HEDC to eye financial packages

Hereford Economic Development Corp. directors are expected to discuss a pair of projects that could broaden the Deaf Smith County tax base — if all the pieces come together.

At the meeting, which will begin at 4:30 p.m. Wednesday in the commission chamber at City Hall, the directors will discuss terms of a financial package for Swiss Girl Dairies and possible HEDC incentives for construction of Villas of the Southwest, an assisted living center that would be developed by Oller Engineering Inc.

After a 45-minute, closed-door session July 28, the HEDC directors authorized executive director Don Cumpton to begin contract negotiations with John Hafliger, a former Hereford resident who now lives in Canyon, about a package that would include a guaranteed loan to construct a dairy, operating under the name

Swiss Girl Dairies, in Deaf Smith County. Hafliger has been involved in the dairy industry for several years, operating dairies in Artesia, N.M., and a small one near Canyon. He also owns a small facility in the area that is leased to an operator.

Initial proposals called for the HEDC to guarantee a possible \$3 million loan for a 2,500-head dairy cow facility.

Cumpton said the dairy would add about \$3 million to the county's tax base, bring in 18-25 jobs and possibly open the door for more dairies and support industries to move to the Hereford area.

It was hoped the funding for the venture would be provided by local banks and would not necessarily be capped at \$3 million. Money would be used to purchase up to 640 acres for the dairy, construction of the complex to handle a herd of approximately 2,500 head of cattle, and to cover costs of applying for, processing and acquiring all the necessary state and

federal permits, which would allow the dairy to begin operations.

The cost of the dairy herd, feed or any moveable inventory or equipment is not covered under this agreement.

Hafliger will be responsible for submitting plans and specifications to the HEDC and all governing authorities. The agreement calls for all contract, sub-contract, vendors and materials to come from Deaf Smith County businesses.

The directors also will discuss financial incentives for construction of the assisted living center.

The developer reportedly looked at the former Golden Plains Nursing Center, but decided it would be more economical to build his own complex and is considering other sites in Hereford for purchase.

If the assisted living complex is built, Cumpton said it could mean 10-12 new jobs, plus \$1.5 million for the county tax base.

Consumers keep their wallets open, increase spending

WASHINGTON (AP) — In more signs that the economy has yet to slow, consumer spending posted a strong rebound in June after two months of lackluster growth, while manufacturing activity remained steady in July.

The Commerce Department said spending rose by 0.5 percent in June, a slightly better-than-expected gain following smaller increases of just 0.2 percent in April and 0.3 percent in May.

The National Association of Purchasing Managers said that its production index remained at 51.8 percent in July, ending a four-month decline in a gauge of future factory activity. A reading above 50 percent is viewed as indicating manufacturing will continue to grow.

The rebound in consumer spending outstripped American workers' gain in incomes, which were up 0.4 percent in June. That was in line with analysts' expectations and was a slight improvement from a 0.3 percent income advance in May.

The Commerce Department said that construction spending fell 1.7 percent in June to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$800 billion. It marked the third consecutive monthly decline after decreases of 0.2 percent in May and 1.7 percent in April.

It was the longest stretch of weakness since a similar three-month drop from April to June last year and reflected weakness reflected declines in all areas of building.

Residential construction was down 1.4 percent; construction of non-residential buildings was off 1.1 percent, despite a slight rise in office construction, and government construction fell a sharp 4.4 percent, led by a big 9.7 percent fall in school construction.

The June rebound in consumer spending was a further sign that the economic slowdown many economists have been expecting has yet to materialize.

Last Friday, the government reported that the overall economy, as measured by the gross domestic product, was growing at an annual rate of 6.2 percent in the second quarter, even better than the 4.8 percent growth posted in the first three months of this year.

That report has raised new concerns that the Federal Reserve will likely feel the need to boost interest rates further when Fed policymakers next meet on Aug. 22.

The central bank has already increased short-term borrowing costs six times over the past 13 months in an effort to slow economic growth and keep inflation in check.

GOP mixes politics, patriotism

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Mixing politics and patriotism, Republicans turned to a trio of wartime heroes to offer convention testimonials for Texas Gov. George W. Bush — untested on the world stage — and energize voters with a call to keep America the strongest country in the world.

Former Bush challenger John McCain, one-time GOP presidential nominee Bob Dole and retired Gen. Norman Schwarzkopf, commander of the war against Iraq, stepped forward for the second night of the Republican's convention gala. McCain came with a message of unity and reconciliation, saying in a prepared speech "it is my time to serve" his former rival.

Delegates wildly cheered another veteran, retired Gen. Colin Powell, as he praised Bush on Monday night for bridging racial divides and improving schools in Texas. But Powell also took Republicans to task for missing no opportunity to "roundly and loudly condemn affirmative action."

