HISD trustees act on construction projects

School trustees decided Tuesday to proceed with plans to re-roof Shirley Intermediate School, reject high school roffing bids and look into renovations of the cafeteria before putting out bids.

The construction-related activity was a highlight of a more than 4-1/2hour-long meeting that included budget reports from five departments and reports from teachers who attended a professional conference.

District architect Larry Harvey appeared before the board at the regular meeting to update trustees on proposals to put a metal roof on Shirley and to review what can be done with the current administration building once it is vacated next month.

Harvey said he contacted A-1 Roofing last summer while the company was installing a standing seam steel roof on the Stanton Educational Support Center.

At that time, he said, he was told that the project would cost about \$280,000, but that it would be \$40,000 more if the crews had to be brought back to Hereford after completion of that project.

However, Harvey said, that may have merely been a negotiation ploy by the company to try to get the district to do the project at that time.

He said the two roofs have about the same square footage, but that the Shirley roof should be easier to do because of fewer obstructions.

The board approved unanimously a motion by Trustee Raymond Schlabs to authorize Harvey to prepare contract documents and put the project out for bid.

Greenawalt said there is currently \$266,000 in the district construction account, although \$52,000 of that is earmarked for the final payment on the high school heating and air conditioning system.

He said the contract could be worded so that the project would not be paid for until after the 1994-95 budget year has begun, when more money will be added for construction.

Harvey said it should take about 60 days to do the work, which can be completed during the summer break. In discussion of the high school

roof, Greenawalt recommended the board reject all bids, noting that only two were received and that there are other companies available that could offer bids.

The district is proposing installing a new modified bitumen roof over the portion of the high school that had the new heating and air conditioning system installed.

Assistant superintendent for support services Don Cumpton recommended the new roof, noting that there are leaks in the existing roof and that the repair needs to be done to protect the new ceiling and equipment.

Instead, a study was ordered to determine how to better accommodate high school students and kindergarten students from the Stanton building in the existing cafeteria without spending lots of money.

Harvey presented a plan that would turn the existing offices into four classrooms, to be used by teachers needing more sophisticated electrical systems for computer applications.

Separate work would clear storerooms, a small office and an unused snack bar from the cafeteria, then set aside a small area at the north end for the small children.

However, Mal Manchee, who heads up the youth programs, said putting the glassed-off children's area at the south end would be better.

Directive's impact on rates for local cable unknown

Cable customers in Hereford won't know for a while whether their monthly rates will decrease, increase or stay the same.

Lloyd Ames, Hereford Cablevision general manager, said Wednesday that he has no information, yet, on the impact of the latest Federal Communications Commission announcement on cable rates in Hereford.

"Our attorneys in Washington will send us all the information," said Ames. "We could go either way -- up or down -- or stay the same." Ames could not predict the rates that will be charged in Hereford because

of the formula. Last year, when the FCC ordered a reduction in cable fees, the primary change in Cablevision's rates was related to secondary outlets, he added.

The charge for secondary outlets was reduced. The FCC order issued Monday for a seven percent reduction apparently grew out of the complaints lodged last year when rate changes that were supposed to reduce cost in effect raised charges in some areas.

Lotto tickets going fast here in anticipation of \$40 million

Janie Frausto, manager of Taylor Food-Mart at 401 East 1st St., became a customer yesterday. She bought a Lotto ticket.

It was only one ticket and it cost her only \$1. But Frausto's logic was simple and to the point: it takes only one to win tonight's \$40 million jackpot.

Thousands of tickets have been sold to Hereford area residents since Monday, according to local merchants. The drawing will be held at 9:59 p.m.

The estimated \$40 million represents the third largest jackpot since the twice-weekly lotteries started in Texas in late 1992.

Frausto said, "Every time the jackpot gets this big, we sell tickets by the bunches. "Yesterday we sold more than 400

tickets. On Monday, we sold around 200. This morning by 9 a.m., we had already sold over 200." Bob Hughes is manager of the

Country Store at 203 South 25 Mile Avenue. He took in \$1,600 on Lotto tickets Tuesday and expects the number to climb to between \$4,000 and \$5,000 today.

Hughes, who is celebrating his 33rd year in business here, told of one Hereford man who came into his store

and plopped a handful of money onto the counter.

"It's my birthday," he told Hughes, "and I feel lucky. I'm going to shoot it all!

Said Hughes, "We're getting women customers who have kinfolk from all over the country and they're buying tickets for all their relatives."



