CANYON - A retrospective of Southwestern artist
H.D. Bugbee's work will on display through Feb. 18, 2001, at the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum. As part
of the celebration of the $100^{\text {th }}$ anniversary of Bugbee's birth, the museum has brought together 100 of Bugbee's finest works in oil, watercolor, pen-and-ink, and sculpture and then-contemporary Southern Plains life, including cowboys, American Indians, and flora and fauna of the region.
At the suggestion of his cousin, cattleman T.S. Bugbee, Harold Dow Bugbee came to the Texas Panhandle from Lexington, Mass., in
1914 with his parents. He studied at Texas A \& M College in 1917 and the Cumming School of Art in Des Moines, by 1920. Frank Collinson and Charlie Goodnight, Bugbee rendered the landscape and wildlife of
as nostalgic paintings of Indians and cowboys. Until the
late 1930s, the artist traveled each fall to Taos to paint with his fellow artists "Buck" Dunton, Frank Hoffman, Leon Gaspard, and Ralph Meyers, often packing int the moun-
tains to paint with either Meyers or Dunton. in Dent the mid-1920s, Ghicago, Kansas in Denver, Chicago, Kansas City and New York handled
Bugbee's work. With the Depression and decreasing picture sales, Bugbee turned to magazine illustration, a practice he maintained for some eighteen years. He did pen-
and-ink illustrations for a variety of magazines, including "Ranch Romances," "Western Stories," "Country Gentleman,"
and "Field and Stream". and Filly Bugbee also illustrated a number of significant books on Western history in-
cluding J. Evetts Haley's cluding J. Evetts Haley's
"Charles Goodnight: Cowman and Plainsman", Willie N . Lewis's "Between Sun and Sod," and S. Omar Barker's "Songs of the Saddleman."

## Be on guard against critter-borne diseases while afield

0utdoor parsuits such as hunting, fishing, camping, and hiking can
be invigorating and healthfulu. Yet, those who enjoy the outdoors canbe at great risk of exposure to potentially deadly diseases With the major hunting seasons rapidly approaching, and fall hiking and camping outings on the agenda for many Texans, it's wise for outdoor enthusiasts to remember that there are abundant disease-carrying critters
out there in the field. Prechutionary measures are wise out there in the field. Precautionary measures are wise. Ticks, fleas, and mosquitos can be far more than just a nuisance. Hunters,
campers, and hikers are at risk of exposure to diseases carried by these critters.
A few aches and pains just seem to go with the territory for those who A few aches and pains just seem to go with the territory for those who
vigorously participate in outdoor sports. Flu-like symptoms such as body
aches, headache chills and fever can be early indicators that aches, headache, chills and fever can be early indicators that quickly give
way to severe symptoms of some of the diseases carried by assorted ticks, way to severe symms.
fleas, and mosquitos.
Deer, quail, and squirrel hunters, and those who camp in heavily-vegetated areas have to beware of Lyme disease, the most frequently diagnosed tickborne problem in the U.S. Lyme disease may be indicated by early
symptoms of skin lesions or rashes. Left untreated it can cause severe symptoms of skin lesions or rashes. Left untreated, it can cause severe Infected ticks can also spread Rocky joints. ehrichiosis, the can and heases-like rash, promptly. In you've recently been bitten by a tick and begin noticing flu-like
symptoms, or a red bulls-eye rash around the bite, get medical help symptoms, or a red bulls-eye rash around the bite, get medical help
immediately. Lyme disease isn't a malady to take lightly, and yes, it does occur in Texas. If Lyme diseases isn't diagnozed early, victims can face lifethreatening illness, heart problem, possibly even paralysis.
Check yourself over for ticks when you've been out in the deer woods, or camping in tick country. Should you find that a tick has attached itself, remove it carefully, gripping it with a tweezers or other instrument as close
to the head as possible, and pull it straight out. Dont squeeze the tick while pulling it This could forcetoxinsintoyourbloodstream
Lots of young hunters get their start pursuing rabbits. Handling carcasses of wild rabbits can mean exposure to the bacteria that causes tularemia, another tick-borne disease

humans by fleas, or by direct contact with infected animals such as prairie humans by fieas, or by direct contact with infected animals such as prairie dogs, squirrels, cats, rats, and mice. Unfortunate people stricken with
plague can suffer painful, swollen lymph nodes, and unless adequate
medical treatment is swiftly sought, death can result medical treatment is swiftly sought, death can result.

An infection of the central nervous system known as encephalitis may be
caused by several mosquito-borne viruses. The local Iegion caused by several mosquito-borne viruses. The local region has battled
potential encephalitis problems periodically through the years. Victims potential encephalitis problems periodically through the years. Victims
who contract more severe forms of the disease may be stricken with severe headache, high fever, nausea, muscle tendemess, partial or nearlycomplete unconsciousness, and even coma.
Hunters, hikers and campers are advised to protect themselves from insect
bites as a defense against these bites as a defense against these diseases. Insect repelients containing DEET or permethrin that are used according
to packege directions are especially effective. Some individuals are sensitive to DEET, so proceed cautiously in using these products.
Stay on trails, and avoid areas of overgrown brush and till Stay on trails, and avoid areas of overgrown brush and tall grasses. Wear protective clothing including a hat, long-sleeved shirs, and long
pants that are tucked into your boots or socks. Wearing light-colored clothing will help you to spot ticks more easily.
If you are in an area with ticks--and even the Panhandle has more of them
than it once did-check your body than it once did--check your body carefully for them every few hours.
Because they're small, ticks can be easy to miss. Because they're small, ticks can be easy to miss. Look carefully. Ticks are
opportunists, and will attach to any body part from head to toe.