Powell said the GOP must reach out to minorities — "and not just during an election-year campaign. My friends, if we're serious about this, it must be a sustained effort."

Bush, slowly making his way to Philadelphia on a bus trip through five states, tantalized the convention with a brief speech, beamed to the convention hall by satellite from Westerville, Ohio. Ahead in the polls, Bush said he was "traveling through states that Democrats won in the last few elections. But not this time. Not this year." He will lay claim to the nomination Thursday night.

The governor also hinted that Powell, the only black to serve as chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, would get a job in his administration. Powell is a leading candidate to be Bush's secretary of state. "I hope his greatest service to America might still lie ahead," the governor said.

Powell, appearing on CNN's "Larry King Live," said he was "not trolling for a job." But he also said that "of course I would consider a cabinet position or any position in the government that a president was to offer me." He said he had not discussed the matter with Bush or his staff.

On ABC's "Good Morning America" show Tuesday, Powell said that same consideration would be given to any job offer from Democrat Al Gore should he win the presidency.

"If he were the president, I would have to take it under serious consideration," Powell said, referring to Gore. "I've had conversations with President Clinton like this. I elected not to accept some of the offers that were out there but you always have to listen when a president comes to you ..."

Democrats tried to deflate the impact of Powell's address and steal attention from the convention. Civil rights leader Jesse Jackson said there was a

TEXANS IN PHILLY

Teen-ager foregoes fun in sun at Cancun to get taste of big-time politics as alternate delegate at GOP's Philadelphia confab

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Kaycee Kendall's friends were heading to Cancun, Mexico, for their high school senior trip this summer. She had her mind set on Philadelphia.

Making it to the Republican National Convention was her goal, and now the 18-year-old is getting a taste of big-time politics as an alternate delegate from Refugio.

Kendall, who plans to attend the University of Texas at Austin as a freshman in the fall, is the youngest member of the Texas delegation.

"I've been a Republican for as long as I can remember — cut my teeth on politics," she said Monday. "I was born in '81. ... I've been a Republican ever since."

She got involved in county-level politics as a teen-ager, serving as secretary of her county convention.

She also helped with the campaigns of Gov. George W. Bush and U.S. Rep. Ron Paul. This year she decided to learn how to become a national delegate.

When she arrives at her university she intends to join the College Republicans and the Young Conservatives of Texas. Her areas of academic interest include government and economics.

Kendall expects the highlight of the week to be listening to the acceptance speeches of Bush and his running mate, Dick Cheney.

"It's wonderful to actually be able to see the people who make a difference," she said.

Hispanics play major roles

Two Hispanic Republicans from Texas are playing major roles at the convention.

U.S. Rep. Henry Bonilla of San Antonio is the convention's deputy permanent co-chairman. Texas Railroad Commissioner Tony Garza was introduced as an assistant secretary.

Reporters not welcome at reception

At a morning breakfast Monday, a state party spokesman urged Texas delegates to be nice to the Republican Party's "friends in the media." At an evening reception sponsored by a Texas energy company, members of the media were not welcome.

Enron Corp. sponsored a reception at the top of an Atlantic Bell building a few blocks from the Texas delegates' official hotel. Reporters, who'd been told earlier in the day they could attend, were stopped at the elevators.

"You all been everywhere. We don't mind that you weren't there," said Irene Wright of Fort Worth.

E.B. Black House is site of Kaufmann bridal shower

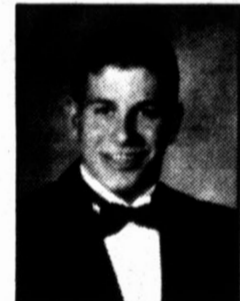

The three day mock legislative session allowed the 4-H members to participate in committee meetings and debate on the floor of the Texas Senate and House of Representatives chambers, along with having interaction with a 4-H press corps member or lobbyist.

Craig Campbell, of Deaf Smith County 4-H, the Showmanship 4-H Club and the Texas 4-H

Council, was one of the members that participated in this premiere leadership experience.

As part of their duties, the 4-H participants were reminded that decisions and actions were a reflection of the people they were serving back in their counties, providing a challenge for many when casting a vote on the fate of a bill.

TxDOT sponsors the Truck Rodeo annually to recognize the skills of TxDOT truck drivers and to showcase the pride they have in the safe operation and maintenance of TxDOT equipment.

are tested on how well they can spot safety defects on equipment. Then, they drive through an obstacle course designed to simulate truck maneuvers encountered during a normal workday.

