The Panhandle was designated a Trauma Service Center A.
Hereford Regional Medical Center is a member of the Panhandle Re gional Advisory Council, the state designated coordinating body for the regional system. Terry Hazlett,
trauma coordinator and trauma coordinator and Hereford
Emergency Medical Service director serves on the PRAC executive com mittee, as well as the hospital care committee and quality improvement medical oversight committee. Hazlet
also is active in the Panhandle Emergency Medical Services System, the prehospital arm of the PRAC. Bureau of $\mathbf{E}$ Department of Health's Bureau of Emergency Management,
which conducted $a$ study of the trauma service areas, concluded the Panhandle system is "a strong, func Panhandie system is "a st

care are established. Such systems are set up to identify rapidly accident victims with severe injuries

implemented in 1992, with the Pan implemented in 1992, with the Pan-
handle RAC being established in 1993. The RAC member includes all hospitals, emergency medical ser vices and emergency physicians in
the area. the area.
The Panhandle Regional Trauma System Plan was approved by the TDH in 1998 and revised last year. The system is intended to develo and implement standardized proce-
dures to ensure that victims of trauma are properly identified and transported to the appropriate facil ity. Under state guidelines, ther
are four levels of trauma centers are four levels of trauma centers:
. Level I: A teaching hospital with all speciality surgeons on duty 24 hours a day, research capability physicians/staff specially trained in
treatment of trauma victims, and all treatment of trauma victims, and al
specialized equipment available; specialized equipment available; lected specialty surgeons on duty 24 hours a day, with physicians/staff specially trained in the treatment of
trauma victims, and all specialized equipment available; - Level III: A hospital with emer gency physicians on duty 24 hours
day and speciality surgeons available within 30 minutes, physicians/staff specially trained in treatment rauma victims, and all specialized equipment available; and

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Clinton said Saturday he will attend a Middle East summit Monday in Egypt with Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Barak and Paiestinian leader lasser Arafat.
"I will do everything I can to minimize the violence and to do all meeting" Clinton said in a brif statement at the White House before leaving on a political trip to the West. Clinton has labored over the past
eight days to end the crisis in the Middle East, where a lasting peace has been a top priority for his ad-
ministration.
His first call for a summit was

My "other" grandmother may have had
those same qualities, but I didn't know. She was a stranger whom 1 saw infrequently, usually on a Saturday afternoon when my weekends, would drive to Lockesburg to visit weekends, would drive to Lockesburg to visit

information to remember what Ive committed to. Male it a habit to record date, time, namie(3), phone numbers, company name, any required action and reminder notes.
Tip Seventeen - Be a creffil listener. This begins with focusing your attention on the caller (Ip Ten) but goes beyond that. Listen to the tone o understand "whates assk't being said." Tip Eiohteen - Aveld telephone
Tpople to call you back if you're going to be on or away from the phone. If you must leavea message, give the person you wish to return your call the best times to reach you.

One final thought regarding cellular phones, tum them off in meetings. If you're expecting an important call that may interrupt the
meeting, stay out of the meeting.
