Affirmative action program under attack in Senate WASHINGION (AP). A A5--year-old program to help women and minorities
win construction contracts is under attack in the Senate in a move that could lead to a presidential veto of a $\$ 173$ billion highway spending bill. demanded asurrender a d iscretion, therwise, the garrison are to be putto the sword, if the fort is taken - Ihave answered the demands with a cannon shot, and our flag sill waves proudly from the wall - 1 shall never surrender or retreat. Then, I call on you in the name of liberty, of patriotism and of everyining dear io we A reciving reifforcements daily and will no doubi dispatch. The enemy is receiving reinforcements daly and will no doush
increase tothre of four thousand in four of five days. If this call is neglected

What American, Texan or otherwise, can fail to be stirred by Col. Travis resolve?
In the battle that followed, 184 brave men died in a heroic but vain atempt to fend off Santa Anna's soverwhelming army. But the Alamo was crucial. Because those heroes at the Alamo held out for sol ong. Santa Anna's
