FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) - Chaplains' efforts to exorcise demon from an inmate violated security regulations at a Sorth Texas jail, according to a published report today.

Sheriff's documents obtained Wednesday by the Fort Worth Chey took the prisoner to an isolated area of the Tarrant The reports show the jail ministers violated safety rules by
Temoving the inmate, who is charged with sexually assaulting a child, from his cell without notifying the shift commander. The ceremony was so noisy that it was distracting, they
contended.
