Ro-organism ievel pesticide, according o Roger Haldenberg of the PCGA. What this does is get into the gut of larva problem (is) the insects that are naid. "The rapidly develop strong resistance to the pesticide," he said. Haldenberg said the corn borer and the coton borer are essentially the same insect. with the primary difference being the crop infested. Bt coton in close proximity is resistant insects may move from one crop to another and so damage both crops and breed even more

 claims dropWASHINGTON (AP) - First-time claims for jobless benefits fell by 6,000 last week. less than 320,000 , a level that analysts say is a sign of continuing payroll growth. The Labor Department said today that new
applications for unemployment insurance applications for unemployment insurance
totaled a seasonally adjusted 310,000 , down from a revised 316,000 a week earlier. The prior week's total initially was estimated to
be 315,000 .
The jobless claims level was the lowest
since 299,000 during the week ended Oct. since 299,000 during the week ended Oct.
25. Many analysts had expected a 5,000 drop. . 1 It also was the longest string of claims below
320,000 since a 26 -week strech ended in 320.000 since a 26 -week stretch ended in
February 1989. A level below 320,000 is believed to be consistent with a tight labor market.
The four-week moving average of new
weekly jobless claims inched up to 309,250 wrom 308,500 . 14 was the highest since 312,750 during the period ended Sept. 20 .
Many analysts prefer to track the less-volatie four-week average because it
smooths out the spikes in the weekly reports.

It was good news for Hereford when the November

for November, a 17.1 percent gain over the $\$ 28,606.5$ f for November 1996 . For the year, the county has received a total of $\$ 325,070.31,3.2$ percent more than the $\$ 314,847.26$ received for the same period in 1999 . million in monthly sales tax payments to 1,087 Texas cities and 117 counties. million in monthly sales tax payments to 1,087 Texas cities and 117 counties.
"Consumer spending shows confidence in the continued growth of the Texas economy, and sales tax rebates are a healthy 7.1 percent ahead of
those through November of last year " Sharp stated those through November of last year," Sharp stated.
Sharp delivered monthly sales tax rebates to Texas cities totaling $\$ 212.4$
million, 11.4 percent above than las November's payments of $\$ 1905$ million million, 11.4 percent above than last November 's payments of $\$ 190.5$ million.
Rebates of $\$ 18.2$ million to Texas counties were 15.7 percent higher than allocations of $\$ 15.7$ million in November 1996 . Another $\$ 6$ million went to 26 special purpose districts around the state.

## Writing Want Ads that really sell!

Unsure how to write a Classified Ad that will get results? Follow these pointers and you'll soon have an empty space in your storage room and cash in your pocket.

For starters, look at ads which offer the same item/ products. Get a sense of going rates and ideas for how to make your ad stand out, One yolling "Dining room set maple six chairs." Then, remember these hints
--Give the price. A newspaper consultant says 70 percent of classified readers won't respond to an ad with no price. --Use key words to describe what you're selling. The key words for a car are make, model, year, body style, color, mileage and price. If it's a house, key words are location, type of construction, number of bedrooms and baths, and condition.
-Don't use abbreviations. It's tempting to abbreviate and save money if ads are billed by the line. Brand ads are billed by the words so spell them out so readers won't be confused trying to figure out abbreviations.

- Don't be misleading. Think accurate and factual when you write. Be sure to include a phone number and the best times to reach you.