SAN ANTONIO - Federal agents caused the deaths of David Koresh and 78 of his followers in the "greatest atrocity since the slaughter of the American Indians," a defense attorney told jurors as the murder trial of 11 Branch Davidians wound to a close.

HOUSTON - Federal prosecutors expect more criminal charges to follow the announcement that nine men, including two NASA workers, and a corporation were caught in a 20-month FBI sting aimed at rooting out fraud within the space agency.

SEGUIN - Final arguments were set for today in the trial of convicted killer Kenneth McDuff, who has twice been sentenced to death. More charges expected in FBI sting

Corporation, NASA employees caught in investigation

HOUSTON (AP) - Federal prosecutors expect more criminal charges to follow the announcement that nine men, including two NASA workers, and a corporation were caught in a 20-month FBI sting aimed at rooting out fraud within the space

Tips from contractors and NASA employees started Operation Lightning Strike. Undercover agents later posed as executives of a fictitious company known as Southern Technologies Diversified, U.S. Attorney Gaynelle Griffin Jones said Tuesday.

The agents found contractors willing to accept bribes, kickbacks and inside information on National Aeronautics and Space Administration contracts even as the agency came under fire for cost overruns and contract abuse. Jones said additional charges were expected.

The defendants, who were charged in six criminal informations, were not considered flight risks and were not arrested, she said. None has entered pleas. Each faces prison terms and fines of up to \$500,000.

General Electric and Martin Marietta were not directly implicated, but the companies agreed to jointly reimburse the government \$1 million for the cost of the FBI probe, Jones

Prosecutors said neither company was charged because the employees involved were acting outside their assigned capacities and for personal and not company benefit.

"The taxpayer was not defrauded, nor was there any likelihood that a bogus instrument ... would ever fly aboard the space shuttle.'

Word of the probe came at the end of a year when NASA was under heavy scrutiny. The Houston center, headquarters for the nation's manned space flight effort, was blamed for \$1 billion in overruns on space station contracts it had overseen.

NASA Inspector General Bill Colvin testified before a congressional committee last October that the agency is plagued with abuse, including awarded non-competitively. He said NASA had more than 400 criminal The charges involving Proctor fraud investigations under way.

Diplomats want truce in other Bosnia cities

(AP) - American, Russian and European diplomats decided the cease-fire model that has allowed Sarajevo residents to walk city streets again should be extended to other beleaguered Bosnian towns.

Russia blocked consideration of any new NATO ultimatums to enforce the truces. But German Foreign Minister Klaus Kinkel said further ultimatums may be needed. And a U.S. official said Washington hadn't ruled out force.

The diplomats met Tuesday in agreed to push Bosnia's three warring quiet. factions - Muslims, Serbs and Croats - toward an agreement to end the 22-month war by dividing Bosnia into three states.

Thousands of Sarajevans were out on the slushy streets Tuesday, while NATO warplanes flew overhead to enforce NATO's threat to bomb any artillery positions that shelled the capital. U.N. spokesmen said all artillery not removed by Serb troops besieging the city was under U.N. control or inoperable.

"The main thing is the Serbs stopped shelling, so we can freely walk out on the streets. Other things will be solved step by step, but peace is most important," said one resident out for a stroll, Enver Huseinovic, 58.

Relief convoys and flights resumed Tuesday in Bosnia. They were stopped last week in case NATO air strikes were ordered and fighting escalated. The United Nations said 13 planes dropped 99 tons of food into Gorazde, a besieged Muslim town in eastern Bosnia.

U.N. troops hoped to open Tuzla airport March 7 for aid flights to central Bosnia, said Kofi Annan, the head of U.N. peacekeeping operations. But Serb-led Yugoslavia objected, saying the airport is too close to Yugoslavia. Tuzla is 25 miles west of the Yugoslav border.

Diplomatic efforts have intensified since the NATO ultimatum forced Serbs to pull their heavy guns away from Sarajevo and brought Russia strongly into the picture. Russian troops joined U.N. peacekeepers in Sarajevo, and Moscow quickly claimed a leading role in peace efforts.

Diplomats said Tuesday they would seek relief for Serb-besieged Muslim enclaves and pressure Muslims and Croats for a cease-fire in central Bosnia and the southern city of Mostar.

'For now, I would say, we give peace a chance," said Juergen Chrobog, a deputy German foreign minister and host of the meeting.



LILLEHAMMER, Norway (AP) Alberto Tomba bomba-ed in his 1994 Olympics debut. Nancy and Tonya were hoping for much better results in theirs tonight.