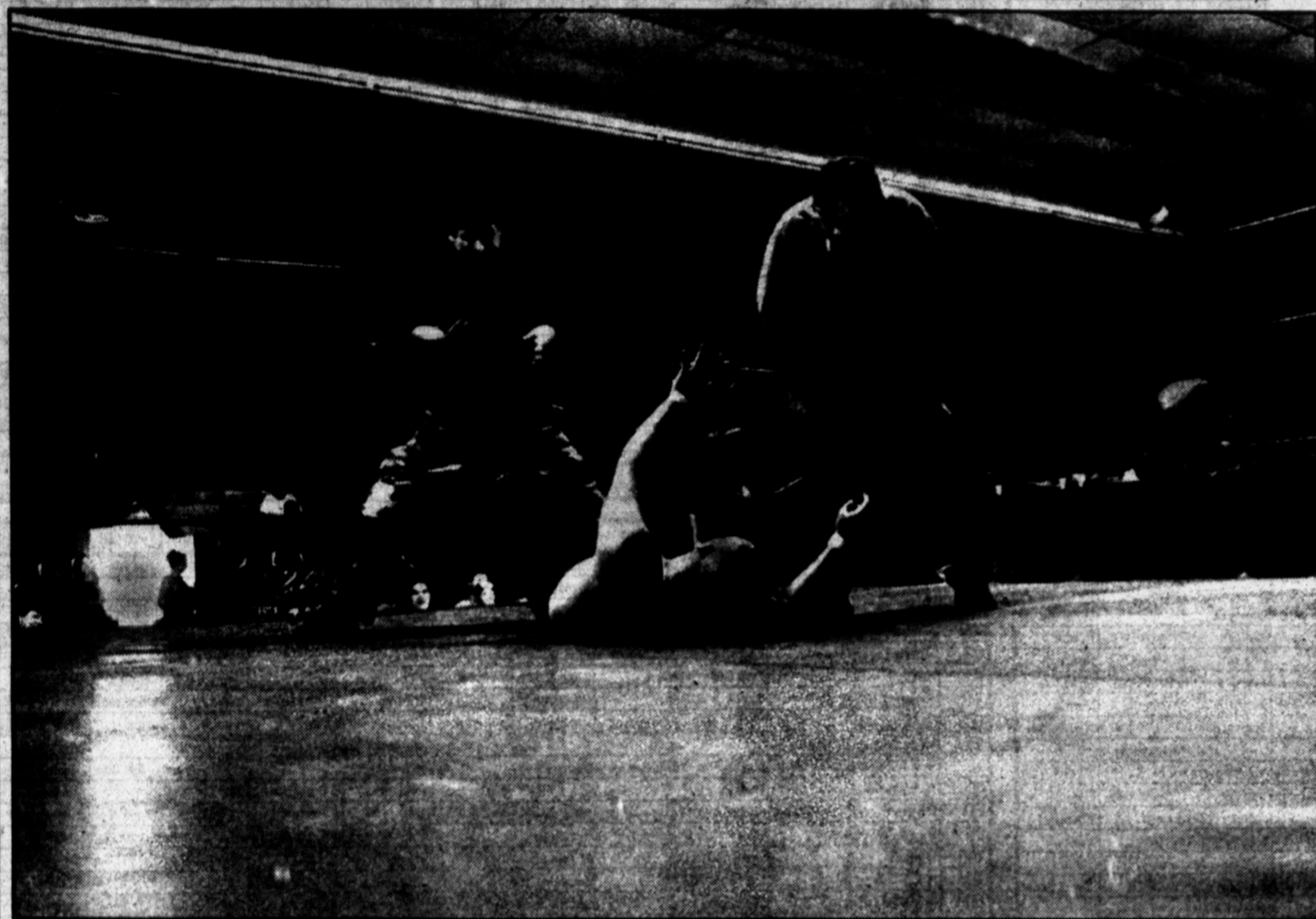

Hereford's L.J. Vallejo competes tonight in the Southwestern Bell Texas High School Association football All-Star game in Houston at Rice Stadium.