Outioor hobbies succh as hunting, camping and hiking can also increase the likelihood of exposure to hantavirus, an infection spread to people by infected rodents such as mice and rats. Early symptoms of hantavirus are also flu-like.
Hantavirus can quickly lead to extreme difficulty in breathing, possibly even Hantavirus can quickiy lead to extreme dimiculty in breathing, possibly even
followed by death. Antibiotics will not cure a hantavius infection. Prevention is the beat treatment.
A rodent may have hantavirus in its droppings, urine, and saliva, and a human can become infected just by breathing dust that contains the virus. When cleaning cabins, sheds, or bams, it's a good idea to wear a dust mask. Chances Discriminating deer and feral hog hunters shouldnt' tackle the job of field dressing their game without donning latex gloves. Deer can carry the bacterium that causes anthrax in humans. Feral hogs are a carrier of brucellosis. The gloves are not only a protection against disease, but keep you
a lotneater in performing this work and simplify your clean-up. a lot neater in performing this work and simplify your clean-up.
In many parts of Texas, rabies is another deadly disease share and animals. This viral infection of the nervous system can impact talmost any warm-blooded animal.
Rabies is present in many wild animal populations in Texas, and is especially prevalent among skunks, bats, raccoons, coyotes, and foxes. Humans usually are infected by a bite by a rabid animal. Avoiding touching Outdoor enthusiasts who might potentially contract diseases caused by contact with the above-mentioned insect and animal sources might want to consider carrying a Medical Alert card. The card can be used to advise doctors that it might be wise to check them for maladies related to insect or animal-
borne diseases. Such a card can be carried in a fan-folded card/photo holder in borne diseases. Such

Taking a few precautions to protect against contact with critter-bome diseases can make for a much more enjoyable and worry-free fall of outdoor activities as hunting seasons get underway and more Texans are in the fields

Switchgrass replaces coal for electricity
MILLERTON, Iowa (AP) - Growing switchgrass, a native prairie grass, for its environmental benefits also could produce
profits for farmers if it is burned instead of coal to produce electricity.
If test burns at Alliant Energy's generating plant in Ottumwa succeed, the future for switchgrass could be bright. Replacing 5 percent of the Wyoming coal now burned at the plant would require 200,000 tons of switchgrass a year.
Other issues being investigated include the economics and agronomics of growing switchgrass as well as the environmen-
tal benefits, said John Sellers Jr., who coordinates the Chariton Valley Biomass Project.

How do you even start to describe a show like NBC's new Titans?
The network itself, making a virtue of necessity, is using the phrase "guilty pleasure" to describe the new Aaron Spelling series, which premieres Wednesday, Oct. 4.
That's a neat enough tag, but it really doesn't even begin to convey the highcalorie excesses of a show aimed at viewers who believe that too much of a good thing is wonderful.
Like Spelling's earlier hit Dynasty. Ti tans is set among the rich, beautiful and messed up. As the story opens, dashing fighter pilot Chandler Williams (Casper Van Dien) returns home to Beverly Van Dien) returns home to Beverly
Hills and finds his wealthy adoptive father, Richard (Perry King), about to marry a much younger woman, to the disgust of ex-wife Gwen (Victoria Principal), a trendy club owner whose mansion is directly across the street from Richard's.
Chandler is shocked to discover that Dad's bride-to-be is none other than Heather (Yasmine Bleeth), a scheming young beauty who was dancing the horizontal hula with Chandler in Hawaii just a few months earlier. Also eyeing the impending nuptials suspiciously are Chandler's conniving brother, Mason (John Barrowman), who would love to take over the family business, and sisters Jenny and Laurie (Elizabeth Bogush, Josie Davis), one a recovering alcoholic, the other a take-charge control freak.
Complications ensue, especially in the final scene when Heather makes a devastating revelation to Chandler just as he walks her down the aisle. (Let's just say that when it comes to "carrying something new," Heather doesn't mess around.)
The above synopsis can't even hint at the jaw-dropping andaciousness of Ti Ians, a show so wildly over the top that
it makes those old Ross Hunter-produced Lana Turner melodramas look positively austere by comparison.
The cast manages the frequently ludicrous dialogue with varying degrees of finesse, and two players actually triumph: Both Bleeth and Barrowman clearly understand and embrace the cheese surrounding them, and they play their scenes with a smart comic gusto. Bleeth seems to have studied Carol Burnett's hilarious Sunset Boulevar̀d parodies for inspiration, while Barrowman makes Mason - a charming, frequently tipsy fop on the surface - the most dangerous character on the show. Having spent years as a victim on Dallas, Principal makes a strong-willed Gwen, but alas, the humor seems to escape her. Bogush and Davis show promise in parts that are, respectively trite and underwritten in the premiere, and King's character reportedly is being written out after a few episodes.
That leaves Van Dien, a handsome slab of mahogany who simply doesn' have the acting chops to make his wooden character interesting. His Chandler seems to exist only as an object of male beauty, and he's even filmed in the kind of carefully placed lighting that screen divas such as Diet rich and Garbo used to receive.
Will viewers take a shine to Titans? Maybe, although the home of Law \& Order and The West Wing seems an odd address for this style-over-sub
But while many viewers will gree this show with understandable shock if not outright horror, others will find that it goes so far into terrible that it comes out irresistible. Titans is a perfectly aw ful show in the very best sense of that phrase.