Tomba, who hasn't won a giant slalom race since the Albertville Games two years ago, never came close to a medal in today's competition. Markus Wasmeier of Germany, last week's super-G gold medalist, won by two-hundredths of a second in the closest Alpine race in Olympics history.

After finishing 13th on the first run, the Italian declared he hadn't been aggressive enough and proceeded to his rented house for a good-luck shave. It wasn't lucky: He had an unimpressive second run and was disqualified after missing a gate at the bottom of the course.

Tomba had been gunning for gold in a third Olympics and for his fourth gold medal overall - feats no Alpine skier has achieved. He has one more chance Sunday in the slalom, his strongest event.

Wasmeier, third by .37 seconds

Associated Press Writer Regents for the four Southwest Conference schools invited to join the Big Eight are scrambling to get together and vote on the proposal, which looks like it only needs to be rubber-stamped to become official.

The nearly 80-year-old league could lose original members Texas, Texas A&M and Baylor and longtime member Texas Tech to the Big Eight as soon as Friday, sources told The Associated Press. The expanded league would begin in 1996.

"There have been a lot of moving pieces to the puzzle the last few weeks, but at this time I'm almost certain that the proposed merger will happen," a member of the University of Texas board of regents who wished to remain anonymous told The Associated Press late Tuesday night.

All that's in the way, he said, is formal approval by the four boards

"I won't deny that," Ross Margraves, chairman of Texas A&M's board of regents, said late Tuesday from Washington, D.C. "I know our president (Dean Gage) has expressed the feeling to me that it's a good move for Texas A&M, and I understand the other three presidents





How to choose a secured credit card

Having a major credit card is a virtual necessity in today's economy. Even if you decide not to use plastic for your purchases, you still need a have disallowed the use of those card for such vital transactions as renting a car, booking a flight, making hotel accommodations, even for cashing a check. But what can you do if, for some reason, you do not qualify for a credit card?

The answer may be a secured credit card. This is simply a standard MasterCard or Visa card that is backed by a savings account: the card's credit line is "secured" by the savings account deposit. The card itself looks and works exactly like a standard credit card. When you use it, no one knows that it's secured.

If you are among the thousands of consumers with no credit history, or with a poor credit rating - the result, say, of having to declare personal bankruptcy because of circumstances beyond your control, such as a longterm layoff from work - a secured card can provide a new chance to build a positive credit record. Once you obtain a secured credit card, you can start to establish a new record of punctual payments and thereby improve your credit rating over a period of time.

But a secured card generally comes with a higher interest rate on your unpaid balance, and higher fees, than an unsecured card. Banks charge higher rates to offset the greater risk of offering credit to someone who has a poor credit rating, or even no credit history at all.

That's why it's particularly important to make sure you understand everything about a secured credit card offering. If a secured card is indeed your ticket into the credit mainstream, you should be especially careful about who's handling it, how it works and, most importantly, how much it really

The following checklist highlights some of the most important factors to consider in choosing a secured credit

-Make sure the card offer is made by a banking institution and that the bank is a member of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC).

-Avoid paying a fee just to obtain an application, or an application fee or a "rush charge" for processing your pplication.

-Under no circumstances should you make a toll-call to a "900" number: both MasterCard and Visa

-Make sure the application is sent directly to the bank issuing the card.

-Choose a bank that gives you the option of sending in your savings deposit either at the time you submit your application OR after your application has been submitted and approved.

Make sure the bank reports your credit standing to one of the major national credit bureaus on a monthly

-Choose a bank that gives you the option of sending in your savings deposit either at the time you submit your application OR after your application has been submitted and

-Make sure the bank reports your credit standing to one of the major national credit bureaus on a monthly

-Check the credit limit allowed by the bank: it should be at least equal to, or greater than, your savings deposit, and it should be sufficient to cover your estimated monthly charges.

-Make sure that a competitive rate of interest is paid on your savings deposit to offset some of the costs of the card.

-Find out all the costs associated with the card, including the interest rate and Annual Percentage Rate (APR), annual fee, late fee, overlimit fee, ATM cash advance fee and return check charge.

