Declaration of Independence: Principles for colonies' revolt presented in the document

On July 4, 1776, the Second Continental Congress, meeting in Philadelphia in the Pennsylvania State House (now Independence Hall), approved the upon which the Congress had acted two days earlier when it voted in favor of Richard Henry l.ee's motion to declare the freedom and independence
of the 13 merican colonies from England. The Declaration was designed to influence public opinin and gain support both among the new states and abroad -- especially in France, from which the new "United States" sought military assistance.

The document is mainly his work, although the ommitee andessas Ast Enlighten and arguments of Englisson found his greatest inspiration in the language "Glorious Revolution" of 1688 on the basis of man's "natural rights." L Locke's heory held that government was a contract between the governed and those and whose purpose it was io protect every man's inherent right to property life and liberty. Jefferson"s sheory of "natural law" differed in that it substituted the inalienable right of "the pursuit of happiness" for "property." emphasizing of the "pursuit of happiness" originated in the Common Sense Sclool of Scottish philosophy, of which Lord Kames was the best-known proponent.
