

If you're sputtering that Uncle Bix is truly a swell guy (and those insider-trading allegations never were proved) please understand: We're not talking reality here, we're talking television.

Businessmen (and some women) are the bad guys of TV fiction, committing more crimes than those in other fields - even common crooks - and generally acting like scoundrels, according to a new study. The survey of 863 network

sitcoms, dramas and TV movies over a 26-month period from 1995 to early 1997 was done for the Media Research Center, a conservative


watchdog group. In short, business people tend to fall between J.R. Ewing of "Dallas" and Mr. Burns of "The Simpsons" human oil slick or nuclear disaster.

Just how bad is TV's portrayal? Of the 514 criminal characters found during the survey period, nearly 30 percent were business owners or corporate executives.

By comparison, less than 10 percent of the criminals were career scofflaws; lawyers were just 1 percent.

Entrepreneurs, meanwhile, were busy making a living by dealing drugs ("Beverly Hills, 90210"), kidnap-ping ("Nash Bridges") or selling defective gear to the military.

"Everybody's got a family to feed. Lieutenant, even people who work for corporations," an unrepentant defense contractor says on "JAG." The trophy for most murderous on

"We need villains," a network insider explained to Fortune magazine. "And if we portray businessman as not caring about society or their employees, would we be all wrong?"

Says Timothy Lamer, the study's team leader, "That shows a mindset in Hollywood, that businessmen don't contribute to society, that they are oppressive of the employees."

There certainly is an amusing irony at work here.

The major broadcast networks, which have yet to file for tax-exempt charity status, are merrily pouring forth venal images of the capitalist system that serves them so well.

Does John Welch, CEO of General Electric, which owns NBC, feel a twinge over the businessman who kills prostitutes on "Law & Order" or at the stockholders who spread a deadly virus for profit in the TV movie "Virus"?



pains. I have an infection you did not touch on - trichinosis.

The symptoms were all there: food poisoning at a family picnic where most people got sick, followed by muscle pains.

It is going to be hard to treat this disease. Please alert your readers about this serious illness. - H.T.

trichinosis (TRICK-ih-NO-siss), while declining, is still too high. The decline is attributed to regulations now in force that control how pigs and cattle are fed.

When animals, particularly pigs, are allowed to eat whatever comes in their path, they can pick up the trichinosis parasite, called a "trichna." The parasite burrows into an animal's muscles and forms a cyst.

When humans eat meat containing trichinosis cysts, stomach acid frees the immature parasites from their cyst coffins. Within a week, adult trichinae worms develops.

In that first week of infection, when the trichina larvae are reaching adulthood in the digestive tract, diarrhea and abdominal pain are the prominent symptoms.

larvae, which migrate to muscles, producing pain, tenderness and weakness.

A distinctive hint of trichinosis infection is swelling around the eyes, a sign not found in other kinds of food poisoning.

Most patients have a mild illness and recover without treatment. For ANSWER: The number of cases of the more seriously infected, antiparasite medicine is available. Some patients are troubled with

muscle pain for years. In the worst possible scenario, trichinosis is a fatal infection when the parasite infects the heart muscle or brain.

Your experience is a warning to us all. Don't eat meat with a pink center. The minimum temperature to kill trichinae is 137 degrees Fahrenheit (58.3 Celsius). A safer meat temperature is 170 F (76.7 C).

Although pigs are singled out as the chief carriers of trichinosis, cattle also can harbor it. Another possible source is wild game, such as bears. DEAR DR. DONOHUE: Can taking an antibiotic over a long period of time have any serious side effects? I have been taking Macrobid for

maintenance schedule. Can it cause any internal symptoms? - M.C.

ANSWER: The germ-killing drug nitrofurantoin, sold under the brand name "Macrobid." can have side effects. Actually, I don't know of any medicine free of possible side effects. Macrobid, which is commonly prescribed for an acute urinary-tract infection, can damage the liver, impair nerves and destroy red blood cells. Such dramatic side effects are few and far between, however.

Your maintenance dose, a reduced dose, discourages any return of the infecting germs. Side effects are less likely with such a lowered dose.

Two years is a long time to take Macrobid. Tell your doctor your concerns. You might not need the medicine any longer.





"There was never any doubt in my mind that it was out there," Barranco said. "History had told us so." A team headed by Cohn has been

using sonar to scan the depths of the lake for artifacts, including ships sunk in storms and battles in the 18th

and 19th centuries. Their work has been lent new urgency by exploding populations of zebra mussels, a species that has wreaked havoc in North American waters since it arrived in the bilge water of European ships a decade ago.

Cohn said the strategy of the Lake Champlain Maritime Museum, founded in 1986, has been to leave wrecks in the cold preserving water. But the threat of zebra mussels may change that approach.

In the meantime, the team won't



Volcano rumbles, showers ash on Mexico City, 45 miles away

SANTIAGO XALIZINTLA, Mexico (AP) - Under the volcano, church bells clanged noisily in the darkness today and a voice over a loudspeaker called the faithful to pray.

Popocatepetl was rumbling again, and this time it was blanketing Mexico City, 45 miles to the northwest, with grimy soot for the first time in memory.

The governor of Puebla state called a "red alert" Monday afternoon after four small eruptions sent ash billowing 7 { miles into the air, and lava 1,500 feet up. Officials in nearby Morelos state declared a similar alert soon after. Mexico City international airport was closed to all air traffic at around 5:15 p.m.

But both state governments downgraded the standby to "yellow" Monday night after the volcano's activity began to subside. No injuries were reported.

Authorities made preparations to evacuate at least 15 small communities on the slopes of the 17,992-foot mountain, but as of this morning nobody had been forced to leave. About 300,000 people live on the volcano's flanks.

Hundreds of people milled about the rutted dirt roads of one town, Santiago Xalizintla, early today, but few were anxious to leave.

'I'm not going anywhere unless this mountain starts to do something," said Magdalena Sandoval, 41, who was evacuated in December causing them to stall.

He said, however, that he had never seen anything like this. "Mud is coming down the mountain," he said. "It has never come down here."

Volcanic ash fell over Mexico City, mixing with heavy rain to produce a grimy film. Motorists stopped to clean their windshields after their wipers became clogged.

Flights into Mexico City's main airport were diverted to Guadalajara and Acapulco until further notice. Because of volcanic activity, pilots were warned two weeks ago to avoid going directly over the volcano's

Homeless advocate delays transfer of San Antonio base

SAN ANTONIO (AP) - A little-known advocate for the homeless has succeeded in halting plans for the transfer of Kelly Air Force Base to the city of San Antonio.

The \$108 million transfer was to have occurred on Wednesday, but a family-operated non-profit group obtained a restraining order that puts the transfer on hold until at least Monday.

Wednesday's ceremony was scheduled as part of military base-closing procedures allowing San Antonio to buy the base for industrial development.

But a group known as Senior Resources obtained a restraining order by claiming it was excluded from development at Kelly despite a federal law that requires homeless services to be part of military base re-use.

The order, signed Thursday, prohibits the Air Force from "selling,