-Check the availability (and additional costs, if any) of the benefits offered with the card to give you added value: credit card protection, membership in travel clubs, credit life insurance, purchase protection, extended warranties, rebate programs, accident/disability insurance, emergency cash and auto rental discount

"Because the disease is not always so obvious, it is important to see a doctor for a diagnosis if any unusual herpes is much more commonplace and manageable than previously believed. Yet, it's still difficult for many people to take the first important step...seeking a doctor's care. "There is still a stigma associated

with genital herpes that makes people afraid to deal with this disease," says Dr. Michael Reitano, director of the herpes Advice Center in New York City. "Many of my patients are surprised to learn that herpes is actually a very liveable condition."

Genital Herpes: Very Common, Often Subtle

Herpes is caused by infection with the herpes simplex virus (HSV). According to Dr. Reitano, many people don't realize that:

Genital herpes is a very common disease. Over 31 million Americans have genital herpes, and an estimated 500,000 new cases occur yearly, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). However, some experts believe the incidence is much higher.

Genital herpes outbreaks are often so subtle that symptoms go unrecognized. Symptoms can include a simple rash, bumps, redness or minor discomfort in the genital area. In fact, recent studies show that 80 percent of people infected with genital herpes do not know they have it. However, after diagnosis and counseling about subtle disease symptoms, many of these individuals could recognize a genital herpes outbreak.

Genital herpes is easily transmitted. Because genital herpes symptoms often are so subtle and go unrecognized, the infection can be transmitted

so obvious, it is important to see a doctor for a diagnosis if any unusual symptom recurs or persists. Even if your symptoms are mild, it's important to know if you have herpes, so that you can protect your sexual partner. If you're a woman and you plan to have children, knowing you have herpes will help you avoid infecting an infant during childbirth," says Dr. reitano.


While many people have subtle symptoms, some do have very recognizable outbreaks. Noticeable symptoms can first occur two to 21 days after contact with an infected partner. These might include pain, itching, burning or discharge in or near the genital area. later, small red bumps can appear that turn into painful blisters, which open up, crust over and eventually heal. Flu-like illness also can accompany one or more of the above symptoms. Although most people with herpes do experience recurrences, later outbreaks tend to be

Living With Genital Herpes
Together, treatment and information are keys to living well with genital herpes. A prescription medication is available that relieves symptoms and has proven to prevent outbreaks from occurring in some people if taken on a daily basis. Educational materials also can help people with herpes manage related lifestyle issues, such as telling a partner, preventing transmission and reducing the effect of recurrences.

Herpes is not the end of intimacy, good health or a sense of well-being, says Dr. Reitano. "Together, a doctor and patient can decide how to best control this disease."

State Attorney General Dan Morales filed suit Tuesday against The Homestead of Denison.

Trustee Ed Campbell arrived at the home Tuesday night to begin investigating the care and meet with the owners.

"This shocked our society," Rocket Rosen told jurors Tuesday in his closing argument. "What kind of government would do this to its own people? ... This is not Tiananmen Square, Bosnia, Russia or Nazi

Prosecutor Bill Johnston, meanwhile, portrayed the 11 defendants as eager killers for Koresh's doomsday ministry who needlessly sacrificed their children in a fire last April 19 "to fulfill their own selfish desires.'

While a couple of jurors dozed during the daylong arguments by both sides, some began chewing on their fingers and sank in their chairs when

defense attorneys told them the world will be watching the outcome of the six-week-long case.

"We must send a message that this can never happen again," said Rosen, who represents Livingston Fagan and Kevin Whitecliff. "We can never allow a government agency to use military tactics on its own people again - ever."

Rosen's criticism was the most severe of several defense attorneys who used their closing arguments to blame the government for the death and destruction that began with a botched raid last Feb. 28 just outside

The 11 cult members are charged with murder and conspiracy to murder four agents of the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms who were attempting to arrest Koresh on weapons charges.

Defense attorneys say agents fired the first shots during the raid, perhaps even unintentionally.

"God required, and the Bible was interpreted to mean, that you had to use self-defense even if it meant killing the ATF agents," said Joe Turner, who represents the only female defendant, Ruth Riddle.

At the heart of the government's case is its conspiracy claim. Under federal law, the defendants can be sentenced to life in prison without parole if they are found to have contributed in any way to the cult's alleged final criminal acts.

Three defendants - Paul Fatta, Norman Allison and Woodrow Kendrick - were not in the Branch Davidian compound the day of the shooting. But Johnston said all the defendants' willingness to remain a part of Koresh's ministry after guns were purchased, passed out and used in firearms training proves they took part in a well-conceived plan to murder.

"There was talk of an actual war involving their church and they stayed," Johnston said. "But then words turned into action. Guns were purchased and they stayed. More guns were purchased, serious guns, and they stayed."
