Ion Your City." As you hive we have done a "Focus Brand or heard over KPAN, your city has been moving forward on two fronts: one a new solid waste (trash) disposal area at the city farm and,
wastewater disposal area, also at the city farm.
The purpose of this column is to discurss briefly the
wastewater treatment ideas because wastewater treatment ideas because your commisssioners will be voting on the issue Monday. We have had several
planning meetings regarding wastewater disposal and I planning meetings regarding wastewater disposal and
think it is safe to say that the commission has come down to consideration of only two options. Either of the options
being considered by the commission involves taking all of being considered by the commission involves taking all of the waste water to the city farm and that point treating
the wastewater either in an aerated lagoon or a facultative lagoon,
Both of these options have advantages and disadvantages. The aerated approach is probably a little more
efficient, but also requires some aerators and electricity. efricient, but also requires some aerators and electricity. The facultative approach to the wastewater treatment is
all handled without any mechanical equipment, but is probably a little less efficient. Regardless, either of these systems as approved by the Texas Natural Resource and Conservation Commission will provide an opportunity to
eliminate the odor that is presently on the east side of eliminate the odor that is presently on the east side of
town and will put us within the requirements by the state for wastewater treatment.
In our discussion over wastewater treatment, considerIn our discussion over wastewater treatment, consider-
able interest was expressed by the commission in utilizing our wastewater flow for application to city parks and/or ur gorf course. After considerable investigation and
discussion, it was determined that additional $\$ 1$ million cost over and above other treatments probably made it unfeasible at this time. Certainly, there is nothing that would prevent us from going back and establishing a a
packaged treatment plant for water for our city parks packaged
and/or golf course in the future. It's simply a matter of cost at this time.
Regardless of which treatment facility your city commissioners decide upon, your city will act as its own enose construction items that we are not equipped to handle and using our personnel wherever possible. This provides the opportunity for us to reduce costs regarding
construction and to make sure that wherever possible, we construction and to ma
can utilize local folks.
As I think most of you know, all of our wastewater currently is being utilized at our city farm and that will
be the use of our water from either of the treatment be the use of our water from either of the treatment

## Wastewater on top of agenda

Hereford city commissioners are expected to decide Monday on a plan to bring the city's wastewater treat-
ment plant into compliance with state regulations.
At a workshop session May 2, the city commissioners agreed to make a decision
May 15 on which option -facultative or aerated lagoons - will be best for the city. Although the commissioners did not reach a consensus, City Manager Chester Nolen
said last week he believes a said last week he believes a
majority of the commissioners are leaning toward the aerated lagoon system. Nolen said the aerated la-
goon system is more efficient,
but more expensive to oper- would require about 34 acres
but more expensive to oper-
ate. The facultative system is less expensive to operate, but it also is less efficient and requires more land area.
However, either However, either plan is ca-
pable of dealing with 1.2-1.5 million gallons of effluent generated each day by the wastewater system's customers. Under the facultative systhe lagoon, where it stays at a constant level. Wave action from the wind aerates the solve the solids.

For the facultative system, the city would need three lagoons, each $10-12$ feet deep

## Now's time to file SS claim

Special to The Brand who became or will becom monthly benefits are paid for 65 this year and who have not filed a claim for Social Security benefits because they are still working may need to
do so to avoid losing benefits, according to the office man-
ager of the Social Security ager of the Social Security
Administration. Administration. law that eliminated the Social Security "retirement" or "earnings" test for people 65 and older makes working people eligible for benefits beginning
with the monih they are 65 or even before the month they are 65, depending upon their
earnings up to that point. earnings up to that point.
For example, in the year For example, in the year
an individual turns age 65, anyone who will not earn
more than $\$ 17,000$ during the months he or she becomes 65, can get a Social Security payment beginning with the
month the claim is filed. So, a person earning $\$ 3,000$ a month who will be 65 in June is eligible for a Social Security payment as early as April (the
month the law changed), even though the individual will earn $\$ 36,000$ this year

Don Taylor More Common than Sense: Business Nonsense

C
ommon sense is the ability to look at the situations we find ourselves in and still do what ought to be done. be.

Business nonsense is the absence of common sense. It is either becoming more common or I'm becoming more aware of it. Either way, I believe it's worth drawing your attention to.

Business nonsense can become accepted practice if enough
businesses buy into it. Anatole France said, "If fifty million people say a foolish thing it is still a foolish thing." However, all too often common beliefs and common practice are substituted for what ought to be done.
xamples
A few months ago, I wrote about a problem we were having expedient manner. The company shipped the wrong computer and the exchange process wasn't easy.