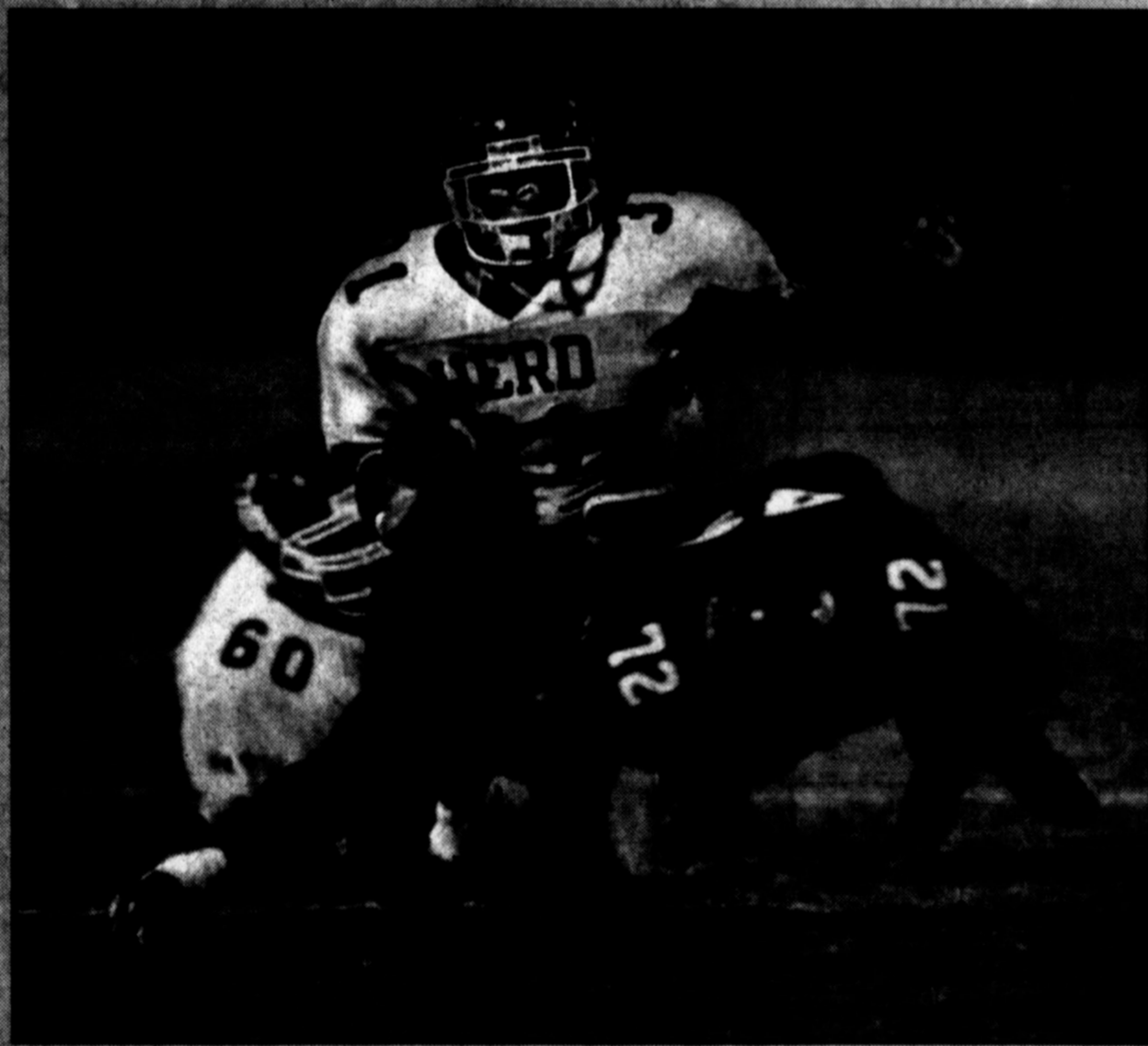
Vallejo was selected for the game which features 70 football players from around Texas. Vallejo will be on the North squad bench for the game.

Trade Tirade

Teams decide whether to go for it or wait until next year as trading deadline goes by

(AP) B.J. Surhoff, Will Clark and Al Martin, welcome to the pennant race.

All three joined first-place teams Monday, part of 11 deals that came before the afternoon trading deadline.

Rondell White, Tom Goodwin, Steve Trachsel, Todd Hollandsworth and Henry Rodriguez also moved. In all, more than 100 players changed places in the last month — Detroit was the only club that did not make a trade.

"It was a very volatile market," New York Yankees general manager Brian Cashman said.

From now on, all trades require putting players through waivers, often a tricky proposition.

Atlanta boosted its outfield by getting Surhoff from Baltimore and St. Louis got Will Clark from the Orioles to fill in for injured Mark McGwire.

But several players mentioned prominently in trade talks — Juan Gonzalez, John Wetteland, Jeremy Burnitz and Rico Brogna — stayed put.

Brogna had heard, and hoped, he was heading to the Boston Red Sox. When the Philadelphia first baseman found out he wasn't moving, he nearly left the Phillies before their game at San Diego.

"I thought very seriously about calling the bellman and telling him to come get my luggage and then flying home," Brogna said.

The AL East-leading New York Yankees, linked to most every available star, did nothing Monday.

Then again, the two-time World Series champions had already traded for David Justice, Denny Neagle, Glenallen Hill and Jose Vizcaino in the last month.

"It's not easy trying to line up matches with people, whether it's payroll, talent or a whole lot of other issues," Cashman said. "Some big names got floated out there. I'm comfortable with the team

we have." Gonzalez, who turned down a trade to the Yankees in June, was pursued by Seattle. But the AL West leaders could not close a deal for the Detroit slugger.

"We were optimistic," Mariners general manager Pat Gillick said. "It was a decision that was made by the Tigers. The ball was in their court."
