who died in 1995 after she was anesthetized by a drug-abusing
doctor.
South Park Hospital also South Park Hospital also has
agreed to join the father of Margo Glickman Johnson in calling for the Texas Legislature to address the rights of patients who sue hospitals. Richard Mithoff, attorney for father Jake Glickman, a Big Spring resident. "I've been at this for 25 years. What his does is set a standard for every hospital in the country in terms of
drug screening of emergency room and nursing personnel." The hospital admitted no liability in the case, defense attorney D. South Park pledged to strengthen its drug policy regarding doctors, including random testing and drug-related education.

said.
