Convicted child killer maintains her innocence
DALLAS (AP) - It's been a year since Darlie Routier was convicted of killing her sons, but even as she sits on death row, she swears she's innocent.
"I'm not afraid to die. What I'm afraid of is dying and not being vindicel Ms. Routier told The Dallas Morning News in an interview from Lew Sterrett
Justice Center. "If I could give my life today to prove that I didn't do this, I swear to you I would. II want my name cleared. I want who did this - they belong
behind bars." behind bars.'
A Kerr County jury convicted Ms. Routier last February of capital murder
in the June 1996 stabbing deaths of her 5 -year-old son, Damon. His 6 -year-old in the June 1996 stabbing deaths of her 5-y
brother, Devon, also died in the attack
The 28 -year-old Routier has said all along that an intruder broke into her family's Rowlett home, 17 miles northeast of Dallas, killed her sons
and wounded her before runing away and wounded her before running away.
