## Paetzold: Head in clouds

What that means is Paetzold is a farmer who happens to restore and fly air-
planes. Two

for two to three hours from first grade, which was age 6 ."
Her family speaks the native Ukranian language but they do know English.
My mother was an English I guess which is very different from the way I talk now. She would have no idea what I was saying if I talked She says Ukraine is becomin Americanized more and more each time she returns home.
"Every time I go home, I'm surprised how much it has American
ized, especially in Kiev (the capital mean store signs are written Ukranian and English. Like 'supermarket' will read 'Supermarket' in English."

not like Americans who often have a car for each member of their
family. She also says there is not family. She also says there is not a
shortage of food, but in Ukraine most people can't afford to buy food in bulk.
"Here (United States) things are
more of a 'want' and there it's more more of a 'want' and there it's more
of a 'need' because of money situa.
"It's almost a crossroad and, oh, I think
about it everyday. If I stay here, I will have more stability, more security, financial and material, and just
more security in life in general more security in life in general.
But also I don't have the closest thing to me, which is my family; if I go home, I have my close family and emotional support. So I have to
choose to be less stressed about life choose to be less stressed about life
with my family or be more secure. Right now, I'm helping my parents; I send them some money every so
often so that helps them, but it's often so that helps them, but it's
hard for them because they do miss hard for them because they do miss
me. I would really like to live in me. I would really like to live in
Ukraine. I really love my country. I may live here, but I will always
consider Ukraine my home, consider Ukraine my home."

my shoulder. I turned around and saw the
Clintons. Clintons.
"I'm going to be in Hope next week. Someone from the office will let you know every-
thing," Clinton said. He chatted a couple mor thing, Clinton said. He chatted a couple more
minutes, like we were old friends before moving on toward the exit.
I noticed that he apparently knew all of the
editors by first name I editors by first name. (learned that was one
of the keys to Clinton's success in Arkansas - his phenomenal ability to remember faces and names. It was said that Clinton knew the names of everyone in Arkansas, plus the
names of their dogs.
A few days later, Clinton did make his trip
to Hope. When his plane landed at the muto Hope. When his plane landed at the mu-
nicipal airport, he greeted all of us who were nicipal airport, he greeted all of us who were
waiting there by name. He escorted the news-
news editor for the daily newspaper in New Charles. So was about 90 miles from Lake drove to Lake Charles press credentials and What a change from my previous encounters with Clinton.
With the Secret Service in charge of things, the relaxed atmosphere, the easy access was gone. Instead, as I entered the hangar, I had to go through metal detectors, present two or
three different forms of identification, and let an agent go through my camera bag and inspect the camera, removing the lens to peer inside the body of the camera.
Then I was allowed to go to the press
stand, a set of what looked like high school stand, a set of what looked like high school
bleachers, off to one side of the speaker's platform, behind the audience. Although I had the bleachers to myself for $15-20$ minutes, I
knew when Clinton's plane landed because the national press corps arrived and took their spots on the stand.
After a shat
After a short speech, Clinton took questions
from the audience, then waded into the crowd from the audience, then waded into the crowd
to shake hands before boarding his plane for the trip to New Orleans.
I never got within 50 yards of Clinton. I couldn't help but think that if this had been
Arkansas in 1990, Clinton likely would have Arkansas in 1990, Clinton likely would have
spotted me and stopped for a brief interview. potted me and stopped for a brief intervid
Not this time; the access was gone.

elsewhere, Lake lost his fortune and ultimately built submarines for Russia and Austria. The United States did not request Lake's service unize his contributions to underwater navigation until after his death in 1945 . Poluhowich believes Lake's contributions have been seri-
ously overlooked and that underwater navigation would be quite different from what it is today without them. Poluhowich has written numerous articles dealing with such topics as submarine hising, cooking and natural history "Argonaut" is available at University Bookstore.

30-year quest has led along uncharted path

DALLAS - "We live in a set of conditions that are constantly changing, to
which we are constantly responding," says Robert Inwin, an internationally renowned artist who has ways to make himself and others more responsive.
His quest has led him His quest has led him
along an uncharted path, along an uncharted path,
with wildly unpredictable results. Having started as
an abstract expressionist an abstract expressionist
painter, he abandoned paintpainter, he abandoned paint-
ing in favor of fugitive maing in favor of fugitive ma-