The first problem involving the lack of common sense occurred when the company was shocked that we had broken the security seal on a computer box that wasn't ours. Common sense would tel you--unless you are telepathic--that you must open the box to see what's in it is what you ordera. firm, you assume it is yours.

The second instance that demonstrated complete lack of for 18 cents for a poster that was missing when we retumed the misshipped computer. That's right, they spent 33 cents on postage to send out an 18 -cent invoice. Factor in the time, materials, and opportunity cost of creating and sending the " 18 cent invoice" and you've just validated a complete lack of common sense.

Here's another example. An extra value breakfast meal at my favorite fast-food stop includes a small coffee. But, if you win a free value meal in an annual promotion game and want to move the drink up to a large soft drink, you must pay full price for the so drink. Where did the 59 -cent coffee value go? It's nonsense.

Anower bit orbusiness idiocy is the procedure at some wholesale clubs. First, you stand in long lines for a long time to check ou hen, 10 feet from where you just checked out, another employe Some Oulck Fire
Look for "we've always done it this way" problems. If yo don't have a good reason for any business activity other than it is the standard routine, don't continue to do it. All "standard practices should be evaluated frequently and changed when a better way is ound. Look hard for better ways.
Ask the question, "Does this really make sense?" employees are involved, ask them. If venders or suppliers are olved, ask them. If customers are involved, ask them
Done and the foolish is "when." What the fools are still between he wise and the foolish is "when." What the fools are still doing at see their folly they stop and don't repeat the foolishness.
There may be more than one "common sense" option. Seldom is there only one way to fix what isn't working. More often than not, you will find several solutions. Don't develop tunnel vision, and assume that there is only one way to succeed.
Emerson wrote, "Nothing astonishes men so much as common sense and plain dealing." That might be a pretty good recipe for climinating business nonsense as well.

Everyone's favorite amateir sleuth is back on the trail of a killer in Murder, She Wrote: A Story to Die For, a CBS movic premiering Thursday, May 18. on CBS.
Angela Lansbury reprises her role as Jessica Fletcher from the long-running CBS series, although this time she has an A-list co-star in Richard Crenna. It s-also a family affair with her son. Anthony Shaw, directing,
"This movie has been one of the swiftest jobseever done for television, I think," a somewhat breathless Lansbury says during a recent break in filming. "We made it in a terrific hurry becuuse CBS is so anxious to have it for the 18th of May. Usually it takes. much, much longer than this to put a show like this together, but I don't think it will suffer for being rushed."
The movie finds Jessica scheduled to lecture at a writers conference, where she runs into Warren Pierce (Crenna), an old friend and fellow author still grieving after the death of his journalist son.
Their reunion is disrupted, however. by the startling murder of Yuri Malenkovich (Duncan Regehr), a Russian dissident scheduled to talk about his recent book exposing the inner workings of the KGB. Warren turns to Jessica for help after his young protegee (Kathryn Morris) is arrested and charged with the murder. Jessica agrees to assist in the investigation but agresions Warren that the will ferret out the truth, whatever it may be.
"I think the story line in this one is a bit more thought-provoking and more of substance here than a simple murder story, which enhances it in my mind." Lansbury says of Jessica's latest adventure. "I think it presents Jessica in a far more human and real way, which we didn't often have a chance to do in an hour. Here we have an opportunity


That's a tantalizing prospect for the millions of fans who turned Murder. She Wrote into one of the most phenomenal TV hits of the late 1980s and early 1990s. Lansbury's Jessica Fletcher was one of the tube's few leading characters of "a certain age" on regular display, and the character's warm appeal crossed generations
Reruns of the series are seen twice a day on A\&E Network, and fans still approach the actress as if she were Jessica ḥerself, Lansbury says.
"Unquestionably, people come up to me feeling as if they know me, that I'm a friend," she says and laughs. "They've had me in their living rooms for years. They know her parameters, so to speak, and they trust her. They assume that Angela Lansbury is that person, while in fact, Angela Lansbury has had to tailor herself to a certain degree (to live up to that image).
"I don't mean to suggest that I'm a hypocrite. I'm not, because I love all the good qualities of Jessica and I hope to God I have a few of them myself. But I don't presume to be Jessica Fletcher in any way, shape or form other than visually, obviously."

While more than two years have passed since Lansbury's last Murder outing, she says it's very easy to slip back into this character.
