- House, Senate taking different approaches in dealing with fuel prices

WASHINGTON (AP) - Tax breaks are still on the minds of
congressional leaders trying to find a political solution to rising oil prices, but the House and Senate are approaching the question in
much different ways. Senate Majority Leader Trent
Lott, R-Miss., introduced a pair of Lott, R-Miss., introduced a pair of gas-tax bills this week. One would roll back until January the 4.3-
cents-a-gallon increase imposed in cents-a-gallon increase imposed in
1993. The other would enact a temporary "tax holiday" and suspend the 18.4 -cents-per-gallon fed-
eral gas tax if pump prices top $\$ 2$ a eral gas tax if pu
gallon this year.
House Republicans, meanwhile House Republicans, meanwhile,
already have backed away from plans to reduce gas taxes as a quick way of easing the price
crunch. GOP opponents said there were no guarantees the meager
relief would be passed on to cusrelief would be passed on to cus-
tomers, and eliminating the tax tomers, and eliminating the tax
would take billions of dollars from would take bilhons of dolars fro
critical road and bridge projects. Rep. J.C. Watts of Oklahoma, the fourth-ranking House Republican, outlined the new House ap-

## Clinton lectures Pakistanis

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan (AP) - President Clinton brought a stern message to an old
Cold War ally today amid the tightest of Cold War ally today amid the tightest of not to end democracy, but to improve it," he
told the people of Pakistan after inconclusive talks with its military ruler. Clinton portrayed the United States and
Pakistan as friends over five decades, and said Pakistan as friends over five decades, and said
he believes Pakistan could still be "a force for tolerance and understanding throughout the world." But, he said, the millitary coup that
suspended Pakistan's democracy suspended Pakistan's democracy last Octobe
threatened to undermine that friendship. threatened to undermine that friendship.
"Clearly the absence of democracy makes it harder, not easier, for people to move ahead," Clinton said. "We share your disappointment
that previous democratic governments in that previous democratic governments in Pa
kistan did not do better for its citizens. But democracy cannot develop if it it constantly uprooted before it has a chance to take hold."
Clinton spoke on state-run
series of meetings with Gen. Pervez
Musharraf. Administration officials said no breakthroughs emerged on the points the United States found most troubling - a time-
table for national elections, a scaling back of Pakistan's nuclear program and an easing of tensions in the divided Himalayan region of Kashmir.
Despite
Despite the lack of concrete progress, both sides ended up with a clearer view of each
other's positions, said White House spokes man Joe Lockhart ${ }^{\text {and }}$. Seated at a desk in the presidential palace with the flags of Pakistan and the United States behind him, Clinton said Musharraf's
announcement this week that he would hold ocal elections next year was a "good step." Unless democracy is restored, and if the is "a danger thict ashmir continues, there a danger that Pakistan may grow even
more isolated, draining more resources away from the people," Clinton said

## COMMENT <br> Self-governing needs all of us to participate <br> Representative democracy works

 only if citizens participate, both as Unfortunately, both candidates and voters appear to be dropping out of the process, a developmentthat does not bode well for selfgovernment.

Texas' share of the $\$ 434$ million in P-R money divided among all of the
states is now $\$ 21,121,301$. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and other state fish and wildlife agencies put the money to good use for things like land acquisition, habitat improvement, research, and education.
Pitman-Robertson funds may be used to pay for up to 75 percent of fish and
wildifife program costs wildlife program costs. A matching share from the state must come from The Sport Fish Restoration Program will be channeling an $\$ 12,046,000$ to TP\& WD for use in fisheries programs and boating access. Another $\$ 8,198,000$ will be received for wildilife restoration, and $\$ 876,000$ will go toward hunter education programs in the state.

## Study shows Vitamin C to be harmful

 SAN DIEGO (AP) - Vitamin C pills may speed up hardeningof the arteries, researchers suggest in a new'study they called a disturbing surprise.
The researchers cautioned that more experiments are needed to know for sure whether megadoses of the vitamin actually
are harmful. Still, they said the finding supports the recommendations of health organizations, which generally urge people to avoid high
doses of supplements and to get their nutrients from food doses of

The study found no clear-cut sign that getting lots of vitamin C from food or a daily multivitamin does any harm. But those
taking vitamin C pills had accelerated thickening of the walls of the big arteries in their necks. In fact, the more they took, the faster the buildup.
People taking 500 milligrams of vitamin $C$ daily for at least a year had a $21 / 2$ times greater rate of thickening than did five times greater. "If a person's physician has prescribed vitamin $\mathbf{C}$, it

## Witness takes closer look at doping in Olympics


#### Abstract

Oy Tony Atherton oTVData Features Syndicate When Ben Johnson was stripped of his gold medal at the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul, South Korea, filmmaker Marrin Canell was among the majority of Canadians who thought the action was just. Johnson had tested positive for a banned substance. He had cheated. It was only right he should suffer the consequences, Canell figured But since studying the phenomenon of doping among Olympic athletes for the Witness documentary "Dying to Win," premiering Thursday, March 30 on CBC Television, Canell's opinion of Johnson and the action of the Internaional Olympic Committee has turned 180 degrees. Johnson, Canell says, was a scapegoat whose only mistake was getting caught at the wrong time. "If he was caught today, he would never have been suspended," Canell says. "His medal would never have been taken away." Don't take Canell's word for it. Prince Alexandre de Merode, the IOC's med-


ical commissioner, says much the same thing in "Dying to Win," as does Arnold Beckett, the IOC doctor who tested Johnson's telltale second sample. Why would the response be different today? Because drug testing is subject to legal challenges that make suspensions difficult to impose, Canell says, and because IOC officials "now know, or they're now admitting, that most of the athletes probably were on some form of drug. ... Ben was just stupid enough to get caught, and subsequently he paid the price for everyone."
You have to be stupid, unlucky or both to get caught in the IOC's faulty drug-testing regimen, according to "Dying to Win," because the current testing procedures just don't work
While the IOC has spoken of instituting blood testing at the Olympics this summer, it is not clear if the committee will follow through, Canell says.
"The IOC really doesn't want to catch people. It's embarrassing for them; it hurts sponsorship." he explains. "They are afraid, if they had a consistent testing program and everyone was tested equally, of what they would find.

## Campbell Soup Company Recalls Condensed Soup for Possible Metal Contamination

WASHINGTON-Campbell Soup Coo, a Camden, N.J. firm, is voluntarily recalling approximately 109,000 pounds of vegetable beef condensed canned soup because the soup may contain metal contamination, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service announced.

The product being recalled is $101 / 2$ ounce cans of "Campbell's Healthy Request Vegetable Beef Condensed Soup."

Each can has the code "SEP 01 09279" and "EST 4K DEAL (plus 4 digits indicating military time)" ink-stamped on the end.

The product was distributed to the retail level in Arizona, Colorado, lowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Mississippi, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Tennessee, and Texas.

Consumers with questions about the recall may contact Campbell Soup Co.,(800) 637-7698.
"Because of the potential for consumer injury, we urge consumers not to eat the soup but return it to the place of purchase," said Thomas J. Billy, administrator of FSIS. "FSIS is informing the public so consumers who may have purchased the soup can check their cupboards."

The problem was discovered through consumer complaints to the company. No illnesses or injuries associated with consumption of the product have been reported to FSIS. Any one concerned about an illness should contact a physician immediately.
